## Conditions of Business

The conditions of business, along with all other terms, conditions and notices set out in this auction catalogue, or announced by the auctioneer, form the terms on which Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. (JHA) contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship of purchase and sale of property by auction. It is therefore very important that you read these conditions carefully. By bidding or selling in this sale you agree to accept these conditions, and that these conditions shall govern all future dealings that may occur between you and JHA.

You should note that JHA generally acts as an agent for the seller. Any concluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer. You acknowledge that JHA is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to the items offered for sale. JHA can not and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers therefore have the responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as the nature of the items, which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw your attention to Conditions 23 through 28 , which limit the extent to which the seller and JHA may be liable. We also draw to the attention of all sellers, their individual consignment receipt, incorporated herein, which sets out the relationship between the "seller" and JHA.
For the purposes of these conditions Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. is referred to as "JHA", "auctioneer", "us" or "we" and actual prospective buyers and sellers are, as applicable, referred to as "you" and "your", or "buyer" and "seller".

## Definitions of Terms:

The following terms, placed in quotation marks, shall have the meaning set out below:
(a) "buyer" means the person who makes the highest acceptable bid or that person's pre-authorized representative;
(b) "buyer's premium" means the commission on the "hammer price" payable to JHA at the rates listed in the auction catalogue, together with an amount in lieu of any taxes applicable to said commission;
(c) "hammer price" means the price at which an item is knocked down by the auctioneer to the "buyer" or, in the case of postal auctions, the agreed price; in both cases excluding the "buyer's premium";
(d) "seller" means the person or persons that have ownership of the merchandise offered. In the case of multiple ownership, each of the owners shall assume, jointly and severally, all obligations, liabilities, and representations, warranties, and indemnities as set forth in these Conditions of Business;
(e) "seller's commission" means the amount payable to JHA by the seller at the rates applicable at the date of the sale of the property or the date of loss or damage to the property, if applicable;
(f) "net sale proceeds" means the "hammer price" of the lot sold, less the "seller's commission" and "expenses";
(g) "expenses" as related to the sale of items at auction means, but not limited to, JHA's charges for insurance, collection, advertising, catalogue reproduction and photography, packing and shipping costs, research, taxes and or duties or charges for other services requested by the "seller" in conjunction with the sale.

## General Conditions:

1. For Canadian residents a $15 \%$ buyers commission, plus your province of residence's GST or HST as applicable, will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. For international buyers, only a $15 \%$ buyer's commission will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. These amounts are payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. Lots are not shipped until full payment is received.
2. We reserve the right to withdraw or combine any lot at our discretion.
3. In conformity with Canadian Law, no coin or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
4. JHA reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to exclude any bidder from participating in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate and at our sole discretion.
5. All bidders in any JHA auction expressly waive any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of JHA's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion, clerical error or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or bidder sheet.
6. No minors may participate in our sales.
7. If you make a bid at auction you do so as principal and will be held personally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations arising from the bid and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as their agent in the same way as if they were bidding personally. Agents should note that JHA's stated warranties apply only to the registered bidder to whom the lot is sold, and can not be extended to any undisclosed thirdparty. All agents are therefore advised to register their agency and principal with JHA prior to the sale. No exceptions will be granted.
8. Title to all lots remains with JHA until payment in full is received.
9. Sales tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.
10. Due to Canadian Heritage laws, some of the items in our auctions may require Export Licenses if the successful purchaser requires the lot to be taken or shipped out of Canada. JHA will assist the buyer in obtaining such licenses and complying with applicable Canadian Heritage laws.
11. By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the Auction House's entry of your bid, and that disputes concerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or non-payment, JHA may elect to proceed judicially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in the Courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attorney for collection, the buyer agrees to hold JHA harmless and indemnify for all costs of collection, including actual reasonable attorney's fees, with interest at $1.5 \%$ per month ( $18 \%$ p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
12. Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount due before the lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to, in writing, by the auctioneer. Please contact us in advance if you have any questions regarding your purchasing plans. First rate credit references or a $25 \%$ deposit are necessary to ensure entry of your bids. Any portion of such deposit not used will be promptly refunded after each sale.
13. Lot descriptions contained within the catalogue are statements of opinion only. All goods are offered with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in the catalogue are for identification only, and may be reduced or enlarged in size. To assist you, we may refer in a catalogue to particular faults or imperfections, but any such guidance, which we provide, does not purport to be exhaustive. You will be deemed to have knowledge of all matters which you could be reasonably expected to find out given your particular expertise
and the exercise by you of reasonable due diligence. The failure of any third party to concur with any statement of opinion shall not be grounds for the return of any lot under Conditions 24-26.
14. Bids for the auction will be accepted by Mail, or fax until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet.
15. No "buy" or "unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about $5 \%$ at the discretion of the auctioneer.
16. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, this includes percentage increases. Lots will open at the next interval over the second highest bidder, or $50 \%$ of the estimate whether reserved or not. Bids of less than $50 \%$ of estimate will not generally be accepted except at the sole discretion of the auctioneer.z
17. In the case of a tie mail bid, the first received will be given preference. In the case of a tie between a mail bidder and the floor, the mail bidder takes precedence. Fax bidders will be considered as mail bidders for the purposes of this clause.

