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## Conditions of Business

The conditions of business, along with all other terms, conditions and notices set out in this auction catalogue, or announced by the auctioneer, form the terms on which Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. (JHA) contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship of purchase and sale of property by auction. It is therefore very important that you read these conditions carefully. By bidding or selling in this sale you agree to accept these conditions, and that these conditions shall govern all future dealings that may occur between you and JHA.
You should note that JHA generally acts as an agent for the seller. Any concluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer. You acknowledge that JHA is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to the items offered for sale. JHA can not and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers therefore have the responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as the nature of the items, which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw your attention to Conditions 23 through 28 , which limit the extent to which the seller and JHA may be liable. We also draw to the attention of all sellers, their individual consignment receipt, incorporated herein, which sets out the relationship between the "seller" and JHA.

For the purposes of these conditions Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. is referred to as "JHA", "auctioneer", "us" or "we" and actual prospective buyers and sellers are, as applicable, referred to as "you" and "your", or "buyer" and "seller".

## Definitions of Terms:

The following terms, placed in quotation marks, shall have the meaning set out below:
(a) "buyer" means the person who makes the highest acceptable bid or that person's pre-authorized representative;
(b) "buyer's premium" means the commission on the "hammer price" payable to JHA at the rates listed in the auction catalogue, together with an amount in lieu of any taxes applicable to said commission;
(c) "hammer price" means the price at which an item is knocked down by the auctioneer to the "buyer" or, in the case of postal auctions, the agreed price; in both cases excluding the "buyer's premium";
(d) "seller" means the person or persons that have ownership of the merchandise offered. In the case of multiple ownership, each of the owners shall assume, jointly and severally, all obligations, liabilities, and representations, warranties, and indemnities as set forth in these Conditions of Business;
(e) "seller's commission" means the amount payable to JHA by the seller at the rates applicable at the date of the sale of the property or the date of loss or damage to the property, if applicable;
(f) "net sale proceeds" means the "hammer price" of the lot sold, less the "seller's commission" and "expenses";
(g) "expenses" as related to the sale of items at auction means, but not limited to, JHA's charges for insurance, collection, advertising, catalogue reproduction and photography, packing and shipping costs, research, taxes and or duties or charges for other services requested by the "seller" in conjunction with the sale.

## General Conditions:

1. For Canadian residents a $12.5 \%$ buyers commission, plus your province of residence's GST or HST as applicable, will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. For international buyers, only a $12.5 \%$ buyer's commission will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. These amounts are payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. Lots are not shipped until full payment is received.
2. We reserve the right to withdraw or combine any lot at our discretion.
3. In conformity with Canadian Law, no coin or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
4. JHA reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to exclude any bidder from participating in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate and at our sole discretion.
5. All bidders in any JHA auction expressly waive any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of JHA's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion, clerical error or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or bidder sheet.
6. No minors may participate in our sales.
7. If you make a bid at auction you do so as principal and will be held personally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations arising from the bid and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as their agent in the same way as if they were bidding personally. Agents should note that JHA's stated warranties apply only to the registered bidder to whom the lot is sold, and can not be extended to any undisclosed thirdparty. All agents are therefore advised to register their agency and principal with JHA prior to the sale. No exceptions will be granted.
8. Title to all lots remains with JHA until payment in full is received.
9. Sales tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.
10. Due to Canadian Heritage laws, some of the items in our auctions may require Export Licenses if the successful purchaser requires the lot to be taken or shipped out of Canada. JHA will assist the buyer in obtaining such licenses and complying with applicable Canadian Heritage laws.
11. By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the Auction House's entry of your bid, and that disputes concerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or non-payment, JHA may elect to proceed judicially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in the Courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attorney for collection, the buyer agrees to hold JHA harmless and indemnify for all costs of collection, including actual reasonable attorney's fees, with interest at $1.5 \%$ per month ( $18 \%$ p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
12. Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount due before the lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to, in writing, by the auctioneer. Please contact us in advance if you have any questions regarding your purchasing plans. First rate credit references or a $25 \%$ deposit are necessary to ensure entry of your bids. Any portion of such deposit not used will be promptly refunded after each sale.
13. Lot descriptions contained within the catalogue are statements of opinion only. All goods are offered with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in the catalogue are for identification only, and may be reduced or enlarged in size. To assist you, we may refer in a catalogue to particular faults or imperfections, but any such guidance, which we provide, does not purport to be exhaustive. You will be deemed to have knowledge of all matters which you could be reasonably expected to find out given your particular expertise
and the exercise by you of reasonable due diligence. The failure of any third party to concur with any statement of opinion shall not be grounds for the return of any lot under Conditions 24-26.
14. Bids for the auction will be accepted by Mail, or fax until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet.
15. No "buy" or "unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about $5 \%$ at the discretion of the auctioneer.
16. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, this includes percentage increases. Lots will open at the next interval over the second highest bidder, or $50 \%$ of the estimate whether reserved or not. Bids of less than $50 \%$ of estimate will not generally be accepted except at the sole discretion of the auctioneer.z
17. In the case of a tie mail bid, the first received will be given preference. In the case of a tie between a mail bidder and the floor, the mail bidder takes precedence. Fax bidders will be considered as mail bidders for the purposes of this clause.

