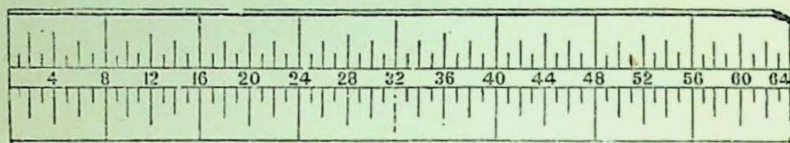

## EMBLEMS OF IDOLATRY, FOUND IN SOUTH AMERICA.

NOTE.—These articles are of quite rude workmanship and are used by the natives of Peru, etc., to hang upon the statues of saints, in their churches, for the relief of the supplicant from pain or disease in the various parts of the body, the locality being usually indicated by the design of the charm engraved or molded. After the statue becomes too greatly loaded with these offerings, which are always of gold or silver, often of great value, the priest removes them and the lot is sent abroad to be converted into coin. ## "DOUBTFUL" OR UNCERTAIN.

NOTE.—Under this head are placed all those tokens which bear no positive indications of the localities for which they were struck, nor of the firms importing them. Canadian writers on this subject call them "Doubtful," a very improper term, considering the fact that the majority were current *only* in Canada until quite recently, and were commonly received without question. With few exceptions they were struck in England by the manufacturers of the other tokens (which are classed under appropriate heads by the aforementioned writers), as were many of the "Colonials" accepted as currency in the U. S. prior to the issue of the Cents. If it is only the *locality* which is in doubt, why not class them as "UNCERTAIN," as "Doubtful" would raise a suspicion that they are not related to Canada, when every resident of Canada who has attained his majority is well aware of the fact that they once formed the most important part of his home currency.

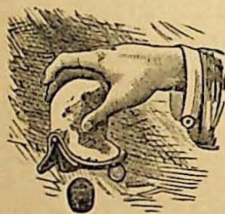
