Therefore, some way of increasing the shipping was required and the concrete ship was devised. The S.S. Concretia was designed by Charles Morssen, President of the Atlas Construction Co. with Prof. E. Brown of Mc Gill University. It was the first concrete ship launched in America. (Nov. 12, 1917). Morssen was President of the Atlas Construction Co. from 1908-1920 and the company is still in existence. Brown was Vice-Dean of applied mechanics \& hydraulics in the faculty of applied science. The medal was likely presented to one or both for its design and construction.

## THE CANADIAN MEDAL FOR THE UNITED STATES CENTENNIAL

Arlie Slabaugh's article in the Canadian Numismatic Journal on the Canadian medal for the U.S. Centennial interested me, particularly as the medal was a familiar one, having owned it several years ago. There were five exhibits by the Dominion of Canada Plumbago Co., Ottawa, and it isn't clear to me whether the medal was issued for the group of displays which were all graphite related, or whether it was awarded for the lump of graphite that Mr. Slabaugh was able to determine was the largest ever mined, measuring four by six feet. Of the four hundred and thirty-one exhibits in the category of mining and metallurgy, twenty-five medals were awarded; twenty-three of these were copper; the remaining two which includes the Plumbago Co. medal were the only silver medals. The company was also entitled to two medals by the United States Centennial Commission, one for "graphite and products manufactured therefrom", and the other for "plumbago crucibles."

In all, there were three hundred and forty-one of the Canadian Commission's medals awarded by the British judges. Twelve were in gold, one hundred and thirty-four in silver, and one hundred and ninety-five in copper. The dies were engraved by P. Tasset, a prominent French medalist and sculptor, and the medals struck at the Paris Mint on the order of J. Perrault, secretary of the Canadian Commission. McLachlan considered them to be "highly creditable as works of
art." The impressive facilities of the Paris Mint enabled them to produce two hundred medals, delivered in Montreal two weeks from the time of being ordered by cable, and at a cost of one franc (nineteen cents) each, these presumably being the copper medals. Subsequent to the Centennial, the medal was stocked and given as an award at Dominion exhibitions, but these medals are virtually always unnamed.

Of the United States Centennial Commission copper medals, there were four hundred and one awarded to Canadian exhibitors who also received the accompanying diploma. There were only two categories of exhibits wherein Canadians went unrewarded by the Centennial Commission; that of "jewelry, watches, silverware, bronzes, etc." and "military and sporting arms, weapons, etc."