## 21. In the event of a dispute, the auctioneer's decision is final.

22. Persons placing bids are responsible for meeting the maximum amounts represented on their bid sheets. JHA reserves the right to reject frivolous complaints and to take appropriate action against such bidders as defined in Conditions 4 and 11.
23. Floor bidders may not return any lots, including those purchased while acting as agents. Those persons bidding on the floor are deemed to have inspected the lots and satisfied themselves as to the lot's authenticity, description and condition. No exceptions will be made.
24. All claims for adjustments by non-floor bidders, for reasons of nonauthenticity must be made within 5 days of receipt of the goods, but in no case later than 28 days after a sale, as JHA acts as an agent for various consignors.
25. NO CLAIMS OF ANY KIND will be considered after settlements have beenmade. Failure of the bidder to execute this privilege within the 28 day time period, either from a failure to pay promptly or any other cause shall void the privilege. This privilege applies solely to the original purchaser and does not extend or transfer to any third party whatsoever. Any returned lot must be received in the condition it was sent out. Numismatic items must be returned in the original holder with the seal intact. Capricious returns will not be accepted.
26. If we are notified prior to the expiration of the 28 day period that the authenticity of a lot is in question, the matter will remain open until such time that the lot in question is proven to be non-authentic to our reasonable opinion. Buyers shall be required to submit generally accepted references in support of their position. The buyer agrees that any claim shall be limited to the "hammer price" and the "buyer's premium" actually paid to JHA with regard to that lot. The buyer further agrees that the dispute may, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, be submitted to a third party expert of the auctioneer's choosing, whose decision shall be final.
27. No price adjustments will be made to the hammer price of a lot whether there is an authenticity question about the whole lot or any one item within the lot. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made.
28. Third party graded coins including but not limited to ICCS, PCGS and NCG cannot be returned for grading disagreement. They are sold as is. Any discrepancies in the grade should be taken up with the appropriate grading company.
29. Terms for this sale are strictly cash and must be paid promptly in Canadian funds. Payments should be made immediately on receipt of the invoice. Payments from foreign accounts must be made in the form of a Canadian Dollar Bank Draft.

His coolness, courage and disregard of danger assisted.' Wounded and invalided to England in September 1916. He was commissioned as a Temporary Lieutenant in November 1918. As a Major in the Cape Breton Highlanders he was awarded the Efficiency Decoration in 1937. Both with copies of Service Papers.

