


During the 19th century, transportation companies offering passenger and freight service often issued tokens to facilitate payment and discourage theft. The selection featured on this month's cover (see illustration next page) is a token issued by the Halifax Steam Boat Company, a firm that operated a ferry service between Halifax and Dartmouth, Nova Scotia from 1817 to 1890.

Little is known about this ferry token. Its existence was not recorded until 1878 when a puzzled collector appealed to a numismatic journal for information. Company records make no mention of provisions for its production and use, so even the date of issue and exact use are open to speculation. Rolls of tokens have been found in original wrappers dated as early as 1846, but the only discovery of a significant quantity was in the late 1880's when a large hoard was uncovered during the demolition of one of the company's offices. It would appear then that the tokens were produced early in the company's history, but were not widely distributed. Two possibilities have been proposed to explain the apparently restricted use of these tokens. First, it has been suggested that the company's directors were not pleased with the design of the ship that appears on the token as it bore no resemblance to the ferries actually used by the company. Another possibility is that because of changes in the laws governing the distribution of private tokens, the firm was unable to distribute them in quantity.

The token, which bears no denomination, is made of copper and is about the size of a Canadian one-cent piece. It forms part of the National Currency Collection, Bank of Canada. Photography by James Zagon, Ottawa.

### 1986 A.P.N.A. FALL RALLY MEDALS

The Prince Edward Island Numismatic Association is pleased to announce the minting of the A.P.N.A. Fall Rally 1986 Commemorative Medal to be released at the A.P.N.A. Fall Rally in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island at the Charlottetown Hotel, Kent Street, on October 4-5, 1986.

The obverse depicts the "S.S. Charlottetown", a car ferry steamer, which once plied the waters of the Northumberland Strait between New Brunswick and P.E.I. This ship was the very top of her line when she was launched in 1931 at a cost of 2.25 million. Unfortunately, she struck a reef and sank in 1941. As the ferry boats are a vital link with the mainland the Rally is in Charlottetown we want to revive the memory of this fine ship. The reverse side shows a full size official crest of the Atlantic Provinces Numismatic Association. Our thanks to the Halifax Coin Club for the use of this die.

The medals are being struck by Pressed Metal Products of Vancouver, B.C. The striking will be limited to 100 medals only of antique Bronze finish. The medals are being offered for \$7.50 plus \$2.50 for postage and shipping. If registration is requested, an additional \$3.00 is required.

Paid in advance orders will be accepted up to August 31, 1986 for .999 pure silver medals at \$32.00 each for shipment by first class mail. If registration is requested, an additional \$3.00 is required.

You may use the convenient order form on the next page to place your order for these A.P.N.A. Medals. Orders will be filled in order of receipt of payment until the 100 medals are sold. They should be available for delivery at the Fall Rally. Pure .999 silver medals will only be ordered from the Mint on a fully prepaid basis and if not available at the Rally will be sent to you at a later date when received.
