## Conditions of Business

The conditions of business, along with all other terms, conditions and notices set out in this auction catalogue, or announced by the auctioneer, form the terms on which Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. (JHA) contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship of purchase and sale of property by auction. It is therefore very important that you read these conditions carefully. By bidding or selling in this sale you agree to accept these conditions, and that these conditions shall govern all future dealings that may occur between you and JHA.
You should note that JHA generally acts as an agent for the seller. Any concluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer. You acknowledge that JHA is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to the items offered for sale. JHA can not and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers therefore have the responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as the nature of the items, which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw your attention to Conditions 23 through 28 , which limit the extent to which the seller and JHA may be liable. We also draw to the attention of all sellers, their individual consignment receipt, incorporated herein, which sets out the relationship between the "seller" and JHA.
For the purposes of these conditions Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. is referred to as "JHA", "auctioneer", "us" or "we" and actual prospective buyers and sellers are, as applicable, referred to as "you" and "your", or "buyer" and "seller".

## Definitions of Terms:

The following terms, placed in quotation marks, shall have the meaning set out below:
(a) "buyer" means the person who makes the highest acceptable bid or that person's pre-authorized representative;
(b)"buyer's premium" means the commission on the "hammer price" payable to JHA at the rates listed in the auction catalogue, together with an amount in lieu of any taxes applicable to said commission;
(c) "hammer price" means the price at which an item is knocked down by the auctioneer to the "buyer" or, in the case of postal auctions, the agreed price; in both cases excluding the "buyer's premium";
(d) "seller" means the person or persons that have ownership of the merchandise offered. In the case of multiple ownership, each of the owners shall assume, jointly and severally, all obligations, liabilities, and representations, warranties, and indemnities as set forth in these Conditions of Business;
(e) "seller's commission" means the amount payable to JHA by the seller at the rates applicable at the date of the sale of the property or the date of loss or damage to the property, if applicable;
(f) "net sale proceeds" means the "hammer price" of the lot sold, less the "seller's commission" and "expenses";
(g) "expenses" as related to the sale of items at auction means, but not limited to, JHA's charges for insurance, collection, advertising, catalogue reproduction and photography, packing and shipping costs, research, taxes and or duties or charges for other services requested by the "seller" in conjunction with the sale.

