

TERMS OF SALE

- 1) An 11.5% buyers charge inclusive of G.S.T. will be added to the hammer price of each lot purchased and is payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. The exception to this will be ARROWED lots(→) purchased by Canadian residents, who would pay an additional 7% G.S.T. of price realized. Lots are not shipped until payment is received.
- 2) We reserve the right to withdraw any lot prior to sale.
- 3) In conformity with law, no coins or currency lots will be opened at less than the face value.
- 4) Bids by mail,telephone or fax will be accepted until the closing date and time specified. All telephone bids must be confirmed in writing on a bid sheet. Bids are treated at I IMITS.
- 5) No "Buy" or "Unlimited" bids will be accepted. Mail bids will be opened at the next interval over the second highest bid, except where the intrinsic or regular market worth of the item dictates an opening at its fair market value. Floor bidding intervals will have an average increment of about 5% at the discretion of the auctioneer.
- 6) In the case of a tie mail bid the first received is normally given preference. In a tie between a mail bidder and the floor, the mail bidder takes precedence.
- 7) All bids must be in whole dollar amounts; this includes percentage increases.
- 8) Postage insurance and/or handling fees are added to ALL SHIPMENTS. Out of Canada bidders must supply full detailed shipping instructions and agree to all terms as listed herein before shipment is made.
- 9) Jeffrey Hoare Auctions reserves the right to reject any bids not made in good faith and further reserves the right to ban any bidder from participation in its sales for any reason deemed appropriate at our sole discretion. Generally bids below 50% of estimate will not be accepted.
- 10) A bidder in any Jeffrey Hoare Auction expressly waives any claim or right to an accounting, damages or compensation arising out of Jeffrey Hoare Auction's failure to receive or execute any bid due to exclusion from our sales, clerical errors or other causes. No bids will be accepted from any person who has not signed a registration form or a bidder sheet.
- 11) Check your bid sheets carefully. We cannot assume any responsibility for errors made in the amount bid or lot numbers listed. Make sure your sheet is signed.
- 12) No minors may participate in our sales. Agents bidding on behalf of others will be held liable if their principals fail to make payment.
- 13) Successful bidders are required to pay the full invoice amount before lots are delivered. Previous established lines of credit, at the sole option of the auctioneer, may not be honored unless arrangements for this sale have been specifically agreed to in writing by the auctioneer. Please contact us in advance if you have any questions regarding your purchasing plans. First rate credit references or a 25% deposit are necessary to insure entry of your bids. Any portion of such a deposit not used will be promptly refunded after each sale.
- 14) Title to all lots remains with the Auction House until payment in full is received.
- 15) By placing a bid in this sale, you agree that this agreement is made in Ontario by the auction house's entry of your bid, and that disputes concerning the agreement shall be decided by the application of Ontario law. In the event of a dispute or nonpayment, the auction house may elect to proceed judicially, in which case the bidder consents to jurisdiction and venue in courts of Ontario. If an account is referred to an attorney for collection, the buyer agrees to hold the auction house harmless and indemnify it for all costs of collection, including actual, reasonable automey's fees, with interest at 1 1/2% per month (18% p.a.) accruing on the entire amount paid. The bidder also assumes both corporate and personal liability for unpaid auction bills.
- 16) Sales Tax will be collected under the law of the Province of Ontario unless a valid vendor's permit number is presented, or lots are shipped out of Province.

