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CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS

The conditions of business, along with all other terms, conditions and notices set out in this auction catalogue, or announced by the auctioneer, form the terms on which Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. (JHA) contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship of purchase and sale of property by auction. It is therefore very important that you read these conditions carefully. By bidding or selling in this sale you agree to accept these conditions, and that these conditions shall govern all future dealings that may occur between you and JHA.

You should note that JHA generally acts as an agent for the seller. Any con-cluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer. You acknowledge that JHA is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to the items offered for sale. JHA can not and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers therefore have the responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as the nature of the items, which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw your attention to Conditions 23 through 28, which limit the extent to which the seller and JHA may be liable. We also draw to the attention of all sellers, their individual consignment receipt, incorporated herein, which sets out the relationship between the "seller" and JHA.

For the purposes of these conditions Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. is referred to as "IHA", "auctioneer", "us" or "we" and actual prospective buyers and sellers are, as applicable, referred to as "you" and "your", or "buyer" and "seller".

Definitions of Terms:

The following terms, placed in quotation marks, shall have the meaning set out below:

- (a) "buyer" means the person who makes the highest acceptable bid or that person's pre-authorized representative;
- (b) "buyer's premium" means the commission on the "hammer price" payable to JHA at the rates listed in the auction catalogue, together with an amount in lieu of any taxes applicable to said commission;
- (c) "hammer price" means the price at which an item is knocked down by the auctioneer to the "buyer" or, in the case of postal auctions, the agreed price; in both cases excluding the "buyer's premium";
- (d) "seller" means the person or persons that have ownership of the merchandise offered. In the case of multiple ownership, each of the owners shall assume, jointly and severally, all obligations, liabilities, and representations, warranties, and indemnities as set forth in these Conditions of Business;
- (e) "seller's commission" means the amount payable to JHA by the seller at the rates applicable at the date of the sale of the property or the date of loss or damage to the property, if applicable;
- (f) "net sale proceeds" means the "hammer price" of the lot sold, less the "seller's commission" and "expenses";
- (g) "expenses" as related to the sale of items at auction means, but not limited to, JHA's charges for insurance, collection, advertising, catalogue reproduction and photography, packing and shipping costs, research, taxes and/or duties or charges for other services requested by the "seller" in conjunction with the sale.

General Conditions:

For Canadian residents a 12.5% buyers commission, plus your
province of residence's GST or HST as applicable, will be added
to the hammer price of each lot purchased. For international buyers only a 12.5% buyer's commission will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. These amounts are payable by
the buyer as part of the total purchase price. Lots are not shipped
until full payment is received.

- We reserve the right to withdraw or combine any lot at our discretion.
- In conformity with Canadian Law, no coin or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
- JHA reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to exclude any bidder from participating in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate and at our sole discretion.
- All bidders in any JHA auction expressly waive any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of JHA's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion, clerical error or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or bidder sheet.
- 6. No minors may participate in our sales.
 - 7. If you make a bid at auction you do so as principal and will be held person-ally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations aris-ing from the bid and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as their agent in the same way as if they were bid-ding personally. Agents should note that JHA's stated warranties apply only to the registered bidder to whom the lot is sold, and can not be extended to any undisclosed thirdparty. All agents are therefore advised to register their agency and principal with JHA prior to the sale. No exceptions will be granted.
- 8. Title to all lots remains with JHA until payment in full is received.
- Sales tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.
- 10. Due to Canadian Heritage laws, some of the items in our auctions may require Export Licenses if the successful purchaser requires the lot to be taken or shipped out of Canada. JHA will assist the buyer in obtaining such licenses and complying with applicable Canadian Heritage laws.
- 11. By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the Auction House's entry of your bid, and that disputes con-cerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or non-payment, JHA may elect to proceed judi-cially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in the Courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attorney for collection, the buyer agrees to hold JHA harmless and indemnify for all costs of collection, including actual reasonable attorney's fees, with interest at 1.5% per month (18% p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
- 12. Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount due before the lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole discre- tion of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to, in writing, by the auctioneer. Please contact us in advance if you have any questions regarding your purchasing plans. First rate credit references or a 25% deposit are necessary to ensure entry of your bids. Any portion of such deposit not used will be promptly refunded after each sale.