## General Conditions:

1. For Canadian residents a $15 \%$ buyers commission, plus your province of residence's GST or HST as applicable, will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. For international buyers, only a $15 \%$ buyer's commission will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. These amounts are payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. Lots are not shipped until full payment is received.
2. We reserve the right to withdraw or combine any lot at our discretion.
3. In conformity with Canadian Law, no coin or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
4. JHA reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to exclude any bidder from participating in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate and at our sole discretion.
5. All bidders in any JHA auction expressly waive any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of JHA's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion, clerical error or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or bidder sheet.
6. No minors may participate in our sales.
7. If you make a bid at auction you do so as principal and will be held personally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations arising from the bid and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as their agent in the same way as if they were bidding personally. Agents should note that JHA's stated warranties apply only to the registered bidder to whom the lot is sold, and can not be extended to any undisclosed thirdparty. All agents are therefore advised to register their agency and principal with JHA prior to the sale. No exceptions will be granted.
8. Title to all lots remains with JHA until payment in full is received.
9. Sales tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.
10. Due to Canadian Heritage laws, some of the items in our auctions may require Export Licenses if the successful purchaser requires the lot to be taken or shipped out of Canada. JHA will assist the buyer in obtaining such licenses and complying with applicable Canadian Heritage laws.
11. By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the Auction House's entry of your bid, and that disputes concerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or non-payment, JHA may elect to proceed judicially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in the Courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attorney for collection, the buyer agrees to hold JHA harmless and indemnify for all costs of collection, including actual reasonable attorney's fees, with interest at $1.5 \%$ per month ( $18 \%$ p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
12. Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount due before the lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to, in writing, by the auctioneer. Please contact us in advance if you have any questions regarding your purchasing plans. First rate credit references or a $25 \%$ deposit are necessary to ensure entry of your bids. Any portion of such deposit not used will be promptly refunded after each sale.
13. Lot descriptions contained within the catalogue are statements of opinion only. All goods are offered with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in the catalogue are for identification only, and may be reduced or enlarged in size. To assist you, we may refer in a catalogue to particular faults or imperfections, but any such guidance, which we provide, does not purport to be exhaustive. You will be deemed to have knowledge of all matters which you could be reasonably expected to find out given your particular expertise
and the exercise by you of reasonable due diligence. The failure of any third party to concur with any statement of opinion shall not be grounds for the return of any lot under Conditions 24-26.
14. Bids for the auction will be accepted by Mail, or fax until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet.
15. No "buy" or "unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about $5 \%$ at the discretion of the auctioneer.
16. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, this includes percentage increases. Lots will open at the next interval over the second highest bidder, or $50 \%$ of the estimate whether reserved or not. Bids of less than $50 \%$ of estimate will not generally be accepted except at the sole discretion of the auctioneer.z
17. In the case of a tie mail bid, the first received will be given preference. In the case of a tie between a mail bidder and the floor, the mail bidder takes precedence. Fax bidders will be considered as mail bidders for the purposes of this clause.
18. Bidders are solely responsible for checking the accuracy of their bid sheets. JHA assumes no responsibility for errors in the amount bid or lot numbers listed on the bid sheet. Please be sure that your bid sheet is signed.
19. Postage, insurance, shipping and handling fees are added to ALLSHIPMENTS, the minimum being $\$ 10.00$. Bidders outside of Canada must supply detailed shipping instructions and agree to all terms as listed herein before shipment is made.
20. JHA may reopen the bidding on a lot under the following circumstances: (a) JHA has failed to correctly execute a mail bid;
(b) A party purchasing the lot on the floor has done so in error;
(c) Where a protest is made after the hammer has fallen but before bidding has commenced on the next lot;
(d) Where the auctioneer has determined that he has overlooked a party still bidding on the lot, but before the calling of the next lot;
(e) At the discretion of the auctioneer.
21. In the event of a dispute, the auctioneer's decision is final.
22. Persons placing bids are responsible for meeting the maximum amounts represented on their bid sheets. JHA reserves the right to reject frivolous complaints and to take appropriate action against such bidders as defined in Conditions 4 and 11.
23. Floor bidders may not return any lots, including those purchased while acting as agents. Those persons bidding on the floor are deemed to have inspected the lots and satisfied themselves as to the lot's authenticity, description and condition. No exceptions will be made.
24. All claims for adjustments by non-floor bidders, for reasons of nonauthenticity must be made within 5 days of receipt of the goods, but in no case later than 28 days after a sale, as JHA acts as an agent for various consignors.
25. NO CLAIMS OF ANY KIND will be considered after settlements have beenmade. Failure of the bidder to execute this privilege within the 28 day time period, either from a failure to pay promptly or any other cause shall void the privilege. This privilege applies solely to the original purchaser and does not extend or transfer to any third party whatsoever. Any returned lot must be received in the condition it was sent out. Numismatic items must be returned in the original holder with the seal intact. Capricious returns will not be accepted.
26. If we are notified prior to the expiration of the 28 day period that the authenticity of a lot is in question, the matter will remain open until such time that the lot in question is proven to be non-authentic to our reasonable opinion. Buyers shall be required to submit generally accepted references in support of their position. The buyer agrees that any claim shall be limited to the "hammer price" and the "buyer's premium" actually paid to JHA with regard to that lot. The buyer further agrees that the dispute may, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, be submitted to a third party expert of the auctioneer's choosing, whose decision shall be final.
27. No price adjustments will be made to the hammer price of a lot whether there is an authenticity question about the whole lot or any one item within the lot. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made.
28. Third party graded coins including but not limited to ICCS, PCGS and NCG cannot be returned for grading disagreement. They are sold as is. Any discrepancies in the grade should be taken up with the appropriate grading company.
29. Terms for this sale are strictly cash and must be paid promptly in Canadian funds. Payments should be made immediately on receipt of the invoice. Payments from foreign accounts must be made in the form of a Canadian Dollar Bank Draft.
30. As a convenience, invoices may be charged to Visa and MasterCard accounts. Please supply account number, signature and expiration date at the bottom of your bid sheet. Please note that there will be an additional service charge of $2 \%$ for using a charge card.
31. A monthly interest charge of $1.5 \%$ is charged on all accounts 30 days past due, calculated from the date of the sale. Late payers should not expect to receive future catalogues.

# ROBERT D.W. BAND 

1927-2013

Robert Deveaux Woodruff Band, always known as Bob was born in Toronto where he spent the first five years of his life. The family moved to St. Catharine's in 1932, but returned to Toronto when Bob was fifteen, and he spent the rest of his life in that city. He graduated from the University of Toronto in 1953 with a degree in civil engineering, and shortly after obtained his lifelong employment with the former Borough of North York. For over four decades Bob dedicated himself to designing and engineering the infrastructure for this rapidly growing urban population.

