## Conditions of Business

The conditions of business, along with all other terms, conditions and notices set out in this auction catalogue, or announced by the auctioneer, form the terms on which Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. (JHA) contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship of purchase and sale of property by auction. It is therefore very important that you read these conditions carefully. By bidding or selling in this sale you agree to accept these conditions, and that these conditions shall govern all future dealings that may occur between you and JHA.
You should note that JHA generally acts as an agent for the seller. Any concluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer. You acknowledge that JHA is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to the items offered for sale. JHA can not and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers therefore have the responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as the nature of the items, which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw your attention to Conditions 23 through 28, which limit the extent to which the seller and JHA may be liable. We also draw to the attention of all sellers, their individual consignment receipt, incorporated herein, which sets out the relationship between the "seller" and JHA.

For the purposes of these conditions Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. is referred to as "JHA", "auctioneer", "us" or "we" and actual prospective buyers and sellers are, as applicable, referred to as "you" and "your", or "buyer" and "seller".

## Definitions of Terms:

The following terms, placed in quotation marks, shall have the meaning set out below:
(a) "buyer" means the person who makes the highest acceptable bid or that person's pre-authorized representative;
(b) "buyer's premium" means the commission on the "hammer price" payable to JHA at the rates listed in the auction catalogue, together with an amount in lieu of any taxes applicable to said commission;
(c) "hammer price" means the price at which an item is knocked down by the auctioneer to the "buyer" or, in the case of postal auctions, the agreed price; in both cases excluding the "buyer's premium";
(d) "seller" means the person or persons that have ownership of the merchandise offered. In the case of multiple ownership, each of the owners shall assume, jointly and severally, all obligations, liabilities, and representations, warranties, and indemnities as set forth in these Conditions of Business;
(e) "seller's commission" means the amount payable to JHA by the seller at the rates applicable at the date of the sale of the property or the date of loss or damage to the property, if applicable;
(f) "net sale proceeds" means the "hammer price" of the lot sold, less the "seller's commission" and "expenses";
(g) "expenses" as related to the sale of items at auction means, but not limited to, JHA's charges for insurance, collection, advertising, catalogue reproduction and photography, packing and shipping costs, research, taxes and or duties or charges for other services requested by the "seller" in conjunction with the sale.

