## Conditions of Business

The conditions of business, along with all other terms, conditions and notices set out in this auction catalogue, or announced by the auctioneer, form the terms on which Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. ( $\mathrm{H} A)$ contracts, as auctioneer, with actual and prospective sellers and buyers. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship of purchase and sale of property by auction. It is therefore very important that you read these conditions carefully. By bidding or selling in this sale you agree to accept these conditions, and that these conditions shall govern all future dealings that may occur between you and JHA.

You should note that JHA generally acts as an agent for the seller. Any concluded contract of sale is made directly between the seller and the buyer. You acknowledge that JHA is dependent on the seller for much of the relevant factual material pertaining to the items offered for sale. JHA can not and does not undertake full due diligence on every item sold. Buyers therefore have the responsibility to carry out their own inspection and investigations to satisfy themselves as the nature of the items, which they are interested in buying. We specifically draw your attention to Conditions 23 through 28 , which limit the extent to which the seller and JHA may be liable. We also draw to the attention of all sellers, their individual consignment receipt, incorporated herein, which sets out the relationship between the "seller" and JHA.

For the purposes of these conditions Jeffrey Hoare Auctions, Inc. is referred to as "JHA", "auctioneer", "us" or "we" and actual prospective buyers and sellers are, as applicable, referred to as "you" and "your", or "buyer" and "seller".

## Definitions of Terms:

The following terms, placed in quotation marks, shall have the meaning set out below:
(a) "buyer" means the person who makes the highest acceptable bid or that person's pre-authorized representative;
(b) "buyer's premium" means the commission on the "hammer price" payable to JHA at the rates listed in the auction catalogue, together with an amount in lieu of any taxes applicable to said commission;
(c) "hammer price" means the price at which an item is knocked down by the auctioneer to the "buyer" or, in the case of postal auctions, the agreed price; in both cases excluding the "buyer's premium";
(d) "seller" means the person or persons that have ownership of the merchandise offered. In the case of multiple ownership, each of the owners shall assume, jointly and severally, all obligations, liabilities, and representations, warranties, and indemnities as set forth in these Conditions of Business;
(e) "seller's commission" means the amount payable to JHA by the seller at the rates applicable at the date of the sale of the property or the date of loss or damage to the property, if applicable;
(f) "net sale proceeds" means the "hammer price" of the lot sold, less the "seller's commission" and "expenses";
(g) "expenses" as related to the sale of items at auction means, but not limited to, JHA's charges for insurance, collection, advertising, catalogue reproduction and photography, packing and shipping costs, research, taxes and or duties or charges for other services requested by the "seller" in conjunction with the sale.

