#### NOTE

Customers will note that the format of this catalogue has changed in the case of Breton listed pieces in that descriptions of the coins have been omitted, the assumption being made that collectors have the Breton catalogue. The original, published in 1894, was once a scarce book, but several hundred copies were found in the Magdalen Islands around 1962. They were, apparently, heavily remaindered — the author no doubt having more confidence in the sale of the book than warranted — and the book was being used to insulate a home in the Magdalens, or so the story goes.

Anyone not having this book is urged to acquire one as most listings are by Breton numbers. Sub-listings, such as "C" (Courteau), or "McL" (McLachlan) refer to specialized catalogue listings of die varieties and the appended bibliography will detail these.

Many of the monographs cited in the bibliography are available in reprint form. "Canadian tokens and medals", an anthology edited by Al Hoch is a must for the collector interested in die varieties. The reprint of Leroux by Somer James, now out of print itself, is valuable in that it includes other monographs such as Courteau's "Coins and tokens of Nova Scotia" and McLachlan's "The copper tokens of Upper Canada".

# JEAN-MARIE ARNAULT, FIRST KNOWN CANADIAN MEDALLIST AND HIS DIES FOR THE REBELLION SOU, BRETON 716

These dies, which were acquired a couple of years ago, I believe to be the earliest of only two colonial coin dies in existence. The other pair of dies are those of the bouquet-sou, Br. 689, which are now in the Bank of Canada collection. They had originally come to light in 1863 and were given to the Numismatic & Antiquarian Society of Montreal where, over the years, restrikes were struck off for collectors. Originals of that coin are said to exist in brass with milled edge. I have in my possession the Hart specimen of this so-called original but have doubts that its issue was contemporaneous with the other series (c. 1837). My reason for questioning the originality of the coin is a simple one; the fabric has a modern appearance, similar to Br. 690. The reverse die of Br. 997, Lees 3 or 4/5 were found in Montreal some years before 1889, according to McLachlan. To my knowledge, these dies are no longer extant, probably having been sold as scrap metal to a foundry like that of Chanteloup's.

It is rather fortuitous and due to the record kept by the man from whom I acquired the dies, that a reasonable history can be constructed concerning them and a little more light shed on the coin itself.

The dies had been obtained from "an old man" by the name of Richer, grandson of one of the last employees of the bank which closed its doors in 1895. The directories consulted brought the following results: in 1892 one Vm. Richer is listed on the board of directors of the bank as assistant cashier at the head office. In 1898 he is ssistant manager and under the listing for the bank, the observation is made that it is "in liquidation". There seems to be little doubt that Richer acquired the dies around the time of the closing of the bank and that these mementos remained with the family till the grandson parted with them in 1970. McLachlan, in 1886, and Breton in 1894 had both observed that the dies were in the possession of the bank. It is possible that the Richer family had an involvement with the bank from its inception. The 1844 charter of La Banque du Peuple includes one M. Richer as one of the principals.

It is well known that Jean-Marie Arnault engraved the dies for the coin, the first bank token and the only semi-official coin of Canadian manufacture. McLachlan has documented some of the facts known of Arnault, the most well-known of early Canadian coiners. His excellent article appeared in the Numismatist for March, 1914, and the author attributed several other coins and medals to Arnault. Amongst them are the famous Molson token, Br. 562, and the rare bouquet-sous, Br. 672 and 673 as well as the oft-overstruck bouquet-sou, Br. 674. McLachlan claimed that Arnault came from France to Montreal on the invitation of the Gentlemen of the Seminary (St-Sulpice). Through the study of notarial records, McLachlan was able to trace Arnault back to 1831 and suggested his arrival from France to Canada to be about 1830. A letter in the Quebec Archives shows that Arnault was already well established in June of 1830. Whether or not he was involved in coining activities at that time may never be known, but the letter does relate to his repairing a printing press for E.R. Fabre, the first French Canadian bookseller. He was also selling religious articles in his "boutique". Earlier than that, however, Arnault was active as a gilder, silver plater and mechanic, the latter being the same occupation under which he is included in the Montreal Directory for 1842. This information was derived from the Census of Montreal for 1825 and shows Arnault as being married and between the age of 25 to 40, so his date of birth was between 1785-1800. He is not listed in the 1819 directory nor does any listing appear subsequent to 1842, so Arnault may well have left Montreal around 1843 or 1844, as suggested by McLachlan. His shop on Craig St. near St. François Xavier, likely no. 89 in these days, was probably taken over shortly thereafter by James Morrice, the cabinet maker who later shared premises with Chanteloup, the founder, and then to be taken over by the pawn brokers.

McLachlan was originally of the opinion that it was by Arnault's initiative that the "republican" device, the Phrygian or liberty cap was added within the reverse. McLachlan, as well as other numismatists later, variously theorized that it was a clerk, accountant, or simple employee that authorized the symbol, the clerk being "an active member of the revolutionary committee". It is not likely that this was the case.

The Banque du Peuple, the first French bank in Canada, had met with considerable resistance by their English counterparts. This reaction was perhaps not altogether unjustified, as several of the principals which included the co-founder, L.M. Viger, were openly sympathetic and indeed participants in the rebellion. Other "patriotes" were members of the directorship of the bank and included T.S. Brown, director from 1835-1837; E.R. Fabre, the bookseller and printer; Joseph Roy, the notary, issuer of Br. 671; J.A. Berthelot, later to become the secretary of the bank; Joseph Donegani, and Damase Masson, to name but a few. Lord Durham had accused the bank of financing the purchase of arms for the patriots in 1837 and in November, 1839 the abbé Chartier, the only priest to have openly joined in the rebellion, wrote: "As for money, was not the Banque du Peuple, which had been in existence barely a year, universally understood to have been established for the purpose of the revolution, and in order to help it? As a matter of fact, Viger was Papineau's cousin! Adam Shortt, the economic historian, tersely claimed: "The Banque du Peuple owed its existence to political rather than to commercial enterprise."

There appears to be little doubt that the Bank was supportive of the rebellion, and that it was not by the whim of one minor employee of the bank that the coin was designed to include the symbol of revolution. It seems more reasonable to assume that the directorship of the bank was well aware, and indeed responsible, for the addition of the device and the coin was to be considered symbolic of the bank's sympathy.