## General Conditions:

1. For Canadian residents a $15 \%$ buyers commission, plus your province of residence's GST or HST as applicable, will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. For international buyers, only a $15 \%$ buyer's commission will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. These amounts are payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. Lots are not shipped until full payment is received.
2. We reserve the right to withdraw or combine any lot at our discretion.
3. In conformity with Canadian Law, no coin or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
4. JHA reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to exclude any bidder from participating in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate and at our sole discretion.
5. All bidders in any JHA auction expressly waive any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of JHA's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion, clerical error or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or bidder sheet.
6. No minors may participate in our sales.
7. If you make a bid at auction you do so as principal and will be held personally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations arising from the bid and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as their agent in the same way as if they were bidding personally. Agents should note that JHA's stated warranties apply only to the registered bidder to whom the lot is sold, and can not be extended to any undisclosed thirdparty. All agents are therefore advised to register their agency and principal with JHA prior to the sale. No exceptions will be granted.
8. Title to all lots remains with JHA until payment in full is received.
9. Sales tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.
10. Due to Canadian Heritage laws, some of the items in our auctions may require Export Licenses if the successful purchaser requires the lot to be taken or shipped out of Canada. JHA will assist the buyer in obtaining such licenses and complying with applicable Canadian Heritage laws.
11. By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the Auction House's entry of your bid, and that disputes concerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or non-payment, JHA may elect to proceed judicially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in the Courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attorney for collection, the buyer agrees to hold JHA harmless and indemnify for all costs of collection, including actual reasonable attorney's fees, with interest at $1.5 \%$ per month ( $18 \%$ p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
12. Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount due before the lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to, in writing, by the auctioneer. Please contact us in advance if you have any questions regarding your purchasing plans. First rate credit references or a $25 \%$ deposit are necessary to ensure entry of your bids. Any portion of such deposit not used will be promptly refunded after each sale.
13. Lot descriptions contained within the catalogue are statements of opinion only. All goods are offered with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in the catalogue are for identification only, and may be reduced or enlarged in size. To assist you, we may refer in a catalogue to particular faults or imperfections, but any such guidance, which we provide, does not purport to be exhaustive. You will be deemed to have knowledge of all matters which you could be reasonably expected to find out given your particular expertise
and the exercise by you of reasonable due diligence. The failure of any third party to concur with any statement of opinion shall not be grounds for the return of any lot under Conditions 24-26.
14. Bids for the auction will be accepted by Mail, or fax until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet.
15. No "buy" or "unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about $5 \%$ at the discretion of the auctioneer.
16. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, this includes percentage increases. Lots will open at the next interval over the second highest bidder, or $50 \%$ of the estimate whether reserved or not. Bids of less than $50 \%$ of estimate will not generally be accepted except at the sole discretion of the auctioneer. $z$
17. In the case of a tie mail bid, the first received will be given preference. In the case of a tie between a mail bidder and the floor, the mail bidder takes precedence. Fax bidders will be considered as mail bidders for the purposes of this clause.
18. Bidders are solely responsible for checking the accuracy of their bid sheets. JHA assumes no responsibility for errors in the amount bid or lot numbers listed on the bid sheet. Please be sure that your bid sheet is signed.
19. Postage, insurance, shipping and handling fees are added to ALLSHIPMENTS, the minimum being $\$ 10.00$. Bidders outside of Canada must supply detailed shipping instructions and agree to all terms as listed herein before shipment is made.
20. JHA may reopen the bidding on a lot under the following circumstances: (a) JHA has failed to correctly execute a mail bid;
(b) A party purchasing the lot on the floor has done so in error;
(c) Where a protest is made after the hammer has fallen but before bidding has commenced on the next lot;
(d) Where the auctioneer has determined that he has overlooked a party still bidding on the lot, but before the calling of the next lot; (e) At the discretion of the auctioneer.
21. In the event of a dispute, the auctioneer's decision is final.
22. Persons placing bids are responsible for meeting the maximum amounts represented on their bid sheets. JHA reserves the right to reject frivolous complaints and to take appropriate action against such bidders as defined in Conditions 4 and 11.
23. Floor bidders may not return any lots, including those purchased while acting as agents. Those persons bidding on the floor are deemed to have inspected the lots and satisfied themselves as to the lot's authenticity, description and condition. No exceptions will be made.
24. All claims for adjustments by non-floor bidders, for reasons of nonauthenticity must be made within 5 days of receipt of the goods, but in no case later than 28 days after a sale, as JHA acts as an agent for various consignors.
25. NO CLAIMS OF ANY KIND will be considered after settlements have beenmade. Failure of the bidder to execute this privilege within the 28 day time period, either from a failure to pay promptly or any other cause shall void the privilege. This privilege applies solely to the original purchaser and does not extend or transfer to any third party whatsoever. Any returned lot must be received in the condition it was sent out. Numismatic items must be returned in the original holder with the seal intact. Capricious returns will not be accepted.
26. If we are notified prior to the expiration of the 28 day period that the authenticity of a lot is in question, the matter will remain open until such time that the lot in question is proven to be non-authentic to our reasonable opinion. Buyers shall be required to submit generally accepted references in support of their position. The buyer agrees that any claim shall be limited to the "hammer price" and the "buyer's premium" actually paid to JHA with regard to that lot. The buyer further agrees that the dispute may, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, be submitted to a third party expert of the auctioneer's choosing, whose decision shall be final.
27. No price adjustments will be made to the hammer price of a lot whether there is an authenticity question about the whole lot or any one item within the lot. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made.
28. Third party graded coins including but not limited to ICCS, PCGS and NCG cannot be returned for grading disagreement. They are sold as is. Any discrepancies in the grade should be taken up with the appropriate grading company.
29. Terms for this sale are strictly cash and must be paid promptly in Canadian funds. Payments should be made immediately on receipt of the invoice. Payments from foreign accounts must be made in the form of a Canadian Dollar Bank Draft.
30. As a convenience, invoices may be charged to Visa and MasterCard accounts. Please supply account number, signature and expiration date at the bottom of your bid sheet. Please note that there will be an additional service charge of $2 \%$ for using a charge card.

The following lots consist of coin savings banks issued by Canadian financial institutions. Some date back to circa 1900, while others are more modern. No official grading system for coin banks has been established, so we will endeavour to describe with some detail. Personal viewing is recommended where possible. ## Wief Of The Council Of Huron Indians Of Lorette, Lower Canada.



The Hurons had acted as guides for the British during the war and some received the 1814 Medal.
In late 1824, four chiefs of the Lorette Hurons set off for England to petition the crown to stop the encroachment of settlers on their land. Chief Aharathaha being one of them. They secured an audience with George IV in 1825, who presented each of them with his Coronation Medal at that time.

That same year Aharathaha met John Garrett the Lord Mayor of London who gave him a Silver Medal commemorating the laying of the first stone for the construction of the new London Bridge.

In October 1826 Edmund Kean while in Quebec met four Indian Chiefs and presented Silver Medals named to each of them, one of these chiefs being Aharathaha. In return, he was received into the Huron tribe and given the name Alanienouidet and was apparently given a Huron costume.

James Elmslie Walker was born on $4^{\text {th }}$ April 1919 in Claresholm, Alberta. He enlisted into the RCAF on $10^{\text {th }}$ May 1940, becoming a Pilot Officer in December 1940. After arriving overseas he was posted to 81 Squadron in August 1941, becoming part of 151 Wing that was sent to Murmansk, Russia to teach the Soviets to fly Hurricanes. During the wing's three months stay they shot down sixteen German aircraft, of which he was credited with a twin-engine Junkers 88 bomber. Returning to England 81 Squadron converted to Spitfires and on $2^{\text {nd }}$ June 1942 Walker was credited with a kill over Le Touquet of a Focke-Wulf 190 fighter. In October the unit was transferred to Gibraltar to take part in Operation Torch, the Allied invasion of North Africa. While there he shot down a JU88 and a FW190. He was made a Squadron leader in March 1943 and the CO of 243 Squadron RAF. In March 1944 he was appointed wing leader of the newly formed 144 RCAF Wing. He was killed in a flying accident on $25^{\text {th }}$ April 1944 at age 25.

