### TERMS OF SALE

1. Auction lots will be available for viewing at the designated tables at the Toronto International Coin Fair from 10:00 a.m. on Friday, March 22nd, 1985. Arrangements may be made to view at our Bank, by appointment, prior to the auction.
2. Bids may be made in person at the auction, by mail or by telephone. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. Mail and telephone bids must reach us in Ottawa by **Wednesday, March 20th, 1985**. Answering service is available to take bids (24 hours) at 1-613-744-4077. If there are identical bids, the earliest received shall take priority.
3. **There is no "buyer's premium" in our auctions.**
4. For mail and telephone bidders, we will attempt to obtain lots as cheaply as possible by the following method: bids over estimate will be reduced to the estimate, or to 10% over the second highest bid, whichever amount is greater, and will then be increased against floor bids (if any) to the limit stated. Bids below estimate are quite in order, but will not be reduced. **Mail bids below 50% of the estimate are respectfully declined.** except that the large and bulky lots at the end of the auction may be offered without reserve to floor bidders at the discretion of the auctioneers. The Lowerison Estate portions of the auction are consigned without reserve, although we predict it is highly unlikely that any lot might be secured by a bid of less than 50% of the estimate.
5. Estimates represent our best professional opinion of what lots are likely to sell for on the open market. Most lots sell for between 70% and 120% of estimate. With a bid of 70% of estimate you have a fair chance of succeeding; with a bid of 120% you will be very likely to succeed.
6. Unlimited or "buy" bids are accepted, provided that the auctioneers have complete discretion.
7. Floor bidding, and calculation of the results of this auction, will be carried out in Canadian dollars. Bids expressed in other currencies will be converted to Canadian dollars at the applicable rate. Bids from customers with U.S. addresses, sent by mail or telephone, will be presumed to be in U.S. funds unless indication is made to the contrary.
8. Mail bidders may return incorrectly described or misattributed lots for full credit within 15 days of the sale. As consignors must be paid, late remittance may be cause to negate return privileges, and absolutely no returns can be accepted for any reason after the expiry of 35 days from the date of the sale. **ALL FLOOR SALES ARE FINAL**, and no returns will be accepted from floor bidders (including those acting as agents for others) for any reason whatsoever.
9. Title to all lots remains with the auctioneer until paid for in full, but they are held at the risk of the purchaser once the hammer has fallen.
10. **Please check your bid sheet carefully.** While we cheerfully correct our errors, we cannot be responsible for the mistakes of others.
11. Successful mail bidders may pay by money order, check, VISA or MASTERCHARGE. A 3% handling charge will be added to all credit card payments.
12. For floor bidders, terms are strictly CASH unless prior arrangements have been made to the contrary.
13. All floor bidder accounts must be paid at the auction unless prior arrangements have been made. Mail and telephone accounts are due immediately. Interest at the rate of 2% per month is charged on all overdue accounts, and collection charges may be added where the services of a collection agency are required to collect monies owing.
14. Lots delivered in Ontario are subject to retail sales tax at the current rate, unless an exemption certificate has been filed with us before the auction. Registration and actual postage will be charged on all lots shipped by us.

## INTRODUCTION

Welcome once again to our Spring T.I.C.F. Auction, the most exciting and promising offering it has ever been our privilege to handle. The volume of excellent consignments entrusted to our auction service has compelled us to run this sale in two full sessions.

On Friday evening, we commence our offerings with several previously unknown rarities from the trade dollar field, and an unusual offering of numismatic society medals. Following this brief introduction we swing quickly into our popular Canadian decimal offerings, with excellent coins from several consignors taking up much of the remainder of the evening.

Our second session gets under way Saturday afternoon, and we expect we might have our strongest attendance ever! Who can forget, though, the "standing-room-only" crowd that attended our last TICF Auction, at a time when the "market", if one listened to the cries of several commentators, was supposed to be in decline! There will always be a strong market for accurately described, fairly presented desirable material, as we have been proving auction after auction for the last three years!

Two outstanding Canadian collections are the highlights of our Saturday afternoon session. It contains many exciting rarities, from the gold-filled CNE Presentation medals, rarely offered, to an excellent array of LeRoux medals and an interesting miscellany of Quebec and Ontario items. No doubt we are in for an afternoon full of excitement and education as this milestone in the history of Canadian medal collecting is reached. No serious collector of Canadian medals can really afford to miss attending this important session!

