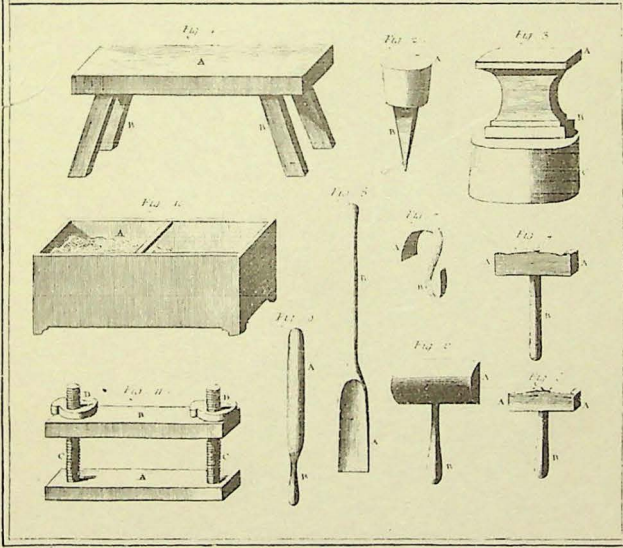
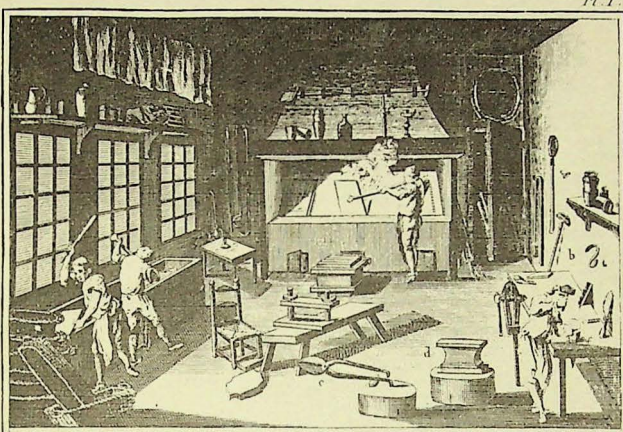

47. French Colonies. "Ordonnance". Douze? Livres, June 11, 1753. Signed by Bigot. Very poor condition, being only a portion of the ordonnance contemporarily backed on paper from a book. Interesting that such a mutilation actually circulated. Rare as card money. \$275.00
These ordonnances were issued by Bigot, c1750-1759 to the extent of 80,000,000 or \$14,000,000, and as a result destroyed public confidence in paper.

I recently acquired an interesting letter from Dr. Courteau who exposes the forger as Louis Laurin from Gatineau Points, Que. He was the issuer of the numismatist card Br. 630, and specialized in collecting Canadian Communion tokens. In addition to the telltale star, the crude workmanship and thickness of the flan is a dead giveaway in identifying the counterfeits.

The size of this medal was unknown to Betts. The medals were issued for the most part in terra cotta in various sizes ranging from 3 1/2 in. to 6 in. In a letter to his daughter, Franklin describes some so small as to be made to be set in rings. The terra cotta medals were, no doubt, at one time fairly common in France but today are almost extinct due to their fragility. Specimens in bronze or copper, as described above, in bronze tinted plaster, and in zinc were also issued. According to Franklin, these terra cotta medals were the first of the kind made in France. Nini was one of the most celebrated and gifted sculptors in terra cotta. He came to France from Armino, Italy in the early part of the reign of Louis XVI and set up his manufactory of terra cotta medallions in the castle of Chaumont, later the property of the Prince de Broglie. This specimen from a Quebec institution collection, the principal of which died almost fifty years ago.

HALL-MARKED CANADIAN LOVE TOKENS

Recently, I acquired a bracelet of love tokens composed of Victorian ten cents, twenty-five cents, and a five cent piece. Of interest is the fact that the obverse of four of the thirteen coins (the three denominations) are hall-marked "J.E.G." within a rectangular cartouche. The mark in all cases occurs on the neck, in the same position. The end of the mark doesn't appear, probably due to the lower relief of the coins field as opposed to the raised portion of the neck, but a closer examination shows "a" after the "G".

Langdon's "Canadian Silversmiths ..." lists a Jean Gagnon as a jeweller in Quebec City, and the date given for him is from 1888. As the necklace was acquired in that city, it seemed probable to me that Gagnon was the engraver of the coins. A check through directories of the time show J.E. Gagnon at various addresses on St. Jean Street until 1917, so there appears to be little doubt that Gagnon was the issuer of the tokens.

The other not hall-marked tokens on the bracelet are very similar in workmanship, and it seems certain that Gagnon made these also; therefore, he only sporadically marked the coins.

Has anyone else come across other hall-marks on love tokens ? If so, I would be pleased to hear from you.