## Fort Detroit - 19 July, 1812

The United States declared war on Britain on June 19, 1812. Word of the opening of hostilities reached Fort Amherstburg a few days later. On June 22, the commander of the Fort, a Lt. Colonel St. George, noticed the American Schooner "Cuyahoga" heading for Detroit with supplies and some sick troops from American General William Hill's, Northwest Army. As the schooner passed the fort, a mixed force of provincial marines and soldiers rowed out and intercepted the ship, forcing the Americans, who were unaware of the War declaration to heave to. The capture of the Cuyahoga resulted in the Canadians gaining possession of General Hill's papers, which revealed plans for an American campaign against Fort Amherstburg.

To oppose this prospective threat, St. George had a small mixed force of British Regulars, Canadian Militia and a number of native Indians. On July 11th 1812, 2,500 American troops of General Hill's Northwest Army reached the Detroit River and camped at Fort Detroit. The following day, Hull's forces crossed the Detroit River near Sandwich, approximately 35 km north of Amherstburg. Faced with a larger force, the Essex Militia stationed at Sandwich scattered, allowing the American forces to consolidate a foothold on Canadian soil. Hull set up his headquarters in a local farmhouse and proceeded to print and distribute a proclamation to Canadians in the area. It read, in part:

## "INHABITANTS OF CANADA

After thirty years of peace and prosperity, the United States have been driven to arms. The injuries and aggressions, the insults and indignities of Great Britain have once more left no alternative but manly resistance or unconditional submission. The army under my command has invaded your country. The standard of the union now waves over the territory of Canada. To the peaceful and unoffending inhabitants it brings neither danger nor difficulty. I come to find enemies, not to make them; I come to protect not to injure you ... I have a force which will break down all opposition, and that force is but the vanguard of a much greater. If, contrary to your own interest, and the just expectations of my country, you should take part in the approaching contest, you will be considered and treated as enemies, and the horrors and calamities of war will stalk you ...

Hull's ultimatum quickly spread throughout the county, with newspapers portraying the ultimatum as a choice between surrender and extermination. To counter this invasion, the British commander, Major General Brock assembled a force of British regulars, consisting of the $41^{\text {st }}$ Regiment of Foot and the Royal Newfoundland Fencible Infantry. Brock also asked for volunteers from the various units of Canadian Militia that were in the area, intending to use them as skirmishers in support of his regular troops.

Brock's relief force arrived at Fort Amherstburg on August 15, 1812, after assessing the situation; he ordered his forces to advance on Fort Detroit the following day. The British regulars, Canadian militiamen and Indians advanced on Detroit while the guns of Fort Amherstburg fired a barrage of artillery shells. Possibly unnerved by the sights and sounds of the advancing forces, General Hill quickly agreed to surrender which resulted in the capture of several cannon, numerous muskets and supplies, all of which were used to equip and supply the Canadian Militia and the Native allies.

## =ILASSIC CANADIAN BATTLES OF THE WAR OF 1812

## Chateauguay - 26 October, 1813

In late 1813, the American plans included launching and offensive with the intent of capturing the Canadian strongpoint of Montreal, thereby cutting off the supply lines to Upper Canada. An American army of 2,600 men under the command of Major General Wade Hampton, crossed the Canadian border on 21st October and set up camp. On the $25^{\text {th }}$. Hampton began to move his force down river towards the British lines under the command of Lieutenant Colonel Charles De Salaberry. The British were arrayed in four lines across the road running beside the Chateauguay River, the front line being an abatis of downed trees. Here De Salaberry posted the Light Company of Canadian Fencibles, two companies of Canadian Voltigeurs and an elite company of Beauharnois Militia together with some Mohawk Indians. This front line consisted of approximately 300 men. A further 160 Militia were posted on the far bank of the river. The rest of De Salaberry's forces were spread across the subsequent defensive positions between the abatis and the river crossing known as Grant's Ford behind which the main British force (approximately 1,100 men and 200 Seven Nations warriors) was stationed.

Late that evening, Hampton decided to send 1000 men under Lieutenant Colonel Purdy along the east bank of the river with the intent to capture the ford and encircle the British positions. After moving through the woods all night, Purdy encountered the $3^{\text {rd }}$ Select Embodied Militia who had been detailed to guard the ford. The militia mounted an immediate attack, while other Canadian units engaged from across the river, resulting in Purdy's force being driven back in disorder.

Hampton had also moved his main force towards De Salaberry's position at the abatis, with the two forces exchanging heavy fire. The Canadian Fencibles who had been in front of the abatis now retired behind it. Seeing this, Hampton's men thought that victory was imminent. De Salaberry brought up reinforcements who arrived with bugle calls, cheers and Indian war cries. At about this time, Purdy's force was retreating on the opposite side of the river. Hampton, fearing a larger British force was about to engage, ordered a retreat, effectively ending the battle.
