Dora de Pédery Hunt was born in Budapest, Hungary on $16^{\text {th }}$ November 1913, she completed her studies in sculpture and design there in 1943 and then immigrated to Canada in 1948. With the first showing of her work in Canada she established her reputation as a representational artist endowed with superb technical skills

She specialized indesigning Canadian coins, medals, awards, and jewellery. Examples of her works include the $\$ 1001976$ Olympic gold coin, United Nations Pearson Peace Medal and the effigy of the Queen on all Canadian coins from 1990-2003. The effigy of the Queen was the first one to be designed by a Canadian artist. Her illustrious career came to an end when she died in Toronto on $29^{\text {th }}$ September 2008.