- 13. Lot descriptions contained within the catalogue are statements of opinion only. All goods are offered with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in the catalogue are for identification only, and may be reduced or enlarged in size. To assist you, we may refer in a catalogue to particular faults or imperfections, but any such guidance, which we provide, does not purport to be exhaustive. You will be deemed to have knowledge of all matters which you could be reasonably expected to find out given your particular expertise and the exercise by you of reasonable due diligence. The failure of any third party to concur with any statement of opinion shall not be grounds for the return of any lot under Conditions 24-26.
- Bids for the auction will be accepted by Mail, or fax until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet.
- 15. No "buy" or "unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about 5% at the discretion of the auctioneer.
- 16. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, this includes percentage increases. Lots will open at the next interval over the second highest bidder, or 50% of the estimate whether reserved or not. Bids of less than 50% of estimate will not generally be accepted except at the sole discretion of the auctioneer.
- 17. In the case of a tie mail bid, the first received will be given preference. In the case of a tie between a mail bidder and the floor, the mail bidder takes precedence. Fax bidders will be considered as mail bidders for the purposes of this clause.
- Bidders are solely responsible for checking the accuracy of theirbidsheets. JHA assumes no responsibility for errors in the amount bid or lot numbers listed on the bid sheet. Please be sure that your bid sheet is signed.
- Postage, insurance, shipping and handling fees are added to ALL-SHIPMENTS, the minimum being \$10.00. Bidders outside of Canada must supply detailed shipping instructions and agree to all terms as listed herein before shipment is made.
- JHA may reopen the bidding on a lot under the following circumstances:
 - (a) JHA has failed to correctly execute a mailbid;
 - (b) A party purchasing the lot on the floor has done so in error;(c) Where a protest is made after the hammer has fallen but be
 - forebidding has commenced on the next lot;
 (d) Where the auctioneer has determined that he has overlooked a party still bidding on the lot, but before the calling of the

 (e) At the discretion of the auctioneer.
- 21. In the event of a dispute, the auctioneer's decision is final.
- Persons placing bids are responsible for meeting the maximum amounts represented on their bid sheets. JHA reserves the right to reject frivolous complaints and to take appropriate action against such bidders as defined in Conditions 4 and 11.
- 23. Floor bidders may not return any lots, including those purchased while acting as agents. Those persons bidding on the floor are deemed to have inspected the lots and satisfied themselves as to the lot's authenticity, description and condition. No exceptions will be made.

- 24. All claims for adjustments by non-floor bidders, for reasons of non-authenticity must be made within 5 days of receipt of the goods, but in no case later than 28 days after a sale, as JHA acts as an agent for various consignors.
- 25. NO CLAIMS OF ANY KIND will be considered after settlements have beenmade. Failure of the bidder to execute this privilege within the 28 day time period, either from a failure to pay promptly or any other cause shall void the privilege. This privilege applies solely to the original purchaser and does not extend or transfer to any third party whatsoever. Any returned lot must be received in the condition it was sent out. Numismatic items must be returned in the original holder with the seal intact. Capricious returns will not be accepted.
- 26. If we are notified prior to the expiration of the 28 day period that the authenticity of a lot is in question, the matter will remain open until such time that the lot in question is proven to be non-authentic to our reasonable opinion. Buyers shall be required to submit generally accepted references in support of their position. The buyer agrees that any claim shall be limited to the "hammer price" and the "buyer's premium" actually paid to JHA with regard to that lot. The buyer further agrees that the dispute may, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, be submitted to a third party expert of the auctioneer's choosing, whose decision shall be final.
- 27. No price adjustments will be made to the hammer price of a lot whether there is an authenticity question about the whole lot or any one item within the lot. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made.
- 28. Third party graded coins including but not limited to ICCS, PCGS and NCG cannot be returned for grading disagreement. They are sold as is. Any discrepancies in the grade should be taken up with the appropriate grading company.
- 29. Terms for this sale are strictly cash and must be paid promptly in Canadian funds. Payments should be made immediately on receipt of the invoice. Payments from foreign accounts must be made in the form of a Canadian Dollar Bank Draft.
- 30. As a convenience, invoices may be charged to Visa and Master-Card accounts. Please supply account number, signature and expiration date at the bottom of your bid sheet. Please note that there will be an additional service charge of 2% for using a charge card.
- A monthly interest charge of 1.5% is charged on all accounts 30 days past due, calculated from the date of the sale. Late payers should not expect to receive future catalogues.
- 32. The same protection applicable to Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc., applies and extends to each and every one of their officers, employees and consultants, unless they shall be convicted of knowingly selling false or stolen goods in connection with lots offered at auction.
- In the event of unsuccessful litigation the plaintiff shall pay all JHA's legal costs, and all other costs incurred by JHA in defense against such suit.
- 34. JHA assumes no liability for merchandise lost, stolen or damaged while in the possession of a party to whom merchandise has been shipped. The purchaser is solely responsible for the safekeeping and insurance of any items in their possession.

