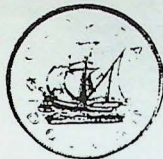

#### TERMS OF SALE

1. Auction lots will be available for viewing at the Toronto International Coin Fair (registered dealers only Thursday 21st November 1985 6-9 pm), and at all times prior to the auction sessions on Friday and Saturday, November 21-22, during open hours of the Fair. Arrangements may be made to view at our Bank, by appointment, prior to the auction.
2. Bids may be made in person at the auction, by mail or by telephone. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. Mail and telephone bids must reach us in Ottawa by **Wednesday, November 20th, 1985**. Answering service is available to take bids (24 hours) at 1-613-748-9578. If there are identical bids, the earliest received shall take priority.
3. **There is no "buyer's premium" in our auctions.**
4. For mail and telephone bidders, we will attempt to obtain lots as cheaply as possible by the following method: bids over estimate will be reduced to the estimate, or to 10% over the second highest bid, whichever amount is greater, and will then be increased against floor bids (if any) to the limit stated. Bids below estimate are quite in order, but will not be reduced. **Mail bids below 50% of the estimate are respectfully declined**, except that the large and bulky lots at the end of the auction may be offered without reserve to floor bidders at the discretion of the auctioneers.
5. Estimates represent our best professional opinion of what lots are likely to sell for on the open market. Most lots sell for between 70% and 120% of estimate. With a bid of 70% of estimate you have a fair chance of succeeding; with a bid of 120% you will be very likely to succeed.
6. Unlimited or "buy" bids are accepted, provided that the auctioneers have complete discretion.
7. Floor bidding, and calculation of the results of this auction, will be carried out in Canadian dollars. Bids expressed in other currencies will be converted to Canadian dollars at the applicable rate. Bids from customers with U.S. addresses, sent by mail or telephone, will be presumed to be in U.S. funds unless indication is made to the contrary.
8. Mail bidders may return incorrectly described or misattributed lots for full credit within 15 days of the sale. As consignors must be paid, late remittance may be cause to negate return privileges, and absolutely no returns can be accepted for any reason after the expiry of 35 days from the date of the sale. **ALL FLOOR SALES ARE FINAL**, and no returns will be accepted from floor bidders (including those acting as agents for others) for any reason whatsoever.
9. Title to all lots remains with the auctioneer until paid for in full, but they are held at the risk of the purchaser once the hammer has fallen.
10. **Please check your bid sheet carefully.** While we cheerfully correct our errors, we cannot be responsible for the mistakes of others.
11. Successful mail bidders may pay by money order, check, VISA or MASTERCHARGE. A 3% handling charge will be added to all credit card payments.
12. For floor bidders, terms are strictly CASH unless prior arrangements have been made to the contrary.
13. All floor bidder accounts must be paid at the auction unless prior arrangements have been made. Mail and telephone accounts are due immediately. Interest at the rate of 2% per month is charged on all overdue accounts, and collection charges may be added where the services of a collection agency are required to collect monies owing.
14. Lots delivered in Ontario are subject to retail sales tax at the current rate, unless an exemption certificate has been filed with us before the auction. Registration and actual postage will be charged on all lots shipped by us.
15. Bidding in this auction constitutes acceptance of the foregoing terms of sale.
16. Lots will be sold at a rate of approximately 200 lots per hour.
17. **LOTS MAY BE PAID FOR AND PICKED UP IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSION OF THE AUCTION SESSION, BUT NOT DURING THE AUCTION SESSION.**

A COLLECTION OF BRETON TOKENS OF ALMOST UNPARALLELED IMPORTANCE -  
THE PROPERTY OF A QUEBEC GENTLEMAN

It is with a sense of the deepest pride mingled with humility that we present the following collection. The owner, a resident of Quebec, has been a collector for several decades, adding rarities in this and other fields as the opportunities presented themselves. This collection is without doubt the finest we have handled, and contains legendary rarities beyond number.

The sources and pedigrees of the pieces are also worthy of note. The owner was a strong buyer at the famed McKay Clements auction and many other significant sales in Canada and overseas.

We have attempted to keep the grading and estimating of this collection within our usual conservative tradition. However we do caution that this will deservedly not be a sale to which the submission of a large number of low bids will be worthwhile: the pieces are in many instances seldom seen and we expect intense floor competition. We well recall the intense disappointment of mail bidders who attempted to buy cheaply when we offered "The Virginia Collection" and were constantly, and substantially, overbid by floor bidders who had a greater appreciation of the opportunities being offered to acquire once-in-a-lifetime pieces. While it is not our place to sermonize the lessons of that sale, we do urge our clients, particularly those with advanced collections, to make every effort to bid in line with current market expectations and, if at all possible, to attend the sale and inspect the pieces in person.

We do hope our many aficionados of this series will enjoy this stupendous offering and look forward to once again being at the centre of intense competition.

**Note on organization:** The tokens listed in this collection are not strictly in order of Breton numbers: we have listed the more significant tokens individually or in small groups first, followed by a number of larger groupings of commoner tokens. An important offering of non-Breton material follows.

The coins from the Kingsford collection were subsequently catalogued and sold again by Low, this time in June 1915.