## General Conditions:

1. For Canadian residents a $12.5 \%$ buyers commission, plus $5 \%$ GST or $13 \%$ HST, where applicable, will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. Residents of Ontario will be subject to an additional $8 \%$ provincial tax. For international buyers only an $12.5 \%$ buyer's commission will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased. These amounts are payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. Lots are not shipped until full payment is received.
2. We reserve the right to withdraw or combine any lot at our discretion.
3. In conformity with Canadian Law, no coin or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
4. JHA reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to exclude any bidder from participating in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate and at our sole discretion.
5. All bidders in any JHA auction expressly waive any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of JHA's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion, clerical error or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or bidder sheet.
6. No minors may participate in our sales.
7. If you make a bid at auction you do so as principal and will be held personally and solely liable for that bid unless we have previously agreed with you in writing that you do so on behalf of an identified third party who is acceptable to us. In circumstances where we have so agreed, both you and the third party will be jointly and severally liable for all obligations arising from the bid and the third party shall be bound by the Conditions of Business by your bidding as their agent in the same way as if they were bidding personally. Agents should note that JHA's stated warranties apply only to the registered bidder to whom the lot is sold, and can not be extended to any undisclosed thirdparty. All agents are therefore advised to register their agency and principal with JHA prior to the sale. No exceptions will be granted.
8. Title to all lots remains with JHA until payment in full is received.
9. Sales tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.
10. Due to Canadian Heritage laws, some of the items in our auctions may require Export Licenses if the successful purchaser requires the lot to be taken or shipped out of Canada. JHA will assist the buyer in obtaining such licenses and complying with applicable Canadian Heritage laws.
11. By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the Auction House's entry of your bid, and that disputes concerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or non-payment, JHA may elect to proceed judicially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in the Courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attomey for collection, the buyer agrees to hold JHA harmless and indemnify for all costs of collection, including actual reasonable attorney's fees, with interest at $1.5 \%$ per month ( $18 \%$ p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
12. Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount due before the lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to, in writing, by the auctioneer. Please contact us in advance if you have any questions regarding your purchasing plans. First rate credit references or a $25 \%$ deposit are necessary to ensure entry of your bids. Any portion of such deposit not used will be promptly refunded after each sale.
13. Lot descriptions contained within the catalogue are statements of opinion only. All goods are offered with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in the catalogue are for identification only, and may be reduced or enlarged in size. To assist you, we may refer in a catalogue to particular faults or imperfections, but any such guidance, which we provide, does not purport to be exhaustive. You will be deemed to have knowledge of all matters which you could be reasonably expected to find out given your particular expertise and the exercise by you of reasonable due diligence. The failure of any third party to concur with any statement of opinion shall not be grounds for the return of any lot under Conditions 24-26.
14. Bids for the auction will be accepted by Mail, or fax until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet.
15. No "buy" or "unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about $5 \%$ at the discretion of the auctioneer.
16. All bids must be in whole dollar amounts, this includes percentage increases. Lots will open at the next interval over the second highest bidder, or $50 \%$ of the estimate whether reserved or not. Bids of less than $50 \%$ of estimate will not generally be accepted except at the sole discretion of the auctioneerz
17. In the case of a tie mail bid, the first received will be given preference. In the case of a tie between a mail bidder and the floor, the mail bidder takes precedence. Fax bidders will be considered as mail bidders for the purposes of this clause.

24. All claims for adjustments by non-floor bidders, for reasons of nonauthenticity must be made within 5 days of receipt of the goods, but in no case later than 28 days after a sale, as JHA acts as an agent for various consignors.
25. NO CLAIMS OF ANY KIND will be considered after settlements have beenmade. Failure of the bidder to execute this privilege within the 28 day time period, either from a failure to pay promptly or any other cause shall void the privilege. This privilege applies solely to the original purchaser and does not extend or transfer to any third party whatsoever. Any returned lot must be received in the condition it was sent out. Numismatic items must be returned in the original holder with the seal intact. Capricious returns will not be accepted.
26. If we are notified prior to the expiration of the 28 day period that the authenticity of a lot is in question, the matter will remain open until such time that the lot in question is proven to be non-authentic to our reasonable opinion. Buyers shall be required to submit generally accepted references in support of their position. The buyer agrees that any claim shall be limited to the "hammer price" and the "buyer's premium" actually paid to JHA with regard to that lot. The buyer further agrees that the dispute may, at the sole discretion of the auctioneer, be submitted to a third party expert of the auctioneer's choosing, whose decision shall be final.
27. No price adjustments will be made to the hammer price of a lot whether there is an authenticity question about the whole lot or any one item within the lot. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made.
28. Third party graded coins including but not limited to ICCS, PCGS and NCG cannot be returned for grading disagreement. They are sold as is. Any discrepancies in the grade should be taken up with the appropriate grading company.
29. Terms for this sale are strictly cash and must be paid promptly in Canadian funds. Payments should be made immediately on receipt of the invoice. Payments from foreign accounts must be made in the form of a Canadian Dollar Bank Draft.
30. As a convenience, invoices may be charged to Visa and MasterCard accounts. Please supply account number, signature and expiration date at the bottom of your bid sheet. Please note that there will be an additional service charge of $2 \%$ for using a charge card.

As a young lad growing up in a small southern Ontario town (Millbrook) during the depression years George sought out odd jobs and chores after school and on weekends in order to assist his family and save for his future education. One of his regular clients did not often have funds to pay George for his assistance so he paid "in coin". He was a numismatist who had travelled to many places collecting coins as he visited foreign lands. He sparked in George a lifelong interest in coins and the history of countries attached to them.