Frederick George Scott was born in Montreal in what was then the Province of Canada on 7 April 1861. He received his early education in Montreal and later at Bishop's College in Quebec where he graduated in 1882 with a Bachelor of Arts degree. Scott traveled to England in 1882 extending his studies in Theology while attending King's College in London. The following year he returned to Bishop's College earning a Master's degree in 1884.

Scott was also an accomplished poet and 1885 saw his works being published in his first book. His poetry embodied the typical pessimism of the Victorian age, of which he was firmly a part. He was known as "The Poet of the Laurentians" with a writing style that was able to express profound and noble thoughts in the simplest of terms.

Scott was ordained as a priest by the Anglican Church in 1886 serving as curate in Coggeshill, Essex, England during 1886-7. He married Miss Amy Brooks, the eldest daughter of George Brooks of Barnet, England in April 1887. Reverend Scott returned to Canada to accept an appointment as Rector at Drummondville, PQ serving there until being appointed as curate of St. Matthews in Quebec in 1896.

In October 1897 Reverend Scott displayed a glimpse of the personal courage that was to make him famous later on. For his actions in saving the life of a man from drowning, Reverend Scott was awarded the Royal Canadian Humane Association's Sanford Medal in Gold. This award was the highest award of the association and was awarded to the person who had performed the most daring act of courage during a rescue for the year. The award was named for its sponsor, Senator W. E. Sanford and was first awarded in 1895. Reverend Scott's award was most likely the third of these awards out of a maximum of six. Senator Sanford died in a boating accident in July 1899 and the award of the Sanford Medal ceased with the death of its sponsor.

Reverend Scott became Rector of St. Matthews in 1899 and was made Canon of the Holy Trinity Cathedral, Quebec in 1906. He also served as Chaplain in the 8th Royal Rifles (Quebec). He was still serving in both capacities when World War I erupted.

General Hughes announced that Canada would supply a force of twenty thousand men to England in the event that war was declared against Germany, Canon Scott was visiting the Quebec newspaper office with a friend when that announcement was made, and he remarked:

"That means that I have got to go to the war." His friend didn't quite agree, saying "Of course it does not mean that you should go. You have a parish and duties at home." In typical fashion, Canon Scott replied "No. I am a Chaplain of the 8th Royal Rifles. I must volunteer, and if I am accepted, I will go."





In August of 1914 he volunteered for overseas service despite being 54 years of age. Later that same month Canon Scott arrived at the new military encampment at Valcartier. Canada was preparing for war, and the camp at Valcartier was the staging point for the Canadian Expeditionary Force. While there, the 8th Royal Rifles were combined with another unit which Canon Scott was not to serve as Chaplain. Again he contemplated the need for him to go to war. He discussed the matter with his friend Colonel Turner who told him to think about what Canada was embarking upon as a nation, the wastages of war, and the effect on the soldiers. After due reflection, Canon Scott informed the Colonel that he had thought the matter over and was going. He was then attached to the 14th Battalion. Just prior to his scheduled departure, a huge Church parade was held, with near on 15,000 men present. The preacher for the assemblage was none other than Canon Scott himself. Two weeks later, the battalions marched off to the entraining point and transported to Quebec where a flotilla of passenger liners had been assembled to carry the Canadian troops to England.

Canon Scott embarked for England with half of the 14th Battalion aboard the Cunard liner "Andania". The ship was filled to overflowing with men of the 16th Battalion (Canadian Scottish) and a Signal Company also aboard. The "Andania" sailed the following evening having received her orders to move by wireless. She had been preceded by a number of other transports dispatched in the same manner; their departure was marked by cheers from the spectators lining the shores. Three days later the "Andania" arrived at Gaspe Basin where she anchored for the night. The following morning after exiting the Narrows, "Andania" and the other transports formed into columns three abreast, the line of ships stretching to almost nine miles long. Several cruisers and later a battleship formed up on the transports to guard them. On 14th October 1914 the flotilla arrived in Plymouth, England.

On the following Sunday 18th October the men were entrained for the village of Patney and from there marched to Westdown South on the Salisbury Plain. The numbers of Canadian units arriving continued to grow with the effect that the green fields of the Plain were trampled into an ooze of never ending mud. There were few activities to occupy the men, so marching and training were the orders of the day. For weeks on end there were parades, inspections and visits by dignitaries but no mention of going to France to fight. This was soon to change.