SPECIMEN CANADA FIVE CENTS 1937 IN ALUMINUM BRONZE

150. Canada, Specimen Five Cents 1937. Design as the issued (nickel) five cents but struck in off metal by the Paris Mint. Our example is well struck and has considerable lustre, accompanied by light handling marks or darker colour but with no impairments or wear to the surface of the coin. MS-60. 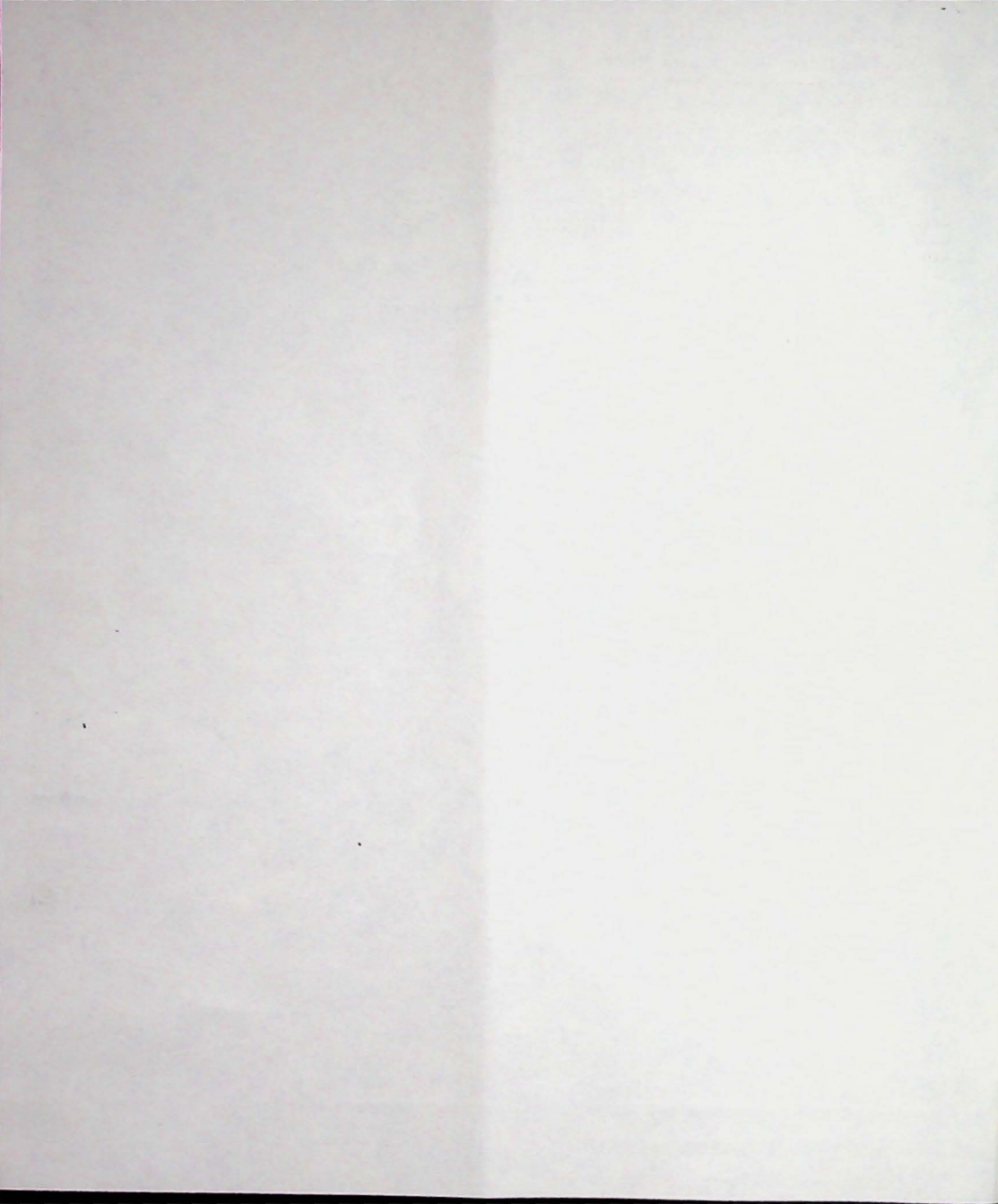
