Mr. Donat Lavergne with his father operated an ice business in Pont-Viau, Que. in the early thirties. In 1935 Mr. Lavergne took over the sole ownership of the business. He incorporated it under the name of Lavergne & Fils. He stated that he did that to give the business more prestige.

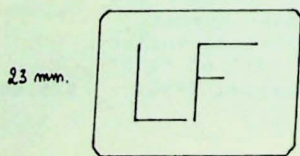
Mr. Lavergne explained that a firm at that time cut the ice on the Rivière des Prairies about 1 mile west of the Cartier Bridge. His father before him as well bought the ice from this firm in 900 lb blocks and would transport the ice to their shed at 132 St. Hubert St., Pont-Viau. The ice would then be sold in 25 lb blocks at 2 blocks for 25 ¢. When Mr. Lavergne bought the business from his father, to save the handling of money he had cut out at a small foundry, situated at 40 St. Hubert St., Pont-Viau, small rectangular tokens or slugs stamped on one side with the letters LF (Lavergne & Fils) and on the other side the figure 1 (indicating one block of ice).

Mr. Lavergne was later able to obtain pre stamped al. slugs about the size of a 25 ¢ piece and discarded the original tokens. The round tokens were only stamped on one side with the letters LF. These were used until he gave up the business around 1945.

On the original site of the ice house a garage is now operating and the home of Mr. Donat Lavergne is still there but has since been remodelled.

Mr. Lavergne is now retired and has moved away from Pont-Viau, Que.

Norman Bethune was one of nine children of the Rev'd John Bethune, a Scots clergyman who came to Canada as a chaplain of the 84th regiment during the American Revolution. On March 12th, 1786 the father held the first ever Presbyterian service in Montreal. The congregation was thereafter organized and held in a large room hired for the purpose. St. Gabriels was then founded with John Bethune its first pastor. He stayed only one year however and left for Williamstown, Glencarry, where he settled and raised the rest of his family, including Norman. (see Communion token, Rowman 134-36) Norman was born on March 3, 1789 and arrived in Montreal around 1817. In association with his younger brother James and Alexander Henry, the pioneer fur-trader, they became King's auctioneer, located at 14 St. Urbain St. Later, with another brother, Donald, a steamboat owner, he joined in forming various transport-



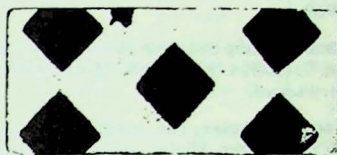
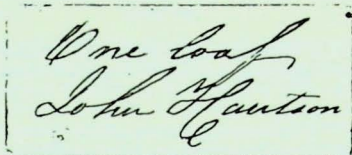
ion companies. This script, previously unknown, was issued for one of these companies. They were given as payment to the companies doing the work of towing the boats. The Durham boat was a river-boat with a false keel and shallow draught and propelled by sails or poles. In shallow water the boats would be towed in by horses. It was estimated that in 1835 there were 800 Durham boats and 1500 batteaux engaged in the navigation of Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence River. Bethune's companies went bankrupt after 1834. The script is all dated from 1833. James, Norman's first brother-partner likewise went bankrupt about a year previous. Three of the other brothers (there were six in all) were prominent. Angus, the eldest, was a fur trader, a partner in the Northwest Co. Alexander was Anglican bishop of Toronto and John Jr. was Dean of Montreal. Dr. Norman Bethune of China fame was the grandson of Rev'd Alexander Bethune. In 1842 Bethune is listed as an auctioneer and commission merchant, in partnership with W.H. Kittson. They were located on St. Joseph St. (now St. Sulpice) near St. Paul. He died on July 27, 1848.

Joshua Winslow was a loyalist who moved to Halifax and became paymaster general of the British forces in North America. The firm of Todd & McGill were partners in the Northwest Co. and had main interests in in the southwest fur trade. William Robertson came to Detroit in 1782 to serve as John Askin's clerk and shortly became one of the leading men in Canada and the fur trade. In 1788 he left for England and was appointed to the Executive Council of Upper Canada but didn't return to fulfil the duty. He married the mother of John Orlvie, one of the Northwest Co. partners, but the marriage wasn't long lasting.

## THE HARRIS SHINPLASTERS

Everything passed for money during the suspension of specie payments in the years succeeding the Mackenzie Rebellion.

