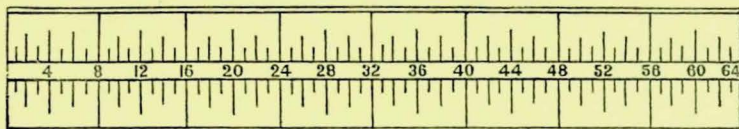

- 99 BAVARIA. Max. Joseph. Crown, 1754. Fine.
- 100 — Ludwig I. Crown, 1828, on the customs union with Prussia, Württemberg and Hesse. Fine.
- 101 BATENBERG. William, Crown, **1559**. Bust in armor l.; rev., imperial arms. Fine; rare.
- 102 BOHEMIA. Rudolph II. Crown, **1598**. Profile bust; rev., imperial eagle. Bold, fine, rare.
- 103 BONN. Bust of Max. Franciscus; rev., inscription commemorative of its change from academy to university in 1786. Sharp, very fine, rare. 28.
- 104 BRUNSWICK. Julius. Crown, **1562**. Bust to left; rev., shield supported by a wildman. Fine; rare.
- 105 — Julius. Crown, **1588**. Wildman holds a stripped sapling in his right, a taper in his left, beneath this a lantern with death's-head and goggles, free horse in left field; rev., crested shield of arms. Breslauer Brillenthaler. Fine; very rare.
- 106 CAMPEN. Crown, **1555**. Profile bust in armor of Emperor Charles V; rev., shields of Campen, Zwolle and Deventer. Fine; rare.
- 107 CANADA. Undraped bust by *Mauger*; LUDOVICUS MAGNUS, etc.; rev., Gallia amidst a trophy, seated on a rock, beaver at her feet, *KEBECA LIBERATA* 1690. Bold, very fine and rare original, especially desirable in silver. 26.
- 108 — Louis XV. 1720. Double Louis d'Argent, issued under John Law's Coinage. Bust; rev., crowned L. *Paris m.* Fine, scarce.
- 109 — Louis XV. Original Silver Jeton. Bust r., REX CHRISTIANSS; rev., beavers at work, COL. FRANC DE L'AM. 1754. Very fine; rare.
- 110 — Silver Jetons, restrikes. Bust; rev., as last, 1754; two hemispheres, 1753; Mercurius in mid air, 1752; flight of eagles, 1758. *Argent* on edge; mint state, rare types of which originals are in three instances unobtainable. 4 pcs

- 111 CANADA. George III. Bust in armor to left; rev., inverted lily-shield supported by a crowned lion and a unicorn; on border are names of battles fought in 1759, beginning with GUADALOUPE MAY 1 and ending with QUEBEC | WOLFE. Sharp, perfect impression, very rare in silver. 28.
- 112 — War Medal. Bust of Victoria; rev., NORTHWEST | 1885 | CANADA in wreath. *Pte J. O'Malley, 10th batt. r. g.* on edge. BAR SASKATCHEWAN and ribbon. Fine, rare. 23.
- 113 — Another. *M. W. O'Brien* on edge. Without bar. Very fine.
- 114 CHINA. Silver coin, similar to cash. Fine. 14.
- 115 DONAUWORTH. Charles V. Crown, **1543**. Crowned profile bust in armor; rev., crowned eagle, W on escutcheon. Very fine, rare.
- 116 EAST FRIESLAND. Ferdinand. Crown, **1564**. Crowned profile, bust in armor; rev., heraldic eagle, with crowned human face. Fine, rare, the only coin of this type I've seen.
- 117 ENGLAND. Ethelred II. Silver Penny. Togated profile; rev., long cross. *London m.* Fine.
- 118 — William I, the Conqueror. Silver Penny. Bust front, holds sceptre; rev., short cross, P A X S in angles. V. fine.
- 119 — Edward II. Silver Pennies, *Durham & Canterbury m.* Fine and very good. 2 pcs
- 120 — Edward IV. Gold Rose-noble. King in ship, armed with sword and shield; rev., radiant sun in tressure of crowned leopards and fleurs-de-lis. Fine; rare.
- 121 — Same. Gold Angel. Shield and cross on galley; rev., St. George slaying the dragon. Sharp, extremely fine; rare.
- 122 — Henry VII. Half gold Angel. Crowned cross on shield in galley; rev., St. George as before. Ruding IV, 8, but *m.-m. a rose*. Fine, very rare.
- 123 — Henry VIII. Half gold Sovereign. King enthroned; rev., crowned arms with supporters. Ruding VI, 2. Very good.
- 124 — Charles I. Crown, **1645**. Crowned King holding sword on horseback, to left; rev., garnished shield, *m.-m., a turret*. Fine for coinage, extremely rare date. Ruding XXV, 3.

