TERMS OF SALE

1. Auction lots will be available for viewing at the designated tables at the Toronto International Coin Fair at all times prior to the auction.
2. Bids may be made in person at the auction, by mail or by telephone. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. Mail and telephone bids must reach us in Ottawa by Wednesday, November 16th, 1983. Answering service is available to take bids at 1-613-235-1916. If there are identical bids, the earliest received shall take priority.
3. There is no "buyer's premium" in our auctions.
4. For mail and telephone bidders, we will attempt to obtain lots as cheaply as possible, by the following method: bids over estimate will be reduced to the estimate, or to 10% over the second highest bid, whichever amount is greater, and will then be increased against floor bids (if any) to the limit stated. Bids below estimate are quite in order, but will not be reduced. Bids below 50% of the estimate will be respectfully declined.
5. Estimates represent our best professional opinion of what lots are likely to sell for on the open market. Most lots sell for between 70% and 120% of estimate: with a bid of 70% of estimate you will have a fair chance of succeeding, with 120% you will be most likely to succeed.
6. Unlimited or "buy" bids are accepted, provided that the auctioneers have complete discretion.
7. Floor bidding, and calculation of results of the auction, will be carried out in Canadian dollars. Bids expressed in other currencies will be converted to Canadian dollars at the applicable rate. Bids from customers with U.S. addresses, sent by mail or telephone, will be presumed to be in U.S. funds, in the absence of indication to the contrary.
8. Mail bidders may return incorrectly described or misattributed lots for full credit within 15 days of the sale. There is no return privilege on books, except with our prior permission in writing. As consignors must be paid, late remittance for lots may be cause to negate all return privileges. ALL FLOOR SALES ARE FINAL, and no returns will be accepted from floor bidders (including those acting as agents for others) for any reason whatsoever.
9. Title to all lots remains with the auctioneer until paid for in full, but they are held at the absolute risk of the purchaser once the hammer has fallen.
10. Please check your bid sheet carefully. While we cheerfully correct our errors, we cannot be responsible for the mistakes of others.
11. Successful mail bidders may pay by money order, check, VISA or MASTERCARD. A 3.5% handling charge will be added to all credit card payments.
12. For floor bidders, terms are strictly CASH unless prior arrangements have been made to the contrary.
13. Lots delivered in Ontario are subject to retail sales tax at the current rate, unless an exemption certificate has been filed with us before the auction. Registration and actual postage charges will be charged on all lots shipped by us. THERE IS NO SALES TAX ON BOOKS AND LITERATURE LOTS. Books, etc. will be shipped book rate, not registered, unless the buyer specifically requests.
14. Bidding in this auction constitutes acceptance of the foregoing terms of sale.

LOTS MAY BE PAID FOR AND PICKED UP IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING EACH SESSION, BUT NOT DURING THE SESSIONS.

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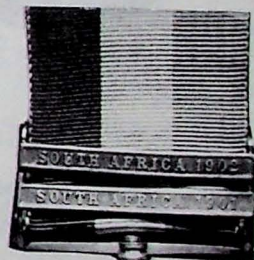
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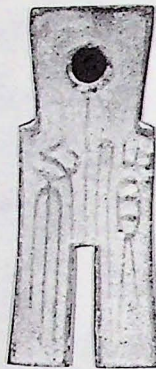
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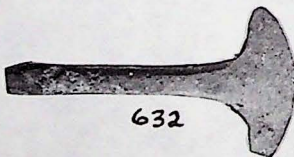

To the neophyte hammered collector, this can make coins which are actually quite choice for type appear to be of lower grade. While we have specialized in the hammered coinage of this period for many years, and are quite confident of our grading, clients just venturing into this area may care to bear in mind that a coin like the last, graded "Very Fine, nice portrait", is not going to have too much in common with a coin similarly graded made in the 1800s or 1900s!