- 17) Jeffrey Hoare Auctions may reopen the bidding on a lot under the following circumstances; (i) The Auction house has failed to execute correctly a mail bid. (ii) A party purchasing the lot on the floor has done so in error. (iii) Where a protest is made after the hammer has fallen, but before the bidding has commenced on the next lot. (iv) Where the auctioneer has determined that he has overlooked a party still bidding on the lot but before the calling of the next lot. (v) At the discretion of the auctioneer.
- 18) In the event of a dispute the auctioneer's decision is final.
- 19) No price adjustments will be made on the hammer price of a lot whether there is a complaint about the whole lot or only one item in it. The entire lot must be returned if a refund is to be made to a bidder.
- 20) Persons placing bids are responsible for meeting the maximum amounts represented on their bid sheets. The Auction House reserves the right to reject frivolous complaints and to take appropriate action against such bidders under paragraph 9 and 15 above.
- 21) All material offered is guaranteed genuine, unless otherwise stated, and as described. Careful examination has been made of every lot by experts. Cataloguing errors will be promptly and cheerfully corrected.
- 22) Floor bidders may not return any lots including those lots purchased while acting as agents, except for non-authenticity.
- 23) All claims for adjustments by other bidders, for reasons of non-authenticity or improper description, must be made within five days of receipt but in no case more than 28 days after a sale. As the auction house acts as an agent for various consignors, NO CLAIMS OF ANY KIND can be considered after settlements have been made. Failure to execute this privilege within the 28 day period, either from a failure to pay promptly or from any other cause shall void the privilege. Any returned lot must be in original holder with seal intact.
- 24) If we are notified prior to our settlement date that an opinion of condition alteration or authenticity is being sought, the matter will remain open until such opinion is rendered.
- 25) 11/2% monthly interest is charged on all accounts 30 days past due calculated from the sale date. If any awarded lots are still on hand without deposit 30 days after a sale, they will automatically be offered to the underbidders or relisted in the next available sale. The difference in price will be billed to the former bidder. Late payers should not expect to receive future catalogues.
- 26) In the event of unsuccessful litigation the plaintiff shall pay all the Auction House's legals costs, and all other costs incurred by it in defense against such suit.
- 27) The same protection applicable to Jeffrey Hoare Auctions apply to each and every one of their officers and employees, unless they shall be convicted of knowingly selling false or stolen goods.
- 28) Jeffrey Hoare auctions assumes no liability for merchandise lost, stolen or damaged while in the possession of a party to whom merchandise has been shipped. The purchaser is solely responsible for the safe keeping and insurance of any items in their possession.

Although Roy has now decided to dispose of his collection, we know that the friendships that he has developed over his many years of collecting will continue with those that helped him form the very impressive collection we now have the pleasure to offer. As the notes and provenances on envelopes or other packaging are felt to be of interest, they have been retained.

These so-called mules have been the subject of controversy for years. They have been called restrikes and attributed to W. J. Taylor, and indeed there are many irregularities that have caused doubt as to their authenticity. There is a specimen known in nickle, another in brass, and they are known from unfinished dies. Courteau has suggested that these pieces in all probability preceded the issuance of the 1842 pennies, his opinion being that the obverse of the piece was the earliest version of the die. He correctly points out that they cannot be mules as the obverse is different from all others used for the 1842 pennies, and is likely earlier. The reverse is also different, though only slightly so in comparison with the obverse. The V-shaped die crack in centre of cross on rev, arms that always occurs on this piece clearly puts it later than all 1837 reverses, so if we accept Courteau's opinion that the obverse is earlier than all others of that date, the coin can probably be dated to early 1842. Courteau is correct about typical average weight specimens dating to 1842, but the Taylor story cannot be easily dismisssed. There are most certainly later pieces (post sale of Soho Mint dies, April, 1850), and the second offered piece is no doubt one of them, as suggested by the die breaks and unusual thickness of the planchet. Nevertheless, the variant Taylor pieces are rarer than early issues which should be disclaimed as mules and accepted as original pieces.



1498→ Br. 546-557. The controversial Repentigny tokens. Copper proofs of each of the types. Purchased from Frank Rose for \$3500.00 in 1977, and believed to be the McKay-Clements set sold May 13, 1976, Lot 77, at \$2585 Only three or four sets known to exist. 12 pcs. \$4500

See Breton's and Lyman Low's account of the tokens and their discovery in 1890 in his "Illustrated history..." By 1894 only one set was known, the one purchased by Low from the acquisitor of a lot of various pieces sold by Sotheby, Wilkinson and Hodge on July 31, 1890.





11499→ Br. 558. (VC-2), Famous Vexator Canadeinsis halfpenny, 1811. F-VF. for the piece, a good-size planchet clip, unusual on the Vexators. \$300

The ferry which crossed the river from Levis to Quebec was owned by James Goudie a prominent shipbuilder at Quebec. Built in 1817, the Lauzon has the distinction of being the first ferry on the St. Lawrence. In 1822 Goudie and four partners entered the fur trade having effected a 20 year lease on the King's Posts, but it was a poor business venture for Goudie who sold out his partnership the following year.





1502→ Similar, Obverse countermarked J. McK. for James MacKenzie.F-VF., but holed, Rare. \$400

MacKenzie had worked for Goudie, running the Hotel Lauzon. In 1825, after Goudie's death MacKenzie rented the hotel as well as the steamship Lauzon. He later bought the hotel at sherriff's auction, and likely acquired the Lauzon at about the same time. In 1828 he had built his own steamboat and named it the New Lauzon.