After completing his Grade 13, George attended Peterborough Normal School earning his first class teaching certificate and began teaching in 1935 for the princely sum of $\$ 500.00$ per annum!! In spite of the small salary, George continued to purchase, trade coins as opportunity presented itself. Initially he acquired only Canadian coins. He eventually completed his B.A., extramurally from the University of Western Ontario. He married and was teaching in Windsor, Ontario when the 1939-1945 War broke out and like many others of his generation he joined the Armed Forces in the RCNVR as a Sub.-Lieutenant. The war years were spent in Ontario, the east coast in Halifax and Cornwallis, Nova Scotia and service in the minesweeper, Mahone Bay. Along the way he met many people including a few who shared his interest in numismatics. During these years he added to the Canadian content of his collection. In 1946, he transferred to the RCN and for the next 21 years he experienced a varied and interesting career. Serving on both the east and west coasts and in England, George continued to add to his coin collection. His children attest to the fact that no one could put change in their pockets without first checking the date on the coins to see if they were on Dad's "wish to own" list! Wherever he lived he was a familiar face at the local banks often doing a Friday night run after work to pick up any old or specified coins that George wished to add to his collection that the tellers had set aside for him during the week. He was most interested in Canadian and Newfoundland coins trying over the years to complete a full collection showing each piece. He also collected medals, tokens - especially the church communion tokens of the Maritimes. Eventually his collection became more world wide as he picked up coins in many ports of call during his navy career and in his travels after his second retirement as a high school teacher in Victoria, BC. He corresponded with his numismatic contacts in Great Britain, the US, and Europe and all over Canada and visited with many during his travels.
George was an early member of the Canadian Numismatic Association eventually attaining his 50 year membership certificate. He was an attendee at many numismatic conventions including the 1968 Calgary show in which he entered his Maritime communion token display. He was also a very active and early member of the local numismatic society in Victoria, BC. As chairman of the Medal Committee for the Centenary of the Union of the Colonies - 1866-1966 medal George wrote "The Victoria Numismatic Society, being not unmindful of the need to record for future generations the history of our own civilization has in the past 8 years struck three medals to commemorate significant events in BC history, viz:the Centenary of the Colony of BC 1858-1958, the Centenary of the City of Victoria 1862-1962 and the Union of the Colonies 1866-1966." He was still much involved in the organization when the Centenary of BC into Confederation Medal 1871-1971 was struck. George was very proud of the contributions of the club.

George loved to expound passionately on the topic of coin collecting and presented many education sessions to service clubs, schools and other groups. George enjoyed spending time with his collection during his lifetime and appreciated "the story of the coins that show how nations multiply and grow" (A. Heaton) and how the world and its' currencies change over time.

Only twelve CGMs were issued to the RCAF and only two Canadians were awarded this medal combination during World War Two.


Distinguished Flying Cross, London Gazette: 17 November, 1944:
Since the award of the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal, Pilot Officer Meek has completed many sorties against targets in Germany, including four on Berlin. His outstanding technical skill, exceptional, efficient and gallant fortitude have won the admiration of all members of his squadron.

Air 2/8827 contains the original recommendation for the DFC dated 1 August 1944 when he had flown 28 sorties ( 144 hours 50 minutes), 16 December 1943 to 6 July 1944. The contrast between the final published citation (above) and the recommendation (below) is notable:

Pilot Officer Meek, a Canadian, is a Navigator who has carried out 28 operational flights against the enemy. Since the award of the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal in February 1944 he has done 22 operational flights, many of them against such distant and heavily defended targets as Berlin, Magdeburg and Friedrichshaven, the enemy capital city having been his targets on four occasions.

Pilot Officer Meek has at all times carried out his duties in a most exemplary manner, his work being of the highest order under the strongest opposition the enemy could muster. His cool, quiet disregard of personal safety and the efficiency with which he navigated his aircraft inspired his crew to the highest standard of morale they achieved, and ensured a maximum safety for his aircraft and crew.

