### TERMS OF SALE

1. Auction lots will be available for viewing at the designated tables at the Toronto International Coin Fair from 10:00 a.m. Friday, 9th November 1984. Arrangements may be made by view at our Bank, by appointment, prior to the auction.
2. Bids may be made in person at the auction, by mail or by telephone. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. Mail and telephone bids must reach us in Ottawa by **Wednesday, November 7th, 1984**. Answering service is available to take bids (24 hours) at 1-613-235-1916. If there are identical bids, the earliest received shall take priority.
3. **There is no "buyer's premium" in our auctions.**
4. For mail and telephone bidders, we will attempt to obtain lots as cheaply as possible by the following method: bids over estimate will be reduced to the estimate, or to 10% over the second highest bid, whichever amount is greater, and will then be increased against floor bids (if any) to the limit stated. Bids below estimate are quite in order, but will not be reduced. **Bids below 50% of the estimate are respectfully declined**, except that the large and bulky lots at the end of the auction may be offered without reserve to floor bidders at the discretion of the auctioneers.
5. Estimates represent our best professional opinion of what lots are likely to sell for on the open market. Most lots sell for between 70% and 120% of estimate. With a bid of 70% of estimate you have a fair chance of succeeding: with a bid of 120% you will be very likely to succeed.
6. Unlimited or "buy" bids are accepted, provided that the auctioneers have complete discretion.
7. Floor bidding, and calculation of the results of this auction, will be carried out in Canadian dollars. Bids expressed in other currencies will be converted to Canadian dollars at the applicable rate. Bids from customers with U.S. addresses, sent by mail or telephone, will be presumed to be in U.S. funds unless indication is made to the contrary.
8. Mail bidders may return incorrectly described or misattributed lots for full credit within 15 days of the sale. There is no return privilege on books, except with our prior permission in writing. As consignors must be paid, late remittance may be cause to negate return privileges. **ALL FLOOR SALES ARE FINAL**, and no returns will be accepted from floor bidders (including those acting as agents for others) for any reason whatsoever.
9. Title to all lots remains with the auctioneer until paid for in full, but they are held at the risk of the purchaser once the hammer has fallen.
10. **Please check your bid sheet carefully.** While we cheerfully correct our errors, we cannot be responsible for the mistakes of others.
11. Successful mail bidders may pay by money order, check, VISA or MASTERCHARGE. A 3% handling charge will be added to all credit card payments.
12. For floor bidders, terms are strictly CASH unless prior arrangements have been made to the contrary.
13. All floor bidder accounts must be paid at the auction unless prior arrangements have been made. Mail and telephone accounts are due immediately. Interest at the rate of 2% per month is charged on all overdue accounts.

Clients will note the conspicuous absence of estimates in this section. The coins offered here are so fabulous, so rare, that it is virtually impossible to estimate their true value. The marketplace will decide. You may wish to consult Canadian Trends or the Charlton catalog for an estimate of what mere BU-63 examples of these coins might reasonably be expected to bring. Please, mail bidders, do not waste our time or yours by submitting ridiculous bids on these lots. Floor competition will be intense and, though we will make every effort to accommodate serious mail bidders, by far the most sensible way to consider acquiring these coins will be by viewing them and attending the auction in Toronto.

1. **Specimen One Cent 1872H.** The plate coin for Sweeny's book on the Heaton Mint. Well struck, as one would expect for a specimen, but has some evidence of contact and an old attempt at cleaning. The coin is now beginning to retone but its colour is not natural.
2. **Five Cents 1872H.** Superb Gem MS-65+, toned in shades of blue and red. The coin is moderately well struck, exhibiting weakness only at the centre of the braid. Interestingly, some evidence of re-engraving of the die is clearly visible in the centre of the word "Newfoundland".
3. **Five Cents 1904H.** MS-63/65. Moderately well struck with pleasing toning, but a few hair scratches in obverse field. These are visible only with magnification and do not detract from the stunning quality of this very rare uncirculated coin.
4. **Ten Cents 1872H.** Superbly toned MS63/65, with concentric blue, red and gold toning. a few minuscule contact marks are visible on the obverse, yet this coin remains among the finest business strikes available.
5. **Ten Cents 1904H.** Gem BU MS65. Well struck for the date, with lovely peripheral gold toning. A superlative coin in all respects.
6. **Ten Cents 1876H.** Gem MS-67, attractively toned. The coin is well struck for type, has superb iridescent toning and is lovely in every respect. For the sake of complete accuracy we mention a minor mark in the toning and number six on reverse, noticeable only under close scrutiny and of no significance in the picture of the overall quality of this coin.
7. **Ten Cents 1882H.** MS63/67. Toned in steel grey, well struck and finely detailed. There is a single scratch in the hair on obverse. Still one of the finest known.
8. **Twenty Cents 1872H.** Superbly toned MS63/67. Again, the coin is concentrically toned, and is fabulously struck with prooflike surfaces. The coin is affected only by a very light contact scratch running across the obverse. Still among the finest known.
9. **Twenty Cents 1876H.** Attractive MS63/67. Well struck and with superb visual features, the coin is brought down from the super-gem level only by light contact marks on the neck on obverse.
10. **Twenty Cents 1904H.** Specimen-63. There are a few minor contact marks, the coin is otherwise pristine, has almost mirror-like fields and is bright in colour.

11. Fifty Cents 1872H. Gem Mint State-67. This superb original gem half dollar was undoubtedly plucked from the mint immediately after striking and preserved in the Mint Cabinet or in a private collection. It is free of contact marks visible to the naked eye, though a few exceedingly tiny touches are visible under magnification. The die from which the piece was struck was not new: under magnification there is evidence of impairments to the die, and some re-engraving of the legends and date. The piece has superb toning, marred only by a minor spot of discoloration on obverse, caused by inconsistency in the mineral content of the planchet. The piece is well struck and toned in hues of gray, pink and purple. It is housed in a custom Capital Plastics holder. This piece may well be the finest known business strike Newfoundland Victoria Half, and is worthy of the finest existing type and date collections. We confidently expect a five-figure bid will be required to secure this major rarity, even in today's market.