James Elmslie Walker was born on $4^{\text {th }}$ April 1919 in Claresholm, Alberta. He enlisted into the RCAF on $10^{\text {th }}$ May 1940, becoming a Pilot Officer in December 1940. After arriving overseas he was posted to 81 Squadron in August 1941, becoming part of 151 Wing that was sent to Murmask, Russia to teach the Soviets to fly Hurricanes. During the wing's three months stay they shot down sixteen German aircraft, of which he was credited with a twin-engine Junkers 88 bomber. Returning to England 81 Squadron converted to Spitfires and on $2^{\text {nd }}$ June 1942 Walker was credited with a kill over Le Touquet of a FockeWulf 190 fighter. In October the unit was transferred to Gibraltar to take part in Operation Torch, the Allied invasion of North Africa. While there he shot down a JU88 and a FW190. He was made a Squadron leader in March 1943 and the CO of 243 Squadron RAF. In March 1944 he was appointed wing leader of the newly formed 144 RCAF Wing. He was killed in a flying accident on $25^{\text {th }}$ April 1944 at age 25 .

DFC- London Gazette $11^{\text {th }}$ September 1942.
"This officer is a determined and skilful pilot. He has at all times shown a keen desire to engage the enemy. While serving in Russia Flight Lieutenant Walker destroyed one hostile aircraft. Since March, 1942, he has led his flight continuously in all operations."

Bar to DFC- London Gazette $19^{\text {th }}$ March 1943.
"This officer has destroyed four enemy aircraft and damaged four others since his arrival in North Africa. His untiring efforts and leadership merit the highest praise. His example has been an inspiration to other pilots in his wing and has contributed greatly to the wings successes in the air."

Second Bar to DFC- London Gazette 9 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ July 1943.
"Squadron Leader Walker assumed command of this squadron at a difficult period and his fine leadership and excellent example were responsible for bringing it to its present very high standard of efficiency. He has been largely instrumental for the many successes achieved by the squadron and has himself destroyed at least four enemy aircraft and damaged others."

The Historically Important Family Group awarded to Lieutenant-Colonel Arthur Trefusis Heneage Williams The Hero of Batoche

In it he mentions his travels West, the search for Big Bear, Poundmaker checking Lt. Colonel Otter and the Battle of Batoche, This letter is with its original envelope bearing a Victoria 2 Cent soldier or seaman special rate stamp.
The mails from the soldiers on the Northwest expedition were handled by special arrangement, "the outside of the envelope was signed by the commanding officer, carried by couriers on horseback to Swift Current and then by Canadian Pacific Railway to Winnipeg where 2 Cent small Queen stamps were added and cancelled". There are approximately thirty 2 Cent special rate covers in collector's hands. This piece is the only recorded example of the 2 Cent soldier rate from the Midland Battalion, also the signature of the commanding officer on this is Lt. Colonel Williams. Comes with small information folder compiled by a later family member.

Arthur T.H. Williams was born on $13^{\text {th }}$ June 1837 at Penryn Park, Port Hope.
He was the eldest son of John Tucker Williams a former Commander in the British Royal Navy who had commanded a vessel on Lake Ontario during the War of 1812, and who had remained in Canada settling on a farm in the Port Hope area. He married Judge Ward's daughter Sarah, later becoming the first Mayor of Port Hope and also commanded the Durham Regiment during the 1837 Rebellion. He represented Durham East in the Legislative Assembly of United Canada from 1840 to 1848.

Arthur T.H. Williams grew up on his father's estate, later studying at Upper Canada College and working for a period in the law office of Scott and Kirchhoffer in Port Hope. He later travelled to Scotland to finish his education at the University of Edinburgh after which he travelled throughout Europe. He studied law and enrolled with the Law Society of Upper Canada in 1859 but never became a lawyer, as his father had died in 1854 leaving him his farming property which he decided to run. He married Emily W. Seymour in 1859, this union produced five children.

Coming from a staunch Empire Loyalist background he became part of the militia in Canada being appointed Captain on $17^{\text {th }}$ October 1862 of a Port Hope unit. In the winter of 1865-66 he and his unit were on the St. Clair frontier watching for Fenian Raids. He commanded a provisional militia unit at Kingston in 1866 and later that year took command of the $46^{\text {th }}$ East Durham Battalion.