One evening when returning to the mess, Canon Scott was horrified to see his name amongst those who were to be posted with immediate effect to Number 2 General Hospital. It meant that he was not going to be able to accompany his battalion overseas. In his autobiography "War As I Saw It", the Canon relates the story this way:

"I at once began to think out a plan of campaign. I went over to the G.O.C. of my brigade, and told him that I was to report to No. 2 General Hospital. I said, with perfect truth, that I did not know where No. 2 General Hospital was, but I had determined to begin the hunt for it in France. I asked him if he would take me across with the Headquarters Staff, so that I might begin my search at the front. He had a twinkle in his eye as he told me that if I could get on board the transport, he would make no objection. I was delighted with the prospect of going over with the men."

When the troops were embarked for France, Chaplain Scott simply walked aboard the transport vessel. Upon being questioned as to who he was, he replied "I am No. 2 General Hospital". The Captain of the ship, thinking that the officer before him was drunk decided that it was better to keep him aboard rather than put him back on the wharf in that condition. Thus Canon Scott proceeded to France. On arrival, still maintaining the ruse of looking for his unit (which was actually located on the Salisbury Plain), went with the 3rd Artillery Brigade to Castre. He set out to find accommodations for himself since he was not "on the strength" of the unit. Fortunately a meeting with the Mayor resulted in his being provided with a room at the Mayor's own house. Scott, being a Quebecer would have been quite comfortable speaking with the French people as he had a good command of the language. Later on, he was summoned to the Brigade Major's office and was informed that the General wished to see him. He was told that he would be given an attachment to the Brigade as long as he did not go into the trenches or leave the immediate area of the Brigade Headquarters on pain of being sent back to England. As a result, he was attached to the First Canadian Division Headquarters. In August 1915 he was appointed to be Senior Chaplain to the division.

Despite his orders, Canon Scott could not stay out of the front line, realizing that he might be a source of comfort and strength for the men. Several instances occurred where the Canon noticed an approaching General and quickly ducked for cover. The men were often surprised to see a Chaplain suddenly appear in their midst. Once Scott explained that he was dodging a General, he was usually received quite well. He continued to ignore those particular orders through the end of the war, and never managed to link up with Number 2 General Hospital.

Canon Scott was mentioned in dispatches 1.1.1916 for his services at the front. He was also awarded the C.M.G. on 14.1.1916.

Canon Scott worked tirelessly to provide for the soldiers. He set up small churches and offered services to any that were interested. Through the battles of Neuve Chappell, Langemarke, and Ypres he often could be found amongst the men to distribute candy and cigarettes. He was present when the first of the Chlorine gas attacks were loosed on the allied lines at Ypres. Following the attacks the Germans broke through the lines and created the need to evacuate the area. By the time that Scott had walked back to his billet the town was near deserted. He continues:

"To my infinite delight, some men came marching up in the moonlight from the end of the canal. I recognized them as the 16th Battalion, Canadian Scottish, and I called out, "Where are you going, boys?" The reply came glad and cheerful. "We are going to reinforce the line, Sir, the Germans have broken through." "That's all right, boys", I said, "play the game. I will go with you." Never before was I more glad to meet human beings. The splendid battalion marched up through the streets towards St. Jean. The men wore their overcoats and full kits. I passed up and down the battalion talking to officers and men. As I was marching beside them, a sergeant called out to me, "Where are we going, Sir?" "That depends upon the lives you have led." A roar of laughter went up from the men".





Canon Scott was with the division throughout the battles of Festubert, Givenchy, Ploegsteert, Mount Sorrel, The Somme, Vimy Ridge, Hill 70, The German Offensive of early 1918 and the Battle of Arras. In each and every case the Padre was to be found in amongst the men, providing care and comfort to the soldiers to whom he was so dedicated.

For his unswerving services he was awarded the Distinguished Service Order on 7 November, 1918 and received a further three Mentions in Despatches.

His service with the 1st Canadian Division came to an abrupt halt before the City of Cambrai as he was standing upon a small rise with a couple of others looking through glasses at the town when a shell exploded in front of the group. Canon Scott was hit in the legs and the wound was significant enough to force his evacuation. The report that was published in the newspaper in Canada was to read this way:

"Among the wounded was Hon. Lt-Col. F. G. Scott the senior Protestant Chaplain of the 1st Division, who had served for more than three and a half years on the Western Front. His contribution to the welfare of the troops was typical of the devoted service rendered by the padres in the field. "The men loved him", a former brigade commander was to write," ... for in hours of misery, help and comfort radiated from this undaunted soul." Whether in an officers' mess or in a trench issuing candy or smokes, or conducting a burial behind the lines, Canon Scott was equally at home. Although he had many times been advised, and even ordered, to keep out of dangerous places, he always insisted on sharing the risks and hardship with the soldiers whom he called his "boys".

His one regret was that he had been knocked out of the war. Canon Scott was invalided to England and returned to Canada.
