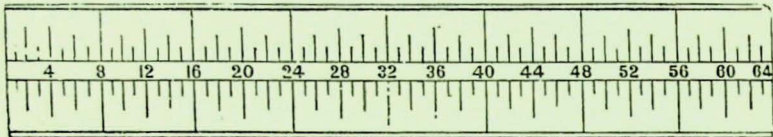

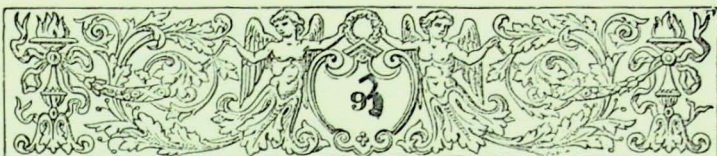

The coins of the Knights of Malta, otherwise known as Hospitallers, or the "Order of St. John of Jerusalem," are sought by Masonic collectors, from the relation of Templar Masonry to this "valiant and magnanimous Order." The gold coins especially of the various Grand Masters are quite rare.