1503→ Similar. Reverse countermarked J. T. for John Thomson. VF. Very rare, only five or six others known. \$1000

John Thomson was in the lumber business as the agent for Sir John Caldwell, the Seigneur of Lauzon, a partner in the original Lauzon Ferry. Descendants of Thomson claimed the pieces were used as passes for the Thomson family; thus few would have been so stamped.

We estimate this card to be worth \$4000

The rarity of the Ropery card is a result of the business having operated for only one year, from 1824-25. To have issued the token, Owen must surely have anticipated a fast expanding and successful business, but it never grew from the small one operated on Gain St. in the east end of city, which according to McLachlan consisted of an open shed by the side of a fence, under which was a wheel turned by hand. The quantity of hemp used was less than four tons per annum and a small supply of lines rather than ropes, the product. In 1825, Mr. J. A. Converse, whose father was an extensive iron founder in Troy N.Y. came here and established a much larger ropery, and Owen finding that his small hand power concern could not compete with it, sold out to Converse. The purchase was not an extensive one, consisting mainly of two tons of hemp and the wheel. Owen afterward removed to Kingston, when he induced the Government to establish a ropery in connection with the Penitentiary, but this venture also proving unsuccessful, the Government advertised for another manager, and Mr. Converse sent up his foreman Coyle to run it." The quoted material is from McLachlan's article entitled OUR RAREST CANADIAN COINS, published in the Can. Ant. & Num. Journal, July, 1882. McLachlan appears to have interviewed Converse in the latter's later years.





1508→ Br. 565. J. Shaw & Co.'s card (1837). This specimen is something of a scarcity due to the W in HARDWARES being struck up, a very unusual circumstance. It was first mentioned in the Hidden Sale, Oct. 14, 1914, and the statemen ande: "The W in HARDWARE entirely struck up. The first we have seen in which this was the case." I have had three or four, and consider it to be very scarce, Fine, small punch marks on Ob. Purchased from W. Baker.

This is a most interesting token, but cannot rightfully take its place as a member of the colonial series as it has been proven to be a fabrication executed around 1886. Afanciful story was developed by the perpetrator(s) that five or six pieces were found in a drawer with other tools, part of the effects of the late Maysenholder which was sold at auction some short time after his death in 1862. McLachlan exposed this piece in 1892 in an an interesting article entitled SOME RECENT FRAUDS IN CANADIAN COINS. It appears that A. Desroches (Br. 573) may have hadsomething to do with the scheme as he ended up with 31 pieces, presumably the total population. Seven other uniface strikings are also known. Still, an emimently collectable piece, and rather attractive.





1510→ Br. 567. Hunterstown token, 1852. A cast copy. VG. ex Golsmith/Meloche Sale, Nov. 19, 1971. An original has not been offered for years. \$100





1511→ Lead printing block for reverse of Hunterstown token. This is no doubt Lot 95a of the McKay-Clements Sale (May, 1976) where it was described as a trial piece. It sold for \$121 VF. \$100

Robert Weir and William Larminie had a short-lived partnership as exchange brokers in Montreal. The excess of U.S. silver coins in circulation, and the poor state of the copper currency resulted in the establishment of a decimal system in Canada. Weir and Sir Francis Hincks were the prime movers in this project.



In 1894 J. Rochelle Thomas announced that he had discovered the original dies of the Copper Company halfpennies, and offered to collectors the opportunity of purchasing "restrike" specimens struck from these "original" dies. The pieces are in fact from entirely new dies, very similar though not as fine as the originals. It has sometimes been suggested that the dies from which these pieces were struck are contemporary to those used to strike the original Copper Company halfpennies, and that they were rejected and never used until their resurrection by Thomas. Based on J. Rochelle Thomas' other numismatic shenanigans, as well as his lie about the pieces being from "original" dies, viz., the known true originals, this is highly doubtful. 



Spanish American "Dollars" of 8 reals were holed by order of the Governor Smith of P.E.I. in 1813 to overcome a shortage of circulating specie on the Island. Because the dollars thus holed were now mutilated, it was expected that they would not leave the Island and were over-rated to pass as five shillings currency. It is assumed that a disinguishing "sunburst" countermark in the form of ten small triangles was applied to all specimens holed in this manner. Almost immediately, local Charlottetown merchants, seeing the possibility of profit, produced their own Holey Dollars to circulate alongside the Government issues. These imitations circulated for upwards of ten years and are legitimate P.E.I. token currency. It is now impossible to distinguish Government originals from merchant imitations.

This specimen shows five heavy punched triangles, with the faint trace of a sixth. This coin was lot 1952, plated, in the August 28-30, 1969 James Charlton C.N.A. Auction. Catalogued by Chris Faulkner
