PRIMITIVE AND UNUSUAL MONEY

1. Canada Nail, yes, a simple iron hand-made nail. One of the earliest forms of common currency in Canada due to their scarcity, this believed removed from the wreck of an old wooden ship in the Red River, Winnipeg. Weak spot in middle. (12)
2. China "Coin Charm". S13 type. Replica of Northern Chou Dynasty (561-577) Wu Hsing Ta Pu -S246. Rx snake, sword, turtle, constellation. 31 mm, 7.37 gm. Two lead plugs in casting imperfections, F. (15)
3. Siam "Bullet Money", 1 Baht, Rama IV (Mongkut). C-137, 14.61 gm. Fine. (30)
4. Zaire. Katanga Cross in copper. A cross-shaped cast copper ingot, used in the former province of Katanga for hundreds of years, both in ordinary commercial transactions and in wife-purchasing ceremonies! Measuring nearly 8 by 8 inches, a quite magnificent, nicely patinated example with no encrustation. Becoming very difficult to obtain as these are now classified as "heritage property" in Zaire. Current market in Belgium, the centre for this kind of art, is 5,000 Francs. XF. (150)

9. B-510a, rev.B-516b. Franco-American jeton, restrike in silver. EF. (25)

19. B-520. Magdalen Island penny, VG for this type. Usually found with severe edge knocks when located even in lower grades, this piece surprisingly has none, and virtually all legends clear. (75)

21. B-569a. Devins and Bolton counterstamp, F, on U.S.A. large cent, 1846, G. (20)
22. B-569a, Devins & Bolton counterstamp on U.S.A. 1c, 1853. F on VF. (14)
23. B-609. Quebec, Montreal Witness penny, "Time of our Lord". In aluminium. VF, with a rim chip emanating from poor manufacture from 1 to 2 o'clock on obverse. (16)
24. B-720. Bank of Upper Canada 1/2 penny, 1852. About EF, but cleaned (?) leaving some scratching in centre. Nevertheless very attractive. (6)
25. B-720. Bank of Upper Canada 1/2 penny, 1854. VF with small rim nick, but showing an unusual and very interesting die crack. (5)

5. France. 5 sols of Louis XIII, dated 1643a, Thimonnier 611. VF/F. A piece similar in design and appearance to the Edict piece of 1670, which almost certainly circulated in Canada prior to the edict. (85)

148. Crown and anchor counterstamp, F, on New Brunswick 1c, G, pierced. Extremely rare, a N.B. expert to whom we recently showed this piece had never seen another (40)

Newfoundland

149. Centennial medal in light metal, with original suspension and green ribbon. Rare, not in Roberts! (18)

Nova Scotia

150. Dartmouth, City medal 1965, enamelled silver. Rx. engraved B-C15. Original ribbon and clasp, very attractive, toned AU. (25)

151. Dartmouth. City medal 1967, enamelled copper. Rx. engraved Juv-C4. With original ribbon and clasp, attractive toned UNC. (20)

Ontario

152. Counterstamped token. ED. ARPIN on Bank of Upper Canada 1/2 penny. F on G. (5)

153. Doon Pioneer Village, encased 1c 1965, also London Numismatic Society 100th Meeting and Banquet medal (oct, br) 1959 BU. (8)

154. Galt. A most unusual counterstamped George V 25c, with four countermarks: a crown, 16-3/4, N.F., and G.T.A. in graphic design. Host coin aG, counterstamps F. (25)

156. Ottawa. Pair of large size Metropolitan Insurance Company medals, one cased, 50 mm. copper, Head Office/Arms, 5.5 mm. thick, the other bronze, 77 mm., commemorating President F.W. Eckers meetings with the field force, 1954-56, Rx. insurance buildings. AU. (40)

157. Ottawa Public School Board, silver medal (29 mm.) for regularity, punctuality and good conduct. EF, rare. (20)

158. Ottawa, C.N.A. plastic token 1976 (blue) with 1971 (white) Hotel Vancouver. (10)

159. Stratford. O.N.A. Convention medal in sterling silver, 29 mm., for 13th Convention, 1975. UNC. (30)

160. Trial strike in lead from the seal for the Magistrates' Court, County of Ottawa. Also shows the name of the Quebec town, Hull. As such a scarce interprovincial piece in any event, but we believe there are just two examples of this piece in existence. Crude, F as to detail but probably as struck. (60)
