## Conditions of Business

The conditions of business, along with all other terms, conditions and notices set out in this auction catalogue, or announced by the auctioneer, form the terms on which Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. (JHA) contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship of purchase and sale of property by auction. It is therefore very important that you read these conditions carefully. By bidding or selling in this sale you agree to accept these conditions, and that these conditions shall govern all future dealings that may occur between you and JHA.
You should note that JHA generally acts as an agent for the seller. Any concluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer. You acknowledge that JHA is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to the items offered for sale. JHA can not and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers therefore have the responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as the nature of the items, which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw your attention to Conditions 23 through 28 , which limit the extent to which the seller and JHA may be liable. We also draw to the attention of all sellers, their individual consignment receipt, incorporated herein, which sets out the relationship between the "seller" and JHA.

For the purposes of these conditions Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. is referred to as "JHA", "auctioneer", "us" or "we" and actual prospective buyers and sellers are, as applicable, referred to as "you" and "your", or "buyer" and "seller".

## Definitions of Terms:

The following terms, placed in quotation marks, shall have the meaning set out below:
(a) "buyer" means the person who makes the highest acceptable bid or that person's pre-authorized representative;
(b) "buyer's premium" means the commission on the "hammer price" payable to JHA at the rates listed in the auction catalogue, together with an amount in lieu of any taxes applicable to said commission;
(c) "hammer price" means the price at which an item is knocked down by the auctioneer to the "buyer" or, in the case of postal auctions, the agreed price; in both cases excluding the "buyer's premium";
(d) "seller" means the person or persons that have ownership of the merchandise offered. In the case of multiple ownership, each of the owners shall assume, jointly and severally, all obligations, liabilities, and representations, warranties, and indemnities as set forth in these Conditions of Business;
(e) "seller's commission" means the amount payable to JHA by the seller at the rates applicable at the date of the sale of the property or the date of loss or damage to the property, if applicable;
(f) "net sale proceeds" means the "hammer price" of the lot sold, less the "seller's commission" and "expenses";
$(\mathrm{g})$ "expenses" as related to the sale of items at auction means, but not limited to, JHA's charges for insurance, collection, advertising, catalogue reproduction and photography, packing and shipping costs, research, taxes and or duties or charges for other services requested by the "seller" in conjunction with the sale.

## General Conditions:

1. For Canadian residents a $15 \%$ buyers commission, plus your province of residence's GST or HST as applicable, will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. For international buyers, only a $15 \%$ buyer's commission will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. These amounts are payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. Lots are not shipped until full payment is received.
2. We reserve the right to withdraw or combine any lot at our discretion.
3. In conformity with Canadian Law, no coin or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
4. JHA reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to exclude any bidder from participating in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate and at our sole discretion.
5. All bidders in any JHA auction expressly waive any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of JHA's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion, clerical error or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or bidder sheet.
6. No minors may participate in our sales.
7. If you make a bid at auction you do so as principal and will be held personally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations arising from the bid and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as their agent in the same way as if they were bidding personally. Agents should note that JHA's stated warranties apply only to the registered bidder to whom the lot is sold, and can not be extended to any undisclosed thirdparty. All agents are therefore advised to register their agency and principal with JHA prior to the sale. No exceptions will be granted.
8. Title to all lots remains with JHA until payment in full is received.
9. Sales tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.
10. Due to Canadian Heritage laws, some of the items in our auctions may require Export Licenses if the successful purchaser requires the lot to be taken or shipped out of Canada. JHA will assist the buyer in obtaining such licenses and complying with applicable Canadian Heritage laws.
11. By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the Auction House's entry of your bid, and that disputes concerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or non-payment, JHA may elect to proceed judicially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in the Courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attorney for collection, the buyer agrees to hold JHA harmless and indemnify for all costs of collection, including actual reasonable attorney's fees, with interest at $1.5 \%$ per month ( $18 \%$ p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
12. Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount due before the lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to, in writing, by the auctioneer. 13. Lot descriptions contained within the catalogue are statements of opinion only. All goods are offered with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in the catalogue are for identification only, and may be reduced or enlarged in size. To assist you, we may refer in a catalogue to particular faults or imperfections, but any such guidance, which we provide, does not purport to be exhaustive. You will be deemed to have knowledge of all matters which you could be reasonably expected to find out given your particular expertise
and the exercise by you of reasonable due diligence. The failure of any third party to concur with any statement of opinion shall not be grounds for the return of any lot under Conditions 24-26.
14. Bids for the auction will be accepted by Mail, or fax until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet.
15. No "buy" or "unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about $5 \%$ at the discretion of the auctioneer.
16. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, this includes percentage increases. Lots will open at the next interval over the second highest bidder, or $50 \%$ of the estimate whether reserved or not. Bids of less than $50 \%$ of estimate will not generally be accepted except at the sole discretion of the auctioneer.z

26. If we are notified prior to the expiration of the 28 day period that the authenticity of a lot is in question, the matter will remain open until such time that the lot in question is proven to be non-authentic to our reasonable opinion. Buyers shall be required to submit generally accepted references in support of their position. The buyer agrees that any claim shall be limited to the "hammer price" and the "buyer's premium" actually paid to JHA with regard to that lot. The buyer further agrees that the dispute may, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, be submitted to a third party expert of the auctioneer's choosing, whose decision shall be final.
27. No price adjustments will be made to the hammer price of a lot whether there is an authenticity question about the whole lot or any one item within the lot. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made.

