Answering service is available to take bids (24 hours) at 1-613-235-1916. If there are identical bids, the earliest received shall take priority. There is no "buyer's premium" in our auctions:

- 469. Great Britain Shillings. An excellent set of British shillings and five pences, 1947 to 1977. In the pre-decimal series, both the English and Scottish varieties for each date are present.