- 125 ENGLAND. Victoria. Medallie Crown for review at Spithead, 1889. Proof.
- 126 — Same. 1893. Crown, half Crown, 2 and 1 sh., 6 and 3 d. Superb proofs; rare. 6 pes
- 127 — War Medal. Bust; rev., a victory, ARMY OF THE SUTLEJ | MOODKEE | 1845. Edge inscribed; two bars SOBRAON | FEROSHUHUR. Fine; rare.
- 128 FRANCE. Louis XV. Crown, 1765. *m.-m., a cow.* (Pau). Very good.
- 129 — Third Republic. War Medal, 1883-1885. TONKIN, CHINE, ANAM, SONTAY, BAC-NINH, FOU-TCHEOU, FORMOSE, TUYEN-QUAN, PESCADORES. Fine; ring. 18.
- 130 FRANKFURT. Peace Crown, 1763. Fine.
- 131 JULICH. William. Crown, **1571**. Profile bust; rev., shield with curious crests, the central one a human-faced ox. Fine; rare.
- 132 GENOA. Broad Scudo, **1694**. Virgin holds sceptre and shield; rev., cross in circle, stars in angles. Very fine; rare.
- 133 GERMANY. Religious and Friendship medals, each with symbolic serpent. Mint state. 22 and 24. 2 pes
- 134 HOHENSTEIN. Volkmar Wolfgang. Crown, **1567**. St. Andrew with cross; rev., crested shield. Fine, rare.
- 135 HUNGARY. Ferdinand. Broad crown, **1555**. Crowned profile in armor; rev., imperial eagle, the arms of Hungary on escutcheon of pretence, crowned Virgin and Infant above. Fine, rare.
- 136 — Another broad Crown of this type, but **1556**. Fine, rare.
- 137 — Rudolphus II. Crown, **1559**. Bust in draped armor, the arms of Hungary at sides; rev., imperial eagle. Sharp, extremely fine, rare.
- 138 — Leopold. Broad Crown, **1695**. Majestic profile, the lip strongly developed, arms of Hungary at sides; rev., crowned arms. Sharp, extremely fine.
- 139 — Same.  $\frac{2}{3}$  Thaler, 1700, of this type. Fine.
- 140 MANSFELD. Thaler. **1597**. Duke on horseback, slaying dragon; rev., crested shield, PETER ERN BRUNO GE. HA. GE P. Fine, very rare.

- 141 MECKLENBURG. John Albrecht, **1549**. Thaler. Bust l. in square hat; rev., crested shield. V. good, rare.
- 142 MUNSTER. Peace crown, **1648**. View of city; rev., doves with branches of olive hovering over a crown on woolsack. Extremely fine.
- 143 NURNBERG. Thaler, **1574**. Crowned imperial eagle; rev., two shields, side by side. RESPVB. NVRENBERG MDLXXIIII. Fine, very rare.
- 144 OETTINGEN. Thaler, **1546**. Crested shield, KARL. WOLF. LVDWIG. MARTIN G. I. OT; rev., CAROLVS V and arms of the empire. Fine, rare.
- 145 PRUSSIA. Cross of the Order of the Red Eagle; ribbon. Fine. 24.
- 146 PAPAL STATES. Innocent XI. Scudo, year 7 (1683). Bust by *Hameranus*; rev., NON PRODERVNT, etc. Fine, rare.
- 147 — Same. Scudo by *Hameranus*, year 8. Bust; rev., DEXTRA TVA DOMINE, etc., in palm. Ex. fine, rare.
- 148 — Scudo. As last, with addition of date, **1684**, beneath inscription within wreath on rev. Very fine.
- 149 — Scudo. Same, but the date, **1684**, is *under* the wreath. Has been gilt. Very fine.
- 150 — Clement XI and XII. Small medallie coins, latter with bust. Fine. 2 pcs
- 151 Poland or Lithuania. Small base silver Pennies, with dates 1550-60. Average v. good. 27 pcs
- 152 SAXONY. John Fred. and George. Thaler, **1534**. Bust on each side; fine, scarce.
- 153 — Same. Thaler, **1535**. Fine, scarce.

## COLLECTION OF PAPER MONEY OF CANADA.

The following collection of Canadian Paper Money is the result of many years' ardent collecting. Paper money in Canada began with the French era, the earliest issue being that for the French and Indian War of 1690, in which Massachusetts participated and responded by a similar issue. Both Governments redeemed the issue in full, and hence specimens of either, as well as that of similar subsequent issues, are practically unobtainable, and have never, to our knowledge, been offered at sales. If we exclude Law's South Sea Bubble Money of 1720, which no doubt circulated in Canada also, the earliest French-Canadian issue in this collection is a specimen of 1730. Those issued for the War of 1755-60, in which the American Colonies played so considerable a part, are of a much larger size, and their interest is increased from the fact that they bear the signatures of parties who were prominent in that war, and who were subsequently punished for their lack of success and for having issued an excessive number of these notes, by sentences of from 15 years to a lifetime in the Bastille of France.

Coming to the English domination we have the earliest known paper money issued by English merchants in Canada, of which very few specimens now exist, followed by a very remarkable issue of Rebellion money of 1837. The Rebellion of Canada was a persistent effort made by the French Canadians to ameliorate their political condition, and to renew political ties with their mother-country France.

Papineau, Nelson, Brown, MacKenzie and others headed the revolt ; specie payments were suspended, and hence the merchants and banks resorted to paper, which to their credit be it said, was redeemed in most instances in full and its rarity is well known. Quite a large number of the notes issued and signed by the leader of the Rebellion, Walford Nelson, are among the collection. It will also be noticed that there is quite a number of Bank and City issues. In most cases these are believed to be redeemable ; even in case of defunct Banks, many redeemed their notes, if not in full, in a certain percentage. The Canada

Bank-notes of 1790 are the only evidences now remaining of this, the oldest Bank in Canada. The earliest issues of the Bank of Montreal (still in existence, and now one of the most important Banks of the world) are in the collection in beautiful condition. In fact as a whole, it would be impossible at the present day to get together so many interesting and valuable specimens of the former paper issues of Canada.