John Campbell Garden was born in Fredericton, New Brunswick in 1784. He joined The Royal Newfoundland Regiment of Fencible Infantry as an Ensign on $16^{\text {th }}$ December 1807, and was promoted to Lieutenant on $4^{\text {th }}$ October 1810.

The regiment was deployed to defensive positions from Ogdensburg to Amherstburg, by the time the U.S. declared war. He was present at the Battles of Detroit and Frenchtown.

His brother James was in the same regiment and by the spring of 1813 they were re-united at Amherstburg. Both were at the Siege of Fort Meigs on the Miami River, and they were the only two Officers of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment present at the Battle of Lake Erie. At this battle James was killed, John believed to have been on the H.M.S. Detroit was wounded and was taken Prisoner of War and held in Frankfort, Kentucky. He was released in June 1814 and was put on half pay on $25^{\text {th }}$ June 1816 after the regiment was disbanded.
After the war he returned to New Brunswick but later settled in the Niagara-on-the-Lake area and married in May 1820. He died on $15^{\text {th }}$ September 1860 at 77 years of age.

His grave is located at Lake View Cemetery in Thorold, Ontario and marked on his head stone is: "Lieutenant Royal Newfoundland Fencible Regt".

Benson a Member of the Canadian House of Commons in 1867 and a Member of the Senate in 1868. He was educated in local schools then at Upper Canada College and finally the Royal Military College from which he graduated on $26^{\text {th }}$ June 1883. In August 1883 he was appointed Lieutenant and Brevet Captain in "B" Battery Canadian Artillery stationed at Quebec and was on active duty there during the North West Rebellion. In October 1885 he was sent North West to Battleford and served there on Garrison duty until 1887. He transferred to the Royal Garrison Artillery and was stationed in Victoria BC in 1890. He was promoted to Brevet Major 21st August 1895, Captain $5^{\text {th }}$ February 1896; brevet Lt. Colonel $21^{s t}$ August 1899, Major July 1902, Lt. Colonel $1^{\text {st }}$ July 1905, and Colonel $1^{x}$ April 1908. He was Inspector of Artillery in April 1908, Officer Commanding Eastern Ontario in November 1909 and Master- General of Ordnance in March 1913. He was promoted Temporary Major General in September 1915, Brigadier General in March 1916 and was appointed General Officer commanding Military District number 6 in December 1916. He was promoted to Major General in 1918 and that year received his C.M.G. he was a member of the official Canadian Contingent at Edward VII Coronation in 1902. He died on $10^{\text {th }}$ September 1920

Frederick Merrett Benson was born on $19^{\text {th }}$ October 1890 in Victoria BC and received his early education in Quebec where his father was stationed. On January 1909 he was commissioned in the Permanent Forces as a Lieutenant in $1^{\text {s }}$ Regiment Canadian Artillery, transferred on $1^{\text {st }}$ December 1910 to the Royal Canadian Artillery and transferred on $23^{\text {rd }}$ December 1911 to the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery. He was a barber by trade and served in the Toronto Garrison Battery from $6^{\text {th }}$ October 1872 to $1^{\text {st }}$ October 1874, part of that time was spent at the School of Gunnery. From $7^{\text {th }}$ June to $16^{\text {th }}$ September 1873 he was a member of the Manitoba Battery, and then from $26^{\text {th }}$ June 1875 to $11^{\text {th }}$ October 1877 he served with "A" Battery Canadian Artillery. On $20^{\text {th }}$ December 1883 he enlisted in "C" Company of the Infantry School Corps.

"During the operations carried out between 17 and 22 September 1944 against Boulogne, The Queen's Own Rifles of Canada and another battalion were given the task of breaking through the defences to landward and capturing the Northern part of the city, the main forts to the North and the strong points covering the seaward approaches.

On $20^{\text {th }}$ September 1944, while commanding the Queen's Own Rifles of Canada, Major (acting Lieutenant-Colonel) Stephen MacLeod Lett carried out a personal reconnaissance of enemy positions under heavy enemy fire. This careful reconnaissance was the keystone upon which rested the plans of attack against a coastal point and which led to the capture of the Fort de la Crèche, the final enemy bastion north of Liane River.

So complete and accurate was Major (Acting Lieutenant-Colonel) Stephen McLeod Lett's reconnaissance and so contagious were his qualities of cool courage, initiative and leadership that his battalion was able to quickly secure the objective, thus greatly facilitating the completion of the Brigade task.

