In October, at Port Bowen, a masquerade ball was held for the ships' entertainment. "Before the entertainment, which was to be held on board the *Fury*, the chief topic among the men was as to what part 'the captain' would take ... curiosity had to wait till all arrived at the masquerade hall, on the *Fury's* lower deck. And now the fun commenced in good earnest; the captain himself, for some time at least, attracting the attention of all. His cloak had been thrown aside, and there stood the facsimile of an old marine with a wooden leg, well known to all, who used to sit with a fiddle, begging for halfpence, on the road to Chatham. James Douglas Sr. (1800-86) arrived in Quebec after a hurried exit from the United States in 1826. In 1845 he founded the Beauport Lunatic Asylum near Quebec, becoming its first superintendent the next year.

Mgr. Faraud was born at Gigondas, France in 1823. He was educated at the seminary of Notre-Dame-de-Lumières at Goult, taking his vows in 1844. He spent two years studying for the priesthood at Notre-Dame de l'Osier, Isère, and in 1846 was selected by the bishop of Marseilles, Charles-Joseph-Eugène de Mazenod, for missionary work in America. On November 8 of that year he arrived at St. Boniface, Manitoba, and was ordained priest

the following year. Mgr. Faraud's missionary work took him to many places in the west and north west of Canada. He established the first Catholic mission near Fort Chipewyan in 1849, naming it La Nativité. In 1863 Faraud was consecrated bishop of Anemour and he spent two decades, from 1869-1889, at Lake La Biche, his episcopal see. He died shortly after retiring on March 20, 1890. Mgr. Faraud had some of his works in various Indian languages printed while in Montreal in 1864. DCB, Vol. XI.

"The Grand Trunk Boating Club originated in 1875 through the endeavours of the late Mr. James Anthony who conceived the idea of holding a Regatta. For this purpose he collected various subscriptions among the employees of the Grand Trunk Shops, situated at Point St. Charles. Through the courtesy of the Hon. James McShane who presented a silver cup for competition, the event received further stimulus and so successful did the event prove that no anxiety whatsoever was evinced as to the further success of the new organization, when in the spring of 1877 the Grand Trunk Boating and Swimming Club was inaugurated."

Mgr. Grouard was born in 1840 in Brulon, France and educated there as well as at Laval University after arriving in Canada in 1860. Shortly before receiving his orders in the Oblate order in 1862, Mgr. Grouard was in Montreal at bishop Taché's request and took a tour of the city with his guide, Louis Riel. After this he was off to Fort Chipewyan, Lake Athabasca and spent the rest of his life ministering to the Indians in the west and north west of Canada. The first printing press was introduced into the Peace River District by Mgr. Grouard; he also published many hymn and prayer books and catechisms in the various languages of the Indians. He was made titular bishop of Iborra and for twenty years, 1910-30, was vicar apostolic of Athabasca. He died in the town named for him, Grouard, in Alberta in 1931.

This volume also celebrates the diamond anniversary of Mgr. Grouard's missionary work in Canada which took place at the Saint Bernard Mission (later town of Grouard) near Lesser Slave Lake, July 31 and June 1, 1922.

"The print was made from his stall-plate before Haldimand was installed as a member of the Order of the Bath on 16 May 1788.

Jacques Hervieux was a fur trade outfitter associated with his brother, Louis-François Hervieux, and later with Beaver Club member, Jacques Giason. Nicolas Lefebvre was a fur trader who had engaged voyageurs for Michilimackinac in 1753, 1754, and 1758. Hervieux clearly served as a tax collecting agent - referred to as "contribution(s)" - for the Military Governor, Gage. The document is signed a mere twenty-five days after Vaudreuil surrendered Canada to Amherst, and military rule was established in Canada. Gage had only become Governor ten days before this note was signed.

John Norton's origin is shrouded in mystery. Born in Scotland, he was the son of a Scottish woman and a Cherokee who had, according to tradition, been taken by the English after a raid on his village. Norton arrived in Quebec with the 65th Foot in 1787, but deserted almost immediately. He next appears as a schoolmaster in the Mohawk settlement at the Bay of Quinte, resigning that post in 1791. He tried his hand at the fur trade, taking up employment with John Askin at Detroit till 1794, when he returned to Canada becoming an interpreter with the Indian Department at Niagara. Adopted as a nephew by Joseph Brant, he went into Brant's service as interpreter and emissary, becoming Brant's deputy and successor. During the War of 1812 he was particularly notable in his leadership during the victory at Queenston Heights. He was conferred rank of Captain of the Confederate Indians, as had been Joseph Brant during the Revolutionary War. He left Canada after the misconduct of his wife and the subsequent accidental death of her lover. The date of his death is unknown.

Thomas Roe had a house at the head of Union Ave. and was apparently associated with A. Molson and Co., general merchants. He later (1860's) established under his own name.