In 1867 when Canadian Confederation took place he was elected as a Conservative member for East Durham to the provincial legislature. By

that time he was also a Justice of the Peace, a real estate agent, a director of the Midland Railway of Canada and chairman of the Port Hope Harbour Commission. In 1873 he set-up the Midland Loan and Savings Company and was its President. As an MP and Militia officer he was able to obtain the position of commanding the Canadian Rifle Team which competed in England in 1880.

When the North West Rebellion broke out at the end of March 1885 he was given command of the Midland Battalion and they set off for the front on 6th April 1885. They travelled on the Canadian Pacific Railway north of Lake Superior then by the steamboat Northcote and barges on the South Saskatchewan River to join Major-General Middleton's column before the Battle of Batoche.

The Battle of Batoche took place over a four day period from $9^{\text {th }}$ to $12^{\text {th }}$ May 1885. Middleton was very cautious with regard to this battle, after the severe casualties suffered by N.W.M.P. at the Battle of Duck Lake $26^{\text {th }}$ March 1885 and the Metis victory at Fish Creek $24^{\text {th }}$ April 1885. On the first day Middleton had his soldiers attack, but the Metis had a series of rifle pits dug around the village where they were entrenched and the soldiers were on higher ground therefore easy targets. So for the next two days Middleton used his field guns and avoided a major attack. Finally on the fourth day Lt. Colonel Williams and other commanding officers decided to make a charge and he was in the lead with the Midland Regiment. He led the way and kept pressing on through pit after pit with bullets whisking all around him even at one point being exposed to crossfire from the Grenadiers. The Metis scattered and this became the decisive victory for the government forces.

In his letter to his son he mentions that "Midland Battalion made so splendid an advance \& charge I led them not one man flinched."
On $1^{\text {st }}$ July 1885 Lt . Colonel Williams collapsed and was taken to the steamer Northwest where he could be made more comfortable as they felt he was suffering from exertion and bad food. Once there he began to suffer from fever so they decided to take him down river, but on the evening of $3^{\text {rd }}$ July he sank into unconsciousness and died on the morning of $4{ }^{\text {th }}$ July 1885 . The boat hoisted a flag at half-mast at $9: 30$ am telling the sad story that the brave Canadian officer who led the charge at Batoche was dead.

Lt. Colonel Williams was the only national figure to die in this campaign so his body was brought home in state. His funeral took place in Port Hope on $21^{3 t}$ July 1885 with over forty floral tributes being sent from the military and civilians and was attended by the Lieutenant Governor. The town of Port Hope was draped in mourning with the stores closed and a massive arch of evergreens was erected near the Town Hall, bearing the inscription "We Mourn the Hero of Batoche".

A commemorative statue of him was erected in front of Port Hope Town Hall, from money raised by contributions from the Dominion, the Government and his own Regiment, it was unveiled by Sir John A. MacDonald.

Victor A.S. Williams was born on $2^{\text {nd }}$ June 1867 at Penryn Park, Port Hope on the same estate as his father.

He was educated at the Grove School in Lakefield, Ontario and later attended Trinity College School in Port Hope. In 1884 he entered the Royal Military College in Kingston, Ontario. Two years into his studies he was removed from the college on $12^{\text {th }}$ July 1886 by his guardians on the advice of Sir John A. MacDonald and entered service in the North West Mounted Police. He received his commission as an Inspector in the N.W.M.P. on $14^{\text {th }}$ December 1887.



On $28^{\text {th }}$ September 1889 he resigned his commission and transferred into the Company of Mounted Infantry in Winnipeg and then received a Commission as a Lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Dragoons on $10^{\text {th }}$ June 1890. On $23^{\text {rd }}$ October 1890 he married Helen Euphemia Sutherland.

In 1892 he was attached to the $5^{\text {th }}$ Dragoon Guards in Aldershot for an instruction course. After receiving a Commission as a Captain in the R.C.D on $1^{\text {" J June }} 1898$ he became the O.C. Military District No. 10 in Winnipeg.

He went to South Africa in the Boer War with Second Contingent, The Canadian Mounted Rifles 1" Battalion as Commander of "B" Squadron, serving as a Major and later Lt. Colonel.