Bob's collections provided his second full time job, and he certainly devoted as much time to his avocation as he did to his engineering career. As long as I knew Bob, he preferred to work on his collections at home, which also included the building of model ships, and other bits of woodworking. On holidays Bob spent time at the homes of his late brother and sister's children accompanied by their spouses, and fifteen great, and great-great nephews and nieces. As can be imagined, and quite to the fascination of this large family he inevitably brought along an artefact or two from his collection, and told the story of its acquisition, its relationship to the event with which it was associated, accompanied by a history lesson not duplicated in classes today. I can tell you that the tale of the acquisition of an object, frequently from an old-time collector, or family in Toronto with roots to the War of 1812 was as exciting as the artefact itself.

The Bob Band collections offered here represent the passion of a collector of over sixty years. Actually, his memory dated his collecting development to about the age of five, and if those youthful years are considered his collecting history can be extended to over seventyfive years! This collecting enthusiasm was no doubt generated early on through his father (Percy Carrruthers Band), and his mother Margaret Julia Band (nee Woodruff) who were lifelong collectors. His father collected old toys from the 18th and early 19th century, and historical art: the one interest shared by both father and son. Percy was also a well-known philatelist, collecting letters for their philatelic association. His mother was an ardent and well respected collector of 18th and 19th century English porcelain and fine china. Bob however, took another course with his collecting, and saw old letters and documents as representations of history, frequently providing insight into events not previously recorded by historians. His gun collections had never been an interest of his father, and Bob's Indian trade guns are second only to the collection held by the Museum of the Fur Trade in Chadron, Nebraska.

Bob was a Canadianist of the first order. His collections were many and varied, but all emphasized a passion for Canadian history. Though enthusiastic about those who had achieved prominence in such varied careers in the military, as artists, or in mercantile pursuits such as the fur trade, he never neglected objects associated with the average man, and delighted in letters and documents which presented unedited opinions of political, financial, and everyday life, not frequently seen in the epistles of men who understood their own importance. Proof of this is contained in the very last of his letters to me, written in September 2012: "The package just arrived and I have read the letter. It is great and confirms my opinion that personal letters are far more interesting than most official reports. It also proves that having a conscience and acting on it is bound to be rewarded." My correspondence with Bob Band which commenced in 1972 is far and away the most extensive of any I've had in the last fifty years. His hand-written letters certainly must number 200, and the number of pages would average 5 per letter. It's a veritable history of Bob's acquisitions, his notions on collecting, and on the collectors and dealers in those areas.

Bob's collection of military and Indian material, fur trade manuscripts, and books relating to the travellers in Canada of the 17th to 19th centuries were some of his main interests. Nevertheless, he not infrequently phoned to talk of some new acquisition, considered by most to be devoid of interest, and was tickled to assure me that he was probably "the only one in the world who would give a damn about it." These associative objects, though minor, frequently gave context to some of the major items in his collection, and were generally dismissed as insignificant by most collectors.

It is an honour to have been asked to convey some of my impressions of this collector-friend, with whom I've had a long association, and frequent communications. His sudden passing came as a great shock to me as I often talked to Bob of making it to his centennial year, and I believe he fully intended to achieve that goal, but the ambition ended, sadly, on August 23rd of last year.

Bob was a stalwart among collectors, and is missed by his family and many collector friends.

Sir Daniel Hunter McMillan, K.C.M.G. was born in Whitby, in the pre-confederation Province of Canada (now Ontario) on 14 January 1846. He received his early education locally and later at Collingwood. Choosing to serve with the colours, he saw active duty on the Niagara Frontier during 1864 with the Canadian Volunteers. He later joined the Collingwood Rifle Company and with that unit saw service in repelling the Fenian Raids of 1866 (confirmed on roll for medal and 1866 clasp). In 1870 he served with the Ontario Rifles and took part in the Red River Expedition under the command of Colonel Garnet Wolseley (later Viscount Wolseley), which resulted in the suppression of the First Riel Rebellion. (roll confirms Red River Clasp).

Following the expedition, McMillan settled in Winnipeg and entered the grain business, establishing the first steampowered granary and milling business in Winnipeg. In 1874 he was instrumental in the first shipment of Canadian wheat to Minneapolis. In 1879 McMillan unsuccessfully ran for the Manitoba Legislature being narrowly defeated by Thomas Scott. McMillan was elected for Winnipeg in a by-election on 4 December, 1880 after Scott left for federal politics.

