The coins are superb, and compare very favourably with many supposed original Indian coins we have examined. It must be concluded that these are presentation first strikes from the original proof dies for the relevant coins. This is an exceptional opportunity for the shrewd commonwealth collector or an equally knowledgeable investor.