24. All claims for adjustments by non-floor bidders, for reasons of nonauthenticity must be made within 5 days of receipt of the goods, but in no case later than 28 days after a sale, as JHA acts as an agent for various consignors.
25. NO CLAIMS OF ANY KIND will be considered after settlements have beenmade. Failure of the bidder to execute this privilege within the 28 day time period, either from a failure to pay promptly or any other cause shall void the privilege. This privilege applies solely to the original purchaser and does not extend or transfer to any third party whatsoever. Any returned lot must be received in the condition it was sent out. Numismatic items must be returned in the original holder with the seal intact. Capricious returns will not be accepted.
26. If we are notified prior to the expiration of the 28 day period that the authenticity of a lot is in question, the matter will remain open until such time that the lot in question is proven to be non-authentic to our reasonable opinion. Buyers shall be required to submit generally accepted references in support of their position. The buyer agrees that any claim shall be limited to the "hammer price" and the "buyer's premium" actually paid to JHA with regard to that lot. The buyer further agrees that the dispute may, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, be submitted to a third party expert of the auctioneer's choosing, whose decision shall be final.
27. No price adjustments will be made to the hammer price of a lot whether there is an authenticity question about the whole lot or any one item within the lot. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made.
28. Third party graded coins including but not limited to ICCS, PCGS and NCG cannot be returned for grading disagreement. They are sold as is. Any discrepancies in the grade should be taken up with the appropriate grading company.
29. Terms for this sale are strictly cash and must be paid promptly in Canadian funds. Payments should be made immediately on receipt of the invoice. Payments from foreign accounts must be made in the form of a Canadian Dollar Bank Draft.
30. As a convenience, invoices may be charged to Visa and MasterCard accounts. Please supply account number, signature and expiration date at the bottom of your bid sheet. Please note that there will be an additional service charge of $2 \%$ for using a charge card.

## HUNTERSTOWN, BRETON 567 A CANADIAN TOKEN, OR A TOKEN WITH DUAL NATIONALITY?

This is one of the rarer tokens in the Breton listed pre-Confederation series and is highly desirable. It is difficult to say how many examples exist today. There are two examples in the National Currency Collection of the Bank of Canada and the Hunterstown appeared in most major collections of the past. Apparently the token was unknown to collectors until quite late. Breton was the first to catalogue it in his 1890 Illustrated Canadian Coin Collector where he gave it no. 121. In 1894, when Breton numbered it 567 , he said the first example was discovered by Patrick Murphy of Quebec City. Breton also said that the collector Andrew Nutter of Montreal found the second known example which he promptly sold for $\$ 25.00$. The first recorded public sale would appear to have been in the auction of the Gerald Hart collection in 1895. John Dow of Montreal had one which he acquired in the 1898 Colonel Cutting sale where it was lot 67. It eventually went to W.W.C. Wilson, each of whose four sales, in 1925, 1926, 1927 and 1928 featured an example. Lot 495 in his 1925 sale, which was described as "As fine as struck," went for $\$ 31.00$ US, and lot 45 in his 1927 sale sold for $\$ 27.50$ US, both considerable sums of money at the time. Other significant collections which included examples of the Hunterstown token were the Charles Morris collection (sold in 1912, two examples), the Ludger Gravel (1935), W.F. Dunham (1941), Eugène Courteau (1944), Howard Gibbs (1952), R.W. Williams (1969), John McKay-Clements (1976), Allan Fargeon, and J.D. Ferguson collections. Lead casts are known. Jeffrey Hoare Auctions sold one such piece from the Roy Hughes collection, lot 1510, in February 1995.