McMillan remained active in military affairs and served during the Northwest Rebellion (1885) as a Major in the Winnipeg Infantry Battalion (Roll confirms medal). He later became its commanding officer in 1887.

Resuming his political career, he was returned to Parliament for the riding of Winnipeg Centre after the landslide victory of Thomas Greenway's Liberals in 1888. He was appointed as Provincial Treasurer in May 1889 and additionally appointed Provincial Lands Commissioner in October 1896. In 1899 the conservatives under Hugh John Macdonald defeated the Greenway Liberals, although McMillan retained his seat by a narrow margin. On 9 October 1900 he was appointed as the seventh Lieutenant Governor of Manitoba. He was knighted in 1902 receiving the Knight's Cross of Saint Michael and Saint George. Sir Daniel Hunter McMillan stepped down from the Lieutenant Governor's position in 1911. He died at his home in Winnipeg on 14 April 1933.

## Canadian Boer War D.S.O. Colonel J.E. Leckie, CMG, CBE, DSO.

John Edward Leckie was born in Acton Vale, Quebec in 1872. He was educated at Bishops' College School, Lennoxville, and graduated from the Royal Military College at Kingston in 1893. Leckie served in the Boer War as a Lieutenant, commanding the West Kootenay Troop, Lord Strathcona's Horse (1899-1900), and as a Captain in Canadian Mounted Rifles (1900-1902). He was mentioned in dispatches by Field Marshal Lord Roberts on 2nd April 1900 and created a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order (London Gazette 19.4.1901) with the following citation: "John Edward Leckie, Lieut., Lord Strathcona's Corps. In recognition of services during the operations in South Africa". Lieut. Leckie also received the Queen's South Africa Medal with five clasps: Natal, Orange Free State, Belfast, South Africa 1901 and South Africa 1902 (roll confirms). Following his Boer War Service, Leckie became a Captain in the $72^{\text {nd }}$ Seaforth Highlanders of Canada on $17^{\text {th }}$ June 1909 and was promoted to Major in the same regiment on $30^{\text {th }}$ September 1913. During World War I he served in France as a Lieutenant-Colonel, commanding the 16th Battalion being again mentioned in dispatches for his services. He was made a Companion of the Order of St. Michael and St. George in February 1917 (L.G. 15.2.17). In 1919, as a Colonel, Leckie commanded the 2nd Reserve Brigade with distinction on the Murmansk Front being awarded the Commander of the British Empire (London Gazette 3.2.20), the Russian Order of St. Vladimir, $4^{\text {th }}$ Class (London Gazette 3.2.20), the Russian Order of the White Eagle, $4^{\text {th }}$ Class (London Gazette 3.2 .20 ) and a further mention in dispatches (London Gazette 3.2 .20 ). He was also brought to the notice of the Secretary of War for Services in North Russia (3.3.20) and awarded the French Croix de Guerre (London Gazette 24.05.21).

Following the war Colonel Leckie, became involved in exploration and mining ventures in Mexico, Venezuela and Africa. In 1928 he helped organize a mineral survey into the Hudson Bay Territory. In 1932 Leckie formed the Cocos Island Treasure Limited and persuaded 1800 investors to back him in his expedition to find sunken pirate treasures that were rumored to be there. Leckie mananaged to unearth some pirate gold but ran out of money and had to retire. His attempts to mount a second expedition did not meet with success although his finds sparked a flurry of expeditions looking for the hidden gold. Leckie then returned to his original profession, mining and engineering, offering his services as a mining consultant. During WW2 he served as a cable censor from 1939-1944. John Edward Leckie passed away in Port Hope, Ontario on $7^{\text {th }}$ August 1950.

Captain William Hamilton Merritt is confirmed on the Militia of Upper Canada roll for medal and clasp.
William Hamilton Merritt was born on $3^{\text {rd }}$ July 1793 in Bedford, N.Y. After his father had fought in the American Revolutionary War as a United Empire Loyalist the family moved to New Brunswick but later returned to the U.S. However, in 1795 they finally moved to the Niagara Peninsula in Upper Canada. William attended school in Burlington studying mathematics and field surveying.

