1. **Viewing of lots**  
Auction lots will be available for viewing at our offices, by appointment only, during regular business hours up to the day of the sale.
2. **How to Bid**  
Bids may be made by mail, telephone, fax, telex or in person at our offices. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. Mail, telephone, Fax and telex bids must reach our Ottawa office by 5 p.m., Friday, January 29th, 1988. Answering machine service is available to take phone bid outside our normal office hours.
3. **Identical Bids**  
If there are identical bids, the earliest received shall take priority.
4. **Bidding Advances**  
We will attempt to obtain lots as cheaply as possible by the following method; bids over estimate will be reduced to the estimate, or to 10% over the second highest bid, whichever amount is greater; bids below estimate are quite in order but will not be reduced. **Bids below 50% of the estimate are respectfully declined.**
5. **Reserved Lots**  
Reserved lots start at the consignor's reserve. Lots bid on and purchased by the owner or his agent are subject to the full commission.
6. **Meaning of Estimates**  
Estimates represent our best professional opinion of what lots are likely to sell for on the open market. Most lots sell for between 70% and 120% of estimate. With a bid of 70% you have a fair chance of succeeding; with a bid of 120% you will be very likely to succeed.
7. **Unlimited and Buy Bids, Bids from Minors**  
Unlimited or buy bids are accepted, provided that the auctioneers have complete discretion. No bids from minors will be accepted unless guaranteed by the parent or guardian.
8. **Currencies, Exchange Rates, Bids from Outside Canada**  
Calculation of the results of this auction will be carried out in CANADIAN DOLLARS. Bids expressed in other currencies will be converted to the operating currency at the applicable rate. Bids from customers with US addresses, sent by mail or telephone, will be presumed to be in U.S. funds unless indication is made to the contrary.
9. **Return Policies**  
Incorrectly described or misattributed lots may be returned for full credit within 5 days of receipt, except that; as consignors must be paid, late remittance may be cause to negate return privileges, and absolutely no returns can be accepted for any reason after the expiry of 35 days from the date of the sale. No returns will be accepted for any reason whatsoever from bidders who have viewed lots in the sale.
10. **Title and Risk of Lots**  
Title to all lots remains with the auctioneer until paid for in full, but they are held at the risk of the purchaser once the award of sale has been made.
11. **Errors of Auctioneers and Bidders**  
**Please check your bid sheet carefully.** While we cheerfully correct our errors, we cannot be responsible for the mistakes of others.
12. **Methods of Payment**  
Successful bidders may pay by money order, check, VISA or MASTERCHARGE. A 3% handling charge will be added to all credit card payments. Accounts are due immediately. Interest at the rate of 2% per month is added on all overdue accounts, and where the services of a collection agency are required to collect monies owing, all charges made by such agency shall be at the cost of the debtor.
13. **Retail Sales Tax**  
Lots delivered in Ontario are subject to retail sales tax at the current rate, unless an exemption certificate has been filed with us before the auction. Registration and actual postage will be charged on all lots shipped by us.

10¢ 1885, F-VF, scarce. We have handled about 5 pieces of this coin recently from a small hoard which turned up (about 10 pieces). These are now dispersed. The coin remains a rarity 300.00

**WORLD COINS**

Potential purchasers of these coins are reminded that, while there may be some bargains, there is a minimal or non-existent amount of precious metal in these lots due to the way they were purchased. However, there is a strong possibility of finding better date minor coins: we have seen coins cataloging \$35-50 taken from our stock of loose coins by knowledgeable collectors - there must be many more contained. Shipping is at the buyer's expense: though we can arrange this very inexpensively indeed by surface transport (e.g. 100 lb surface to Vancouver, 4000 miles away, is only about \$45). You are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity, as we do not expect again to have accumulated so much for a very long time.