Hunterstown is a village on the Rivière-du-Loup (not to be confused with the town of Rivière-du-Loup), located just west of Shawinigan, Quebec, 40 kilometres north of the St. Lawrence River, about halfway between Montreal and Quebec City. The Hunterstown Lumber Co. was said by Breton (1894) to have been "an American lumbering firm" which issued this token for use in its company store, inasmuch as it has no designated value and reads PAYABLE IN GOODS. It is slightly larger than a Victoria farthing, but that seems too small a value to justify the existence of such a piece. Breton (1894) says it passed for a halfpenny, although we do not know the basis for his claim. Because its circulation was intended to be local, perhaps it had no accepted currency value at all, and only an agreed upon equivalent in goods (e.g. so much tobacco, or so much whiskey, etc.). The workmanship in the design and the legends is not very accomplished and suggests a local manufacturer, perhaps even the issuing company itself. The Hunterstown Lumber Company issued scrip in denominations from 5 cents to $\$ 5.00$ in the 1860s and 1870s. In 1874 the company was forced to suspend operations and sell its sawmills because of difficult economic times (Le Journal des Trois-Rivière, October 26, 1874:2). Production did not resume again until the fall of 1880.

Nothing has been said in the numismatic literature about the devices on the obverse and reverse of the token, but they present something of a puzzle. The reverse clearly displays a five-pointed star, and the obverse either a crown, a pine cone, or an acorn. What do they mean? The explanation may lie with the origins and history of the company. Breton (1894) says that the Hunterstown Lumber Co. operated in the Province of Quebec from about 1850. As it happens, the company was not formed until 1854, four years after the date given by Breton, and two years after the 1852 date on the token. Jocelyn Morneau in his scholarly Petits pays et grand ensembles: les articulations du monde rural au XIXe siècle (Québec: Les Presses de l'Université Laval, 2000:264) says that the company was created in 1854 when William Henry Parker of Hunterstown, Quebec, joined forces with lumber merchants from Maine, Massachusetts, and New Brunswick. Later, the company would have interests in Boston and Burlington, Vermont. Charles Robb, in Notes of a Trip to Hunterstown, St Maurice Territory (Montreal: John Lovell), writing in 1862, says that the company was incorporated in the Province of Quebec in 1858.

But why, then, is the token dated 1852? One possibility is that the token was not issued by the Hunterstown Lumber Co. at all, as is generally assumed. Unlike the Company's scrip, the token only reads HUNTERSTOWN, which might be taken to signify the name of the place, but not necessarily the name of a company. If that be the case, then the token may have been issued by William Parker of Hunterstown on his own, prior to joining up with his American partners. Parker was a native of Quebec, and had been in the timber trade at Hunterstown with an American from Vermont named Truman Kimpton at least as early as 1836 when they worked a sawmill on the Rivière-du-Loup (Morneau 2000: 264). Kimpton had arrived in the area in the early 1820s and built his first sawmill in 1824. A settlement of about 300 people grew up around the mill, where Kimpton opened a store and built houses for his employees. In 1842, Parker purchased from Kimpton a quarter of all the latter's properties at Hunterstown, which included 20,000 acres, two sawmills, a grist mill, a house, sheds, wharves, dams, stables, and a forge (www.mauricie.cieq.ca). It was after Kimpton withdrew from the lumber business some time between 1850 and 1852 that Parker teamed up with his new American partners to form the Hunterstown Lumber Co. If the token's obverse device is construed as an acorn, that would be consistent with the wreaths of oak leaves that encircle the central devices on each side of the token. A pine cone as a device is consistent with the pine timber that was cut, squared and milled in the forests of Eastern Canada throughout the nineteenth century. However, what if the device were taken to be a crown? Do we then have a token which is intended to appeal to colonial Canadian sentiments? However, that does not explain the device of the star on its reverse. Were the sentiments on the obverse balanced by the conventional republican symbol of a five-pointed star on the token's reverse signifying the United States? As a second possibility for the origins of the token, therefore, perhaps it was issued by Parker (a Canadian) and Kimpton (an American) just prior to the end of their partnership. In summary, either the Hunterstown is a pre-Confederation token with dual nationality, or it is a Canadian token which has been mis-attributed at the expense of its true issuer, William Parker of the village of Hunterstown. Whatever the case, it seems safe to say that its attribution to the Hunterstown Lumber Co. is a mistake.