I strongly recommend that the gallantry displayed by this officer, coupled with the high order of his technical achievements, which were an inspiration not only to his crew but to all the navigators in the squadron, be recognized by the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Conspicuous Gallantry Medal (Flying) London Gazette 22 February 1944: (Joint citation with Flying Officer William Breckenridge and Pilot Officer William Baker):
"F/O William Scott Breckenridge, PIO William Benjamin Baker (both RAFVR) and WO Meek were pilot, mid-upper gunner and navigator respectively in an aircraft detailed to attack Berlin one night in January 1944. Whilst over the target area, the aircraft was hit by bullets from a fighter. Much damage was sustained. The wireless operator was killed and the rear-gunner wounded: P/O Baker was also wounded, being hit in the face and rendered unconscious. Nevertheless, F/O Breckenridge evaded the attacker and displaying great determination, resumed his bombing run and successfully attacked the target.
Almost immediately the bomber was again hit by machine-gun fire from the enemy aircraft which had closed in. This time W.O. Meek was severely wounded. A bullet penetrated his breast close to the heart and another hit him in the shoulder.


Coolly and skillfully, FIO Breckenridge manoetwred his badly damaged aircraft, however, and finally evaded the attacker. By now, PIO Baker had recovered consciousness and realized that the aircraft was unprotected, immediately made his way to the rear turret and manned it. In spite of his physical suffering, the intense cold and the lack of oxygen, PIO Baker remained in the turret throughout the homeward flight, except for a short time when he left it to extinguish a fire which had commenced. Meanwhile, WO Meek, although desperately wounded and suffering intensely, refused to leave his post. Although deprived of practically all his navigational equipment, he plotted the route home with great skill. Eventually, F/O Breckenridge reached base where he effected a successful crash landing. His skill, courage and coolness in the face of heavy odds were worthy of the highest praise. PIO Baker and wo Meek proved themselves to be valiant members of aircraft crew, displaying great courage, fortitude and devotion to duty. In spite of their injuries and much suffering, they did all that was possible to assist the safe return of the aircraft". (Meek awarded the CGM; Breckenridge and Baker the DFC).

Richard Jack Meek DFC, CGM, CD was born in 1908 at Vancouver, British Columbia and on November 11, 1941, enlisted in the RCAF there. After receiving air crew instruction he graduated from No. 5. Air Observer School (AOS) on October 23, 1942. He arrived overseas in the UK in December 1942. After receiving additional training at No. 6 AOS at Jurby, Isle of Man and at No. 28 Operational Training Unit at Wymeswold, in Leicestershire, he was posted to No. 626 Squadron, a Lancaster unit operating out of Wickenby. Meek participated in a pair of operations on Berlin in December 1943, while in January 1944 sorties were flown to Brunswick and Magdeburg, in addition to a couple of return trips to Berlin. It was on the second of these, on the night of $30-31$ January, that Richard Jack Meek was to win the CGM. Garbett and Goulding take up the story in The Lancaster at War:
"As P./O. Bill Breckenridge of 626 Squadron and his crew set course for Berlin in Lancaster BI, ME584 UM-Y, in the gathering dusk of january 30 1944, a life-and-death struggle lay but a few hours ahead.

The crew comprised three Scotsmen, three Canadians and an Englishman. This was their sixth trip together and already they had been to Berlin three times, besides Brunswick and Magdeburg for variety.

It was a pleasant evening with little cloud, which suited the Canadian navigator, Jack Meek. He was able to get several accurate winds with their direction and strength

They had no trouble getting to the target. Some combats were seen as they came in from the north and swung in, well on time, at 20,000 feet. There was plenty of flak and the low clouds, with tops to about 8,000 feet, were lit up by searchlights.

They had settled on the bombing run when suddenly an unseen fighter attacked at close range, perhaps 200 yards, on the starboard side. The kite shuddered as shells tore into the metal, making a terrific din, so loud it could be heard above the engines.
The mid-upper gunner was smashed and 'Biff' Baker, the Englishman, a keen amateur boxer, was hit on the side of the face, his helmet and oxygen mask torn away. The rear turret was badly holed and the Canadian, Joe Schwartz, severely wounded by a piece of exploding shrapnel in his foot. Both he and 'Biff' Baker soon lapsed into unconsciousness. The intercom to the rear end was u/s so those forward did not know what was happening aft.