He was in the Niagara Light Dragoons, who were raised in June 1812. Merritt and his unit were sent to aid in the taking of Detroit, arriving in Sandwich on the day of the battle. They crossed the river and entered the city the next morning. Merritt's unit were also engaged in the cutting out of the "Caledonia" and "Detroit" which had been captured by the Americans, for which the unit was thanked in General Orders. The unit was disbanded on $25^{\text {th }}$ February 1813.

Captain Merritt was given command of the Troop of Provincial Dragoons (Niagara Frontier Guides) when the unit was raised on $24^{\text {th }}$ April 1813. The unit took part in engagements at Fort George on $27^{\text {th }}$ May 1813, at Stoney Creek on $5^{\text {th }}$ June 1813, at Black Rock on $30^{\text {th }}$ December 1813 and at Lundy's Lane on $25^{\text {th }}$ July 1814. Merritt was taken as a prisoner of war at Lundy's Lane and held in Massachusetts until March 1815.

After the war he purchased 25 acres at Shipman's Corner where he built a house and a store. Later in 1816 he bought a sawmill on Twelve Mile Creek adding to it a grist mill and store. In July 1818 at St. Catherines, he organized a general meeting of people living in the area and from this a petition was sent to the Upper Canada Legislature to ask for a canal to be constructed between Twelve Mile Creek and Chippawa Creek. In January 1824 an act of the Legislature formed the Welland Canal Company with Merritt as the financial agent.

He served in the Legislative Assembly of Upper Canada from 1832 to 1841 for Haldimand County and in the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada from 1841 to 1860 for Lincoln County. In June 1833 he was a Commissioner of the Peace for the District of Niagara. He is shown in 1839 as being a Director of the Welland Canal Company as well as Post Master for the St. Catherines office in the district of Niagara. He was the Chief Commissioner of Public Works 1850-1851. He died on $5^{\text {th }}$ July 1862

He was the grandfather of Lt.-Colonel W.H. Merritt, the commanding officer of the Governor-General's Body Guard and the President of the Canadian Military Institute in 1906.

## North West Canada Medal to N.W.M.P. Constable at Duck Lake

The Battle of Duck Lake is often considered to be the opening salvos of the Northwest Rebellion. Settlers were coming into the Northwest Territories and displacing aboriginals from their lands. This caused great concern now that the buffalo had dwindled significantly and the land was the only source of support and income for these people. The Metis were concerned that these events would eventually result in the loss of their land. In late 1884 the Metis persuaded Louis Riel to return from the United States where he had taken refuge after the 1870 Red River uprising to appeal to the government on their behalf. In March of 1885 Louis Riel proclaimed the Provincial Government of Saskatchewan in an attempt to persuade the Federal Government to at least look at the concerns of the Metis people. The Federal Government's response was lacklustre at best, which helped to create more discontent and instability. Riel dispatched emissaries to Fort Carlton to demand the peaceful surrender of the fort to his provincial government forces.

The newly appointed superintendent of the Northwest Mounted Police Major Leif Crozier, rejected the demand and vowed that Riel and the Metis would be brought to justice. Crozier sent a party of constables under Sergeant Stewart to the general goods store at Duck Lake in order to obtain supplies. The party was unaware that Gabriel Dumont (Riel's Adjutant and military commander) and his men had entrenched themselves on the road to Duck Lake. On the morning of the $26^{\text {th }}$ Stewart's party encountered the Metis as they approached Duck Lake. Stewart decided not to engage in a pitched battle and returned to Fort Carlton without a shot being fired. Crozier then gathered a force consisting of 53 NCO's and men of the NWMP as well as 41 men of the Prince Albert Volunteers and a seven pound cannon. With this force he set out for Duck Lake to secure the much needed supplies and to assert the Federal Government's authority and control over the area.

Dumont spotted the approaching force and ordered his Metis to set up defensive positions and lie in wait. Major Crozier's scouts informed him of the Metis movements and Crozier also ordered his men to set up defensive positions. Dumont then sent his brother Isidore and an elderly Assowiyin under a white flag to parley in an attempt to distract Crozier's force. Crozier walked forward with an interpreter but soon saw the deception for what is was. As the two Metis representatives turned to leave they both attempted to draw their guns resulting in a brief struggle between the two parties resulting in the death of both Metis. Following these events a gun battle broke out between the two forces. Although well trained and equipped, Crozier's force was outnumbered and the Metis positions in the woods proved superior. Crozier reluctantly ordered a retreat to Fort Carlton after suffering losses of twelve men killed and eleven men seriously wounded. Following this surprising loss to Dumont and his Metis forces, the Federal Government ordered the evacuation and destruction of Fort Carlton. Despite the early victories at places like Duck Lake, Fish Creek and Cut Knife, the rebellion ended with the Metis defeat and capture of Louis Riel at the Battle of Batoche some month later.

