TERMS OF SALE

1. Auction lots will be available for viewing at our table at the Toronto International Coin Fair at all times prior to the auction.
2. The highest bidder shall be the buyer. Bidding will commence at 10% over the second highest mail bid, or at 50% of estimate. No lot will be sold for less than 50% of estimate. There is no "buyer's premium", or other hidden charge, in our auctions. If there are identical mail bids, the earliest received shall take priority.
3. Estimates represent our best professional opinion of what lots are likely to sell for on the open market. You may bid higher or lower, as you please.
4. Mail and telephone bids must reach our Ottawa address by Wednesday, 23rd March 1983.
5. Floor bidding will be conducted in Canadian dollars. Mail and telephone bids may be expressed in Canadian or U.S. dollars. Bids in U.S. funds will be converted to Canadian dollars at the applicable rate on the day of the auction close for mail bidders. In the absence of indication to the contrary, mail and telephone bids from clients with U.S. addresses will be assumed to be expressed in U.S. funds.
6. All floor bids are final, and no returns by floor bidders (including those acting as agents for others) will be accepted for any reason. Mail bidders may return incorrectly described or attributed lots within fifteen (15) days of the sale.
7. If bidding by mail, please check your bid sheet carefully and keep a record of your bids. We cannot accept responsibility for errors in bidding.
8. Lots purchased by floor bidders must be paid for in full on the day of the sale, and unless other arrangements have been made in advance must be collected after the auction, but on the same day. Terms are strictly cash unless prior arrangements have been made.
9. Unlimited or "buy" bids are accepted, provided only that the auctioneers have complete discretion.
10. Mail bidders may pay by cheque, money order or VISA, in Canadian or U.S. funds.
