TERMS OF SALE

1. Auction lots will be available for viewing in the Roxborough Room, Hotel Roxborough, downtown Ottawa at the intersection of Laurier and Metcalfe Sts from 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 16th, 1985. Arrangements may be made to view at our Bank, by appointment, prior to the auction.
2. Bids may be made in person at the auction, by mail or by telephone. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. Mail and telephone bids must reach us in Ottawa by **Friday, February 15th, 1985**. Answering service is available to take bids (24 hours) at 1-613-744-4077. If there are identical bids, the earliest received shall take priority.
3. **There is no "buyer's premium" in our auctions.**
4. For mail and telephone bidders, we will attempt to obtain lots as cheaply as possible by the following method: bids over estimate will be reduced to the estimate, or to 10% over the second highest bid, whichever amount is greater, and will then be increased against floor bids (if any) to the limit stated. Bids below estimate are quite in order, but will not be reduced. **Mail bids below 50% of the estimate are respectfully declined**, except that the large and bulky lots at the end of the auction may be offered without reserve to floor bidders at the discretion of the auctioneers.
5. Estimates represent our best professional opinion of what lots are likely to sell for on the open market. Most lots sell for between 70% and 120% of estimate. With a bid of 70% of estimate you have a fair chance of succeeding; with a bid of 120% you will be very likely to succeed.
6. Unlimited or "buy" bids are accepted, provided that the auctioneers have complete discretion.
7. Floor bidding, and calculation of the results of this auction, will be carried out in Canadian dollars. Bids expressed in other currencies will be converted to Canadian dollars at the applicable rate. Bids from customers with U.S. addresses, sent by mail or telephone, will be presumed to be in U.S. funds unless indication is made to the contrary.
8. Mail bidders may return incorrectly described or misattributed lots for full credit within 15 days of the sale. There is no return privilege on books, except with our prior permission in writing. As consignors must be paid, late remittance may be cause to negate return privileges. **ALL FLOOR SALES ARE FINAL**, and no returns will be accepted from floor bidders (including those acting as agents for others) for any reason whatsoever.
9. Title to all lots remains with the auctioneer until paid for in full, but they are held at the risk of the purchaser once the hammer has fallen.
10. **Please check your bid sheet carefully.** While we cheerfully correct our errors, we cannot be responsible for the mistakes of others.
11. Successful mail bidders may pay by money order, check, VISA or MASTERCHARGE. A 3% handling charge will be added to all credit card payments.
12. For floor bidders, terms are strictly CASH unless prior arrangements have been made to the contrary.
13. All floor bidder accounts must be paid at the auction unless prior arrangements have been made. Mail and telephone accounts are due immediately. Interest at the rate of 2% per month is charged on all overdue accounts, and collection charges may be added where the services of a collection agency are required to collect monies owing.
14. Lots delivered in Ontario are subject to retail sales tax at the current rate, unless an exemption certificate has been filed with us before the auction. Registration and actual postage will be charged on all lots shipped by us.
15. Bidding in this auction constitutes acceptance of the foregoing terms of sale.
16. **LOTS MAY BE PAID FOR AND PICKED UP IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSION OF THE AUCTION, BUT NOT DURING THE AUCTION SESSION.**

A Superb Collection of Denarii of the Roman Republic

INTRODUCTION

It's funny how the numismatic wheel turns. When I was in my early teens, collectors of Roman coins mainly concentrated on portrait pieces, and collectors of the signed denarii of the republican period were regarded with some disdain. Today the specialists of this period are equally revered and, indeed, portrait denarii are to a large extent secondary in popularity as compared to the superb range of republican denarii now inexpensively available. We have had the pleasure of handling no less than three excellent collections of Republican pieces in the last year.

To the ancient collector unfamiliar with these pieces, a brief introduction may be of interest. Space prevents more exhaustive definition, other than to point out that these pieces, all silver denarii, were coined and signed by the various moneyers, in the first and second centuries B.C. The pieces are diverse as to design, though several types (e.g. quadriga, biga, portrait of Roma) recur somewhat. Collectors usually sample, by type, or look for a set of moneyers. The variety is almost infinite and the assembling of a representative collection of republican denarii could be turned into a life-time's pursuit.

By far the greatest asset of the Republican period, however, lies in its relatively inexpensive aspect. Most pieces in this listing can be purchased for less than \$100, and this tends to apply generally to specimens in grades up to VF, with only a few exceptions for major rarities and the popular characters. Even the republican-styled denarius of Julius Caesar can be purchased in Fine condition for about \$110.00!

Collecting British Historical Medals

Particularly for the collector of wide taste looking for an alternative to the betimes expensive pursuit of attractive world coinage, historical medals offer an almost limitless new field. The vogue for issuing commemorative medals, particularly in white metal (also known as Britannia metal) reached its height in the nineteenth century, and the legacy of this period is a rich account of the major social and aristocratic happenings of the time. All kinds of events and extravagances are commemorated in detail on these fascinating artefacts.

Many collectors limit their fields of interest to a particular topic of special interest to them: architecture or engineering, coronations, military endeavours, royal visits or foreign visitors, etc. etc. While many of the medals are in beautiful condition, white metal does not wear well and allowances have to be made for its malleable state. For most medal collectors acquiring the piece, rather than acquiring it in a particular condition, is of primary importance provided of course that the piece is passably attractive.

We do urge our many clients to consider adding to their collections from this fascinating area. There are now several reference books available to assist the neophyte collector and we would be happy to suggest further reading or library acquisitions.
