- 19 Br. 545. Personne. counterfeit. This is the only other variety, to my knowledge of which struck copies exist. Some collectors consider them to be patterns, but as it seems that they first came to light in the early 1890's, they were more likely made to deceive collectors. 20	Br. 563. Mullins Ship Chandlery. copper. fine. It hardly seems likely, as some writers suggest, that this token was struck in 1828, as Mullins was not in that business that early. The 1842 directory has him as a grocer on Commissioner St. near St. Joseph. In 1848, and possibly a little earlier, he is listed as a ship chandler at 66 Commissioners St. (listed 69 Commissioners in 1857) where he is listed till 1857 when he ceased business or died as his name is not found as his name is not found in later directories.	5.00

- 97 coin. L.C. BARBEAU/COURTIER/(BROKER)/MONTREAL/CANADA. on very worn Geo. IV shilling. Barbeau was located from 1856-59 at 154 St. Paul St. where he had a retail dry goods store. He boarded at the Canada Hotel. I do not have listings of him as a broker, nor does he seem to be listed prior to about 1856 and is not listed after 1859. This is one of only two types of Can. merchant cstps. on silver coins. The other is the "O.T. Peterson, Ch Town, P.E.I." of which the only known specimen is stamped on a 1794 2 reale. The Barbeau cstp. is first mentioned in Leroux's 1832 catalogue. The coin on which this one is stamped is very worn 60.00