In the year that Queen Victoria ascended the throne of England and for a year or two thereafter, Upper Canada suffered great inconvenience from the scarcity of fractional currency caused by the suspension of specie payments in consequence of the Mackenzie Rebellion. The banks having obtained permission to suspend specie payments all persons were obliged to make change as best they could. The result was that merchants and shop-keepers of every grade gave due bills to their customers. The corporation of the city of Toronto at the same time issued one dollar bills payable with interest and guaranteed by the municipality. The due bills of the grocers, butchers, and dry-goods merchants at length increased to such an extent that people became shy of accepting them. As a way out of the difficulty Mr. T.D. Harris proposed to the corporation that it issue fractional currency sufficient for the ordinary wants of trade. Mr. Sherwood who was mayor at the time suggested that Mr. Harris might issue such a currency on his own responsibility and in accordance with his suggestion he did so. At first he had printed on common paper by a Toronto printer bills in the denominations of 7½d., 1s. 3d. and 2s. 6d. These bills wore out so quickly and were torn so easily that he had a plate made by Rawdon, Wright, Hatch & Co. of New York, and bills of the same denominations as those previously issued printed on good bank note paper. A fac-simile of one of these bills is shown in the accompanying print. [not possible to include here]. The bills declared on their face that they were redeemable in sums of one dollar at the 'Sign of the Anvil and Sledge.' They were guaranteed by the firm of which Mr. Harris was a member, the Anvil and Sledge being the well-known sign of that firm of hardware dealers. The business had been started in 1829 on King Street a little east of George street, the name of the firm at that time being John Watkins & Co. Mr. Harris was the company. In 1832 and from that date to 1839 or later the firm was Watkins & Harris. In 1832 the business was carried on in a building on the south side of King street nearly opposite the present Clyde hotel. Before 1838 however, it was removed to a brick building standing where the Clyde hotel now stands No. 158, King street east. While occupying this building Mr. Watkins' interest in the business was bought out by Mr. Harris and the name above the door was simply T.D. Harris. Mr. Watkins was at this time president of the Commercial Bank of Kingston and his home was there. Mr. Harris subsequently moved to the building No. 124 King street east. The firm then became T.D. & W.R. Harris and afterward Harris, Evans & Co., and under the latter name the business was carried on at No. 124 King street east until 1860 when it was discontinued altogether. The brick building No. 158 had in the meantime been burned. When it was re-built it became the Clyde hotel. The original building was put up and owned by Mr. Murchison at one time the fashionable tailor of the town. It was erected about 1832. The Harris shinplasters, for such they were called at the time of their issue, quickly drove all the one dollar bills out of circulation. They were paid out by the firm in the years 1838 and 1839 and the total amount put out was several thousand dollars. Altho' the promise on their face was that they should be redeemed only in sums of one dollar, Mr. Harris never refused to redeem them for any amount, less or greater and with the exception of those lost, destroyed, or never presented for redemption all were paid in government currency. The Harris bills were issued in Halifax currency, eight of the lowest, four of the intermediate and two of the highest denomination being equivalent to a dollar or sixty pence. They bore the signature of Watkins & Harris and also of John J. Evans at that time the cashier of the firm and later the partner of Mr. Harris. These shinplasters went out of circulation after the banks resumed specie payments in 1840. At this time business was transacted in various currencies. York and Halifax currency differed. In the former, seven and a-half pence made a shilling and in the latter twelve pence. The Government paid all its accounts with Mexican silver dollars. Watkins & Harris was the only firm in Toronto to issue shinplasters, but two other business houses beside it circulated copper and brass tokens to take the place of pennies. These were imported from England and the firms to issue them were Watkins & Harris, hardware dealers; Perrin & Co., dry-goods merchants, and Terence J. O'Neil, auctioneer. Perrin & Co. occupied the "chequered store" which stood where the Bank of Quebec now stands. Their token was of copper with a man thrashing grain on one side and the motto, "No labor, no bread," on the other. The tokens of Watkins & Harris were also of copper. On one side was a ship and on the other the legend "To facilitate trade." O'Neil's auction rooms were in the first building east of St. James' cathedral. His tokens bore on one side a head and on the other a ship. They were of brass, thin and common looking, but in those days when even a brass button with the shank broken off passed for money, they circulated freely.

## VERIFICATION OF THE FANTASTIC PHILEMON WRIGHT COUNTERSTAMPS

Everyone loves a mystery story and it is particularly exciting when a numismatic writer pieces together a story from impossibly vague information through a few good guesses and some careful research. Such a feat was accomplished a few years ago by Major Sheldon Carroll, curator of the numismatic collection of the Bank of Canada. In 1965, he acquired for the collection a group of eight oddly counterstamped Spanish, American and Spanish American silver dollar coins. To his obvious delight and probable amazement he was able to ascribe them with virtual certainty, to Philemon Wright, the eminent founder of Hull, Quebec and a major influence in the settling of the Ottawa Valley region. The story of their acquisition and the discovery of the significance of the coins is told by Major Carroll in the July, 1968, *Canadian Numismatic Journal* in an article entitled "The Fantastic Philemon Wright Counterstamps". I would like to describe here a further discovery that changes the virtual certainty to absolute certainty that the counterstamps were associated with Wright.