After returning from the Boer War for his overseas service he was promoted to Brevet Colonel and appointed Commandant of the Royal School of Cavalry in Toronto. Following this in 1097 he was appointed C.O. of the Royal Canadian Dragoons and Inspector of Cavalry for the Dominion of Canada, which led to him commanding the mounted units at George V's coronation in 1911. From 1912 to 1914 he was Adjutant-General Military Headquarters in Ottawa and honorary A.D.C. to the Governor General The Duke of Connaught.

At the outbreak of WWI he was put in command of Valcartier Camp during the mobilization of the $1^{\text {st }}$ Canadian Division and then accompanied them overseas to England where he commanded Division and Details on Salisbury Plains. He then served on the General Staff of Field Marshall Sir John French in France and then to General Staff $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ Imperial Army Corps. He was the Chief Staff Officer at the Canadian Shorncliffe Camp in England from April to May 1915.

He was promoted to Brigadier-General and placed in command of the $8^{\text {th }}$ Canadian Infantry Brigade of the $3^{\text {rd }}$ Canadian Division in December 1915. He received an MID on $30^{\text {th }}$ April 1916 for gallant and distinguished service in the Field. On $2^{\text {ted }}$ June 1916 he and Major General M.S. Mercer were inspecting the front lines at Mount Sorrel when a German massive artillery barrage began which lasted for 4.5 hours and completely demolished the Canadian trenches. Mercer was killed and Williams was severely wounded and buried by the shell explosions. Thought dead by the Germans, he was later removed from a box car of dead Canadian soldiers and made a Prisoner of War, possibly being the highest ranking Canadian officer capture in WWI. He remained a P.O.W. returning to Canada in late 1918. For his war service he received his CMG appointment on $5^{\text {th }}$ May 1919 and a mountain in the Canadian Rockies was named in his honour- Mount Williams.

After the war he was promoted to Major-General on $10^{\text {th }}$ September 1927 and put in command of Military District 2 based in Toronto and then commanded military districts in Kingston and Toronto. In 1922 he retired from the Army and on $1^{\text {st }}$ May 1922 was appointed Commissioner of the Ontario Provincial Police, from which he retired in 1939.

He died in Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto on $12^{\text {th }}$ December 1949 and was buried in the family plot in St. John's Cemetery in Port Hope. Both VF.

Brigadier General Dollard Menard, D.S.O., G.O.C., C.D. served as a Lieutenant Colonel during the Dieppe Raid in 1942 while commanding Les Fusiliers Mont Royal, the only French speaking infantry unit present during that famous raid. Wounded no less than five times during the action, he was also the only commanding officer to return to England after the raid owing to all of the other commanders being killed or captured. Menard graduated from the Royal Military College of Canada in 1932 receiving a lieutenant's commission in the Royal $22^{\text {nd }}$ Regiment (the Van Doos) in 1936. After service in India, he took part in the Waziristan Campaign. Following this he was promoted to the rank of Captain and joined the staff of the Inspector General for Eastern Canada. Having been born in Quebec (1913) Menard insisted that any unit that was under his command with a francophone majority use only French for drill and parade orders. He was the commanding officer of the East Sector of Quebec, which included Camp Valcartier. Menard was posted to Army Headquarters in 1962 and remained there until retirement in 1965. In 1994 he was made a Grand Officer of the National Order of Quebec with the following citation:
"While he commanded his battalion during the operation of Dieppe, on August 19, 1942, this officer gave evidence of the highest qualities of courage and of initiative. He was wounded at the beginning of the raid, as he landed with the first groups of assault, but he continued to steer the operations of his unit by wireless telegraphy, under a fire fed by machine guns, by mortars and by artillery. Later, with the aim of reaching a more favourable position, he dragged himself up to a high point of the ground, but he was again wounded. Even after having been transported aboard a landing barge, and although wounded for the fifth time, he continued to insist on organizing the defence against planes, and taking care of his men. He put an example which is in the best tradition of the Army and was an inspiration for all the officers and the privates of his battalion".