Reg. \#525 R. Downsley is confirmed for the medal first issue with clasp. He is also is listed as an N.W.M.P. Constable of "D" division who took part in the engagement at Duck Lake on $26^{\text {th }}$ March 1885.

Peter Michael O'Leary was born on $23^{\text {rd }}$ June 1850 in Quebec. He was ordained in the Roman Catholic Church on $7^{\text {th }}$ June 1879 and in 1899 at the outbreak of hostilities in the Boer War he accompanied the $1^{31}$ Canadian Contingent to South Africa, one of only six Canadian chaplains who went. He is confirmed on the Denby/Roncetti roll as being with the R.C.R.I. and entitled to the medal and clasps. Although an older man he was still in the field all day during a battle and afterwards would search for the dead and wounded. He was highly regarded by the men of the unit. He would minister to the dying and wounded of all denominations of faith. There is an excerpt of a letter from him, while in South Africa, in the Denby/Roncetti book. He enlisted again in 1914 with the first Contingent of the CEF. He received a Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officer's Decoration as Major (Lt-Col. C.M.) with the Royal Rifles of Canada by General Order 232 in 1921. He died in Quebec on $22^{\text {nd }}$ December 1929 at age 79.

Clarence Warren Peck was born on $21^{51}$ January 1912 in Detroit, Michigan, U.S.A. and he joined the Canadian Army on 6't July 1943.

In June 1944 the capture of Putit-en-Bessin by the Allies was pivotal for the whole Normandy campaign, as it was on the road to Caen and if held could control road and rail lines from there westerly to Bayeux. On D-Day the Royal Winnipeg Rifles, after heavy and savage fighting, had broken through the beach defences and moved at a pace inland, making them along with the Regina Rifles the first to be thrust at the German defences. The Regiment was successful in defeating the enemy during the fighting on $7^{\text {th }}$ June, but on the $8^{\text {th }}$ June the Kurt Meyer's Hitler Youth division and SS Grenadiers supported by Panther and Tiger tanks attacked them.

By noon the Germans had entered the village and the regiment was broken up into isolated companies with no access to more ammunition, but they still fought on despite overwhelming odds in order to stop the enemy's offensive. However, they were eventually overrun by the Germans. Nearly three companies were lost to a man, in all the Regiment suffered 300 casualties.

Many of the prisoners taken by the enemy were casualties that had not been evacuated during the battle. Rifleman Peck and other prisoners were interrogated by the German SS and then murdered between the $8^{\text {th }}$ and 11th June 1944. They were found by a British regiment whose second-in-command Major Lloyd Sneath had served earlier in the Royal Winnipeg Rifles and who knew many of the victims. He stated that they were found where they fell after being lined up against a wall and shot. Peck is confirmed as one of the murder victims killed on $11^{\text {th }}$ June 1944 in the Roll of Honour of The Royal Winnipeg Rifles and is buried at Bretteville-Sur-Laize Cemetery.
The next of kin of these men were informed that they had been killed in action. However, just before the trial of Gen. Kurt Meyer in December 1945 letters were sent from the Department of National Defence to them stating that it was quite probable that the name of their lost one would be mentioned at forthcoming trials of German war criminals as being murdered. From December 1839 until early 1845 he was employed on the East India station in the Nimrod 20 and the Starling both in which he served throughout the whole of the First China War, for which he received the China Medal. Next in the Wolf 18 and then the Dido 18, in which he was Acting-Surgeon and engaged in the operations against the Borneo pirates in 1844. In order for Lord Wolseley to be in time to relieve General Gordon at Khartoum, he decided to send part of his troops by boat up the Nile. He needed experienced boatmen to achieve this as parts of the river were treacherous to navigate, and from his prior service in Canada he felt that Canadians would be the men to use. Advertisements were placed in Canadian newspapers resulting in 377 civilian boatmen being chosen to go to Egypt with 7 officers from the Canadian Militia under the command of Lieutenant Colonel F.C. Denison. These men became known as the Canadian Voyageurs and did their duty so well that Lord Wolseley mentioned them in his dispatch to the Secretary of State for War on $15^{\text {th }}$ June 1885. The men were divided into contingents from the parts of Canada that they were recruited in.