The pieces in question are as follows: an eight reale piece of Mexico City mint counterstamped P.W./Esq./AE 59; an 1817 American half dollar counterstamped A.W./AE59; five Spanish and one Spanish American 2 reale pieces variously counterstamped P.W.J., C.C.W.; R.W.; T.W.; C.H.W. and A.B.

Major Carroll describes the rather casual acquisition of these pieces and the joking reference to Philemon Wright because of the initials on the largest piece. He further tells of research of the Philemon Wright papers at the Public Archives of Canada which revealed that Philemon and his wife Abigail Wyman Wright had six children surviving infancy. He concludes that the counterstamps related to each thus: P.W. Esq. for Philemon Wright, Esquire; A.W. for Abigail Wyman or Wright; P.W.J. for Philemon Wright, Jr.; C.C.W. for Christopher Columbus Wright; R.W. for Ruggles Wright; T.W. for Tiberius Wright; C.H.W. for Christiana Hanna Wright; and A.B. for Abigail Brigham, the elder daughter's married name. Major Carroll concludes that AE is the abbreviation for *ætatis* meaning aged and, as Philemon and Abigail Wright were both born in 1760, he dates the manufacture of the counterstamps as 1819 when they would be 59. He notes further that mention is found in Abigail Wright's will of "a particular dollar and a pistareen to be left to Philemon Jr. and Tiberius". He concludes, "There can be little doubt that these eight coins were stamped by Philemon Wright for each member of his family to mark some important occasion in their family history".

In August, 1969, I had the opportunity to spend a day viewing the Bank of Canada collection, the tokens and counterstamps being of particular attraction, with the Philemon Wright pieces the highlights of the counterstamps. It was impressive to me that such crudely marked coins held such remarkable historical significance. The next day on a walking tour of Ottawa with my wife Mary Jane, we happened upon the Bytown Museum. It is a small but interesting museum maintained by the Historical Society of Ottawa. One section was devoted to the Hardy collection of Philemon Wright artifacts. In a case containing many small items, was a round metallic tablet inscribed incuse in a circle PHILEMON WRIGHT & SONS AUGUST 21; in the centre AD 1819. What is the significance of this piece?

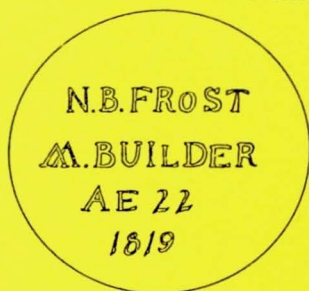
A careful examination of the counterstamped coins shows that they were made from individual letter punches hammered one at a time as opposed to being made with a composite die. This is surmised by the misalignments and variable spacing of the letters. It is the simplest means of counterstamping. The letter punches appear rather crude in design and are mismatched in style, possibly homemade, as the T's, C's and E's are much shorter than the A's, R's and S's. There is, however, an even more unusual feature of the counterstamps. Apparently, the artisan had no W punch. He used instead a V punch twice, thus: W. This is apparent by the small but unmistakable differences in alignment of the V's from one coin to the other. Moreover, the second V is clearly struck over the first as would be expected in fabricating a W from two V's. All three of these features are seen on the tablet. The letters are individually punched, they are of the same variable style as the coins and the W on Wright is the unmistakable double V style. This irrefutably ties the counterstamps to Philemon Wright.

Unfortunately, I was unable to handle the piece during my visit to determine any of the details such as the type of metal or even what was on the reverse. Correspondence with Dr. B.R. MacKay, President and Acting Curator, filled in some of the particulars. The tablet is of lead, slightly over 3/2" in diameter by 1/4" thick, slightly convex on the obverse and weighs 18 oz. On the obverse, overlooked by myself because of the faintness of the impression and dings and gashes partially obscuring it, is a simple square and compass. On the reverse is stamped N.B. Frost/M. Builder/AE 22/1819. The drawing herewith is based upon my remembrances and a sketch Dr. MacKay was kind enough to furnish.

Dr. MacKay speculates it was a paperweight of local manufacture, that the square and compass design is a masonic symbol and M. Builder probably is a contraction for Master Builder. He seems to view it as an item of no great significance. In later correspondence with Sheldon Carroll, he suggests the tablet may have been produced to commemorate the building of Philemon Wright's ship, the Union of the Ottawa, in 1819. He concurs with MacKay that M. Builder stands for Master Builder and may indicate he is the builder of the ship, however, he feels the square and compass is not a masonic symbol but Mr. Frost's tools of trade. The problem with this theory is that the age of 22 is rather young to be a Master Builder. Perhaps he was a self-appointed Master Builder!

Obviously, there is room for further research to put together the details. Unfortunately, I do not have access to a detailed history of Philemon Wright. It would be a pity if the tablet does not some day join the counterstamps in the Bank of Canada collection for together they would make a remarkable display.