Bill, the skipper, took immediate evasive action, diving to starboard. On recovering, he again levelled out on the bombing run and Val Poushinsky, the Canadian bomb aimer, dropped the load on the estimated position of the markers before the attack.

A minute later they were again attacked, perhaps by the same fighter, but this time from the port quarter, and at 400 yards. With his two gunners out cold, though he did not know it, the skipper had no warning but dived to port on observing the first tracers coming in.

The kite was pitching around all over the place as the skipper tried everything he knew to shake off the fighter. The navigator, crouched down behind the skipper, was doubled up from hits and instinctively grabbed his chute before passing out.

Things were certainly happening fast. They could not shake off the searchlights or flak, let alone the fighter. It was a madhouse, with the terrific noise of exploding shells and screaming engines.

After a further two minutes, the fighter found them again. He closed in from the starboard quarter, at 400 yards, and let forth yet another devastating barrage. This time the skipper was hit, a passing bullet grazing his legs.

The original course was resumed from the target area after further violent manoeuvres, but three minutes later came the fourth attack. Again they were hit but the range was now about 500 yards.

By the time the fighter was shaken off, their height was down to 15,000 feet. No further attacks came as the skipper, completely unflurried and flying his battered kite as if on a cross-country trip, got away from the area as fast as possible.
Slowly the crew began to recover. Jimmy, the wireless op, was found slumped over his set. He was warm but unconscious, so he was given first aid. Not until they landed would they know he was past help.

Jack Meek regained consciousness to discover that he had two wounds. One was in his shoulder. The other was caused by shrapnel which went clean through his middle, entering at the right side of his back and emerging at the left front, just below his chest, missing his heart by inches. Though he knew he was badly hit, he would not know the full extent of his injuries until they landed.
'Biff' Baker and Joe Schwartz also revived. The latter extracted himself from his turret, crawled up the fuselage to the rest-bed, but again collapsed. Val Poushinsky rendered first aid to both Schwartz and Meek before taking up position in the astrodome. Meanwhile, 'Biff' Baker clambered into the stillserviceable rear turret, even though he was injured and without oxygen.
To make matters worse, the rear fuselage began to fill with smoke soon after leaving the target area. Alex Stephenson, the engineer, went aft and put out the fire.
The kite was in a fearful state. The hydraulic system had been shot away. The bomb doors would not close, nor, as they found later, would the wheels lower. One petrol tank was holed, three rev counters and three boost gauges useless, as were the direction finder and gyro-compass. The elevators and rudders were also badly damaged.
Jack Meek's navigational gear was wrecked, but accurate data on the winds on the route-in now came in handy. All he could do was dead reckon on these, but in reverse. He could not hold up the sextant for his left arm kept dropping down, finally becoming completely useless.
Luckily, his figures were good for they took them right back on track. He also took observation of landmarks he knew. When he saw searchlights or flak over German territory he would say to the skipper, "That's Hanover. Go so many minutes in such a direction then bear so much west." Two hours after leaving Berlin he was able to get a Gee fix despite feeling lightheaded from loss of blood and lack of oxygen. They were now over Zuider Zee and only three miles off track.


The open bomb doors caused a lot of drag and the skipper could not get much speed, though he did manage to hold altitude. All were chilled through, due to the many gaping holes, while the lack of oxygen was taking its toll.

Over the North Sea the electrical system caught fire, but the mid-upper gunner and flight engineer succeeded in extinguishing the fire after a short, fierce battle.

Thirty miles from the English coast the Gee packed up. A distress signal was sent homing them in to Docking, on the Norfolk coast. A crash-landing was inevitable. The wheels would not come down, as the air pressure was blown away, and frantic efforts by the skipper and engineer resisted all attempts to unlock them.

With the crew at crash positions, the skipper brought the kite in, but she was
difficult to control and he had to overshoot. On the second attempt, he brought her in like a baby, ran forward on the tailwheel, nose well up, then slowed. The open bomb doors hit the ground, snapped shut, and suddenly all was quiet. They were down. There was no fire."