Douglas Harvey McCallum was born on 21st October 1909 in Carberry, Manitoba. He was commissioned in the Militia as 2nd Lieutenant with the Royal Canadian Engineers (N.P.A.M.) in December 1937. On 6th September 1939 he joined the Canadian Active Service Force and was sent to England at the end of 1939. In August 1940 he became a Captain and in May 1943 was promoted to a Major in command of 31st Field Company RCE. He was part of 21 Army Group that landed in France on 9 th July 1944 and very quickly saw action at the River Orne crossing for which he received his DSO. He was killed in action on 25 th July 1944 by enemy mortar fire. The province of Manitoba honored him by naming Lake McCallum after him.

"During the night 18-19 July 1944, 2 Canadian Corps made an assault crossing of the River Orne. This operation was one of the most important of the entire campaign, and its failure would have had a serious effect on the whole operation in Normandy. As part of the Corps plan, 31 Canadian Field Company, the Corps of Royal Canadian Engineers, had the task of constructing a bridge over the River Orne at Caen to allow the passage of the so necessary supporting arms. Failure, therefore, to complete construction of this bridge would have had serious effects on the army plan. Major McCallum was in command of this operation and though harassed by mortar and sniper fire and by enemy planes, carried on with the task and brought it to a very successful conclusion. His courage and ability were of the highest order and undoubtedly contributed to the success of the operation."

Lieutenant Francis Gavan Power of the Royal Rifles of Canada was taken as a Prisoner of War in Hong Kong on Christmas Day 1941 and was one of only seven Canadian that were awarded the Military Cross for service in Hong Kong.

In September 1941 the Canadian Government received a telegram from the British Government requesting two battalions of infantry to bolster the garrison at Hong Kong. Canada chose the royal Rifles of Canada and the Winnipeg Grenadiers to fill this assignment. Accordingly a small force of nearly 2000 officers and men sailed from Vancouver aboard the SS Awatea, disembarking at Hong Kong on 16th November 1941. The two battalions were under-equipped, having little mortar ammunition and no transport available. The trucks that were to accompany the unit were diverted for use in the Philippines due to the events of the war. These were to have serious consequences a short time later.

The arrival of the Canadians, designated as Force C, under the command of Brigadier J.K. Lawson was an historical event and was reported enthusiastically in the local press. The Canadian troopers were also impressed with Hong Kong, where their money could buy many things that were unavailable to them in Canada. The conditions of the barracks and general appearance of the camp was excellent and more than made up for the previous camp they had been stationed at. This reverie was to last a short 17 days before the Japanese attacked the colony.

On 18/19 December 1941 the Japanese launched a heavy artillery barrage on the northern areas and followed in with elements of the 229th Regiment being convoyed ashore in collapsible assault boats and powered landing craft. The attack focused on the pill-boxes and defences on the shore line. These were soon overrun with heavy casualties. The Japanese launched second and third prongs to the attack and were heavily engaged with both the East and West Brigades of the defending force.

The defenders began to launch counter-attacks on the 20 th December, attempting to dislodge the troops entrenched on the hills. Lieutenant Francis Power lead an attack "displaying outstanding ability and initiative" which drove the enemy from the crest of Bridge Hill. Throughout the heavy fighting casualties had been mounting and the defenders were forced to withdraw from the ground that had been gained at such high cost. Gradually the positions deteriorated and casualties mounted forcing the concentration of the remaining defenders. On 25th December word was received that the force had surrendered the defence in the face of overwhelming Japanese Army, Navy and Air Force surrounding the island. The Royal Rifles of Canada suffered a total of 130 men killed in action and a further 227 wounded, a casualty rate of 37 percent. The casualty ratios for Officers and senior NCO's was even higher at 43 and 48 percent respectively.

The remaining officers and men of the Royal Rifles of Canada, including Lieutenant Power, were taken as Prisoners of War. The conditions and treatment that the Canadians were subjected to were horrible. The regiment lost another 130 men during the time of their captivity.