This officer's cheerful initiative, his dash and his steady influence when frequently under enemy artillery, mortar and small arms fire by his battalion's brilliant action."

Halton Stirling Lecky was born on $15^{\text {th }}$ December 1878 in Portrush, Ireland. He joined the Royal Navy as a Midshipman on $15^{\text {th }}$ February 1895. He served during the Boer War as a Sub-Lieutenant on the HMS Doris a 2nd class cruiser, as well as on HMS Widgeon a $1^{\text {" }}$ class gun boat, taking part in the Delagoa Bay Blockade.

"On $25^{\text {th }}$ August 1900 HMS Widgeon anchored in Kosi Bay in order to land stores and troops. The work of disembarkation was carried out by four boats manned by Malays under the superintendence of Sub-Lieut. Lecky. One boat loaded with stores and with Second Lieut. Arnold Gray, Trooper Frederick Trethowen and Private J.J. Forbes capsized about three hundred yards from shore. The five Malays boat crew and Private Forbes managed to swim to the shore. Lieut. Gray and Trooper Trethowen clung to the upwards keel boat, huge breakers continually swept over the boat and the men had great difficulty retaining their hold. Sharks were observed near the boat both before and after the accident. Sub-Lieut. Lecky seeing the critical position the two men were in, tore off his clothes and plunging into the surf endeavoured to swim to their assistance. He was twice thrown back on the beach by the heavy seas, but afterwards succeeded in bring first Lieut. Gray and then the other safe to the shore."

On 19th August 1908 he married Agnes Close in Weymouth Dorset. In 1913 he authored the "The King's Ships" which was in three volumes. He became a Commander in the Royal Navy on 31 December 1913. On $26^{\text {th }}$ June 1915 was Naval Assistant to the Fourth Sea Lord. During WWI he served in the British Aegean-Black Sea as Act. Captain of the HMS Europa and was Mentioned in Dispatches gazette 11.4.1919 and received in July 1919 the Greek Order of the Redeemer. This medal was part of the private collection of the late Bruce Beatty CD, known as the designer of the Order of Canada and avid collector of various orders and decorations. In a letter written in November 2010, shortly before his death, Mr. Beatty details how this medal which is widely reputed to have belonged to Lothar von Richthofen, came into his possession:
"First, with respect to the Blue Max, I received the medal from Lothar's best friend, Esser Lubbert. In 1963, I was invited to the Richthofen Squadron Reunion in Baden-Baden, Germany. As part of the invitation, I was asked to bring along and display some of my medal collection at the reunion. At some point during the reunion, Lubbert suggested that we go to a restaurant to have a bite to eat. During our get-together, Lubbert commented on how impressed he was with my medal collection. He then went on to offer Lothar von Richthofen's Blue Max to me for my collection and expressed how pleased he would be if I were to accept it and include it in my collection. According to Lubbert, before Lothar von Richthofen died, he gave his Blue Max to his friend, which is how it came into Lubbert's possession". VF.

Lothar Siegfried Freiherr von Richtofen was born $27^{\text {th }}$ September 1894 in Breslau, Silesia. He joined the military in 1911 and was in the $4^{\text {th }}$ Dragoons Unit which at the outbreak of WWI was one of the first at the Front. His unit was at various war fronts for a year before he applied for a transfer to the German Air Service and having been accepted he trained as an Observer joining Jasta 23. He saw action at the Battle of Verdun and the Somme.

He won the Iron Cross $1^{\text {st }}$ Class in December 1916 and also did his first solo flight that month, going on to pass his pilot's exam. He was assigned in March 1917 to his brother's squadron Jasta 11 where he shot down twenty planes within the first few weeks of being there, even being (falsely) credited by the German government with shooting down Albert Ball on $7^{\text {th }}$ May 1917.

He had been given command of the unit at the beginning of May 1917 while his brother Manfred went on leave; by $13^{\text {th }}$ May his downed plane total had become 24 . However, he received hip wounds from anti-aircraft guns that month and these injuries kept him out of commission for a few months so he did not return to command the unit until September 1917. He was hospitalized with a severe ear infection in early 1918 and returned to the unit in February but was there only a day before he was injured. He had been in a dog fight and was bringing in his disabled plane when he caught a high-tension wire which made him crash and he received serious head wounds. While still being hospitalized he learned of his brother Manfred's death on $21^{\text {st }}$ April 1918.

July 1918 saw Lothar returning to his squadron for the last time and in just over a month he raised his count to forty downed planes,
but in this perilous time of continual air dog fights he was again wounded on $13^{\text {th }}$ August 1918. After this injury he was never in combat again before the war came to an end in November 1918.

After the war he worked in varying fields, until early 1922 when he became a commercial pilot carrying mail and passengers to and from Berlin and Hamburg. On $4^{\text {th }}$ July 1922 he died in a flying accident when his engine failed.

Pour Le Merite Awarded $14^{\text {th }}$ May 1917 in recognition of his $24^{\text {th }}$ aerial victory.