After recovering from his injuries Meek continued his tour of operations, being awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross in November 1944, making him one of only two Canadian recipients of the DFC. CGM combination. Following his release from the RCAF at the end of hostilities, Meek worked with the Department of Indian Affairs at Whitehorse, Lytton and Vancouver until his retirement in 1972. Meek was an active musician and sportsman. He was also the author of a wide range of Masonic topics as well as extensive works on the history of British Columbia. Meek River and Meek Lake in Northern British Columbia are named for him. Richard Jack Meek passed away in his home town of Vancouver on January $8^{\text {th }}$, 1995.

R. H. Meek is the father of Flying Officer Richard Jack Meek, DFC, CGM, CD whose medals are presented in the previous lot.

## Military Cross recommendation:

"Captain Munro has served continuously with 5 Canadian Light Anti-Aircraft Regiment since December 1941. In addition during the past year he has also served the personnel of 4 Canadian Anti-Tank Regiment. During the battles of the Hitler Lines, Gothic Line and PO Valley, he demonstrated outstanding faithfulness to duty in his constant visits to the men of both regiments. These trips were often made under enemy shell fire and, at times his visits could be made only under cover of darkness. On $4^{\text {th }}$ September 1944, five men were killed and one wounded when an enemy shell made a direct hit on a light Anti-Aircraft gun. Captain Munro immediately went to the area and despite continued enemy shelling, conducted a burial service for the dead, aided in the evacuation of the wounded and brought comfort to those who were left to man the site. During the battle of the Coriano Ridge, forward Anti-Tank and Anti-Aircraft troops were under continuous enemy shell fire and small arms fire. Through this period Captain Munro constantly visited these men, inspiring them with his cheerfulness. On $14^{\text {th }}$ September 1944 , he went forward after dark in an attempt to recover and bury the body of an anti-tank gunner. Although he was unable to reach the body that night, he searched for it with complete disregard for the intense enemy fire. Just after the crossing of the Lamone River he was wounded while visiting forward troops. This Officer has continually gone far beyond his call of duty to ensure a decent burial for his men and to bring spiritual comfort to those in places of danger. Throughout his time of service with these regiments, he has been tireless in his efforts to help men with their personal problems and his own example has been an inspiration to all with whom he has come in contact"

James Alan Munro was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba on $7^{\text {th }}$ July 1898. He received his early education in Saskatoon, following on with a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Saskatoon in 1928. He then attended Knox College in Toronto, graduating with a DD in 1931. After graduation he served as Minister at the Presbyterian Church in Rosewood, Saskatoon until 1937 when he accepted a post at Cooke's Presbyterian Church in Chilliwack, British Columbia. He served there until enlisting in the Canadian Army Chaplains Service at Vancouver in 1940. He was later assigned for overseas duty with 5 Canadian Light Anti-Aircraft Regiment in December 1941, serving throughout the Central Mediterranean Area and Northwest Europe. After his discharge in 1946 with the Honourary rank of Lieutenant Colonel, he returned to his duties with the church. He died in 1972.

Benjamin William O'Connor was born on $5^{\text {th }}$ June 1917, in Kimberley, South Africa and he joined the Union of South Africa Defence Force on $20^{\text {th }}$ June 1940.

"For individual acts of bravery whilst under heavy enemy fire. During the night 23/24 Oct 42, whilst taking part in an attack upon an enemy posn, the Pl to which Pte. O'Connor belonged sustained heavy casualties both in killed and wounded, during an assault which brought them within 50 yds of the enemy post.

The intensity of the enemy Mortar and M.G. fire caused the Pl to withdraw 20 yds , and it was then possible to bring back all the wounded men.
After new posns had been taken up, Pte.O'Connor, with complete disregard for his own safety, went back to the enemy wire under heavy enemy fire directed against him, and brought back a seriously wounded man, who had been lying 30 yds from an enemy M.G. pos.

He returned a second time and brought back another wounded man, all the time exposing himself to M.G. fire, but showing unwavering courage. Had it not been for these individual acts of gallantry on his part, the two wounded men would most assuredly have been killed. He later became a POW and was in Stralag A- Moosburg (Isar).
